Welcome to the 2025-2026 School Year,

My name is Dr. Norah Barney, EdD. I'm the Special Education Director and Curriculum Coordinator for the Anaconda School District. My focus is to support the Special Services department and through my role as the curriculum coordinator ensure that our students are receiving the best possible instruction and intervention.

Special Services Update

- SBOT (School Based Out-Patient Therapist) on site. The high school will now have a full time therapist on campus through YBGR (Yellowstone Boys and Girls Ranch). This therapist will be able to serve students in grades 7-12. We are very lucky to have this resource to help with our mental health needs.
- We have created the following Team Taught Classes at the High School. Freshman through Senior English, Physical Science, Pre-Algebra, Algebra, and Geometry.

Professional Development and Curriculum update for the 2025-2026 School Year

- The teacher's will attend trainings on August 26th and 27th. The training will focus on a variety of topics including Suicide Awareness, Indian Education for All and Inclusive Practices.
- English Language Arts –We are continuing to roll out your ELA curriculum which was purchased in 2023. We will be on our 3rd year of using this program and our district has now transitioned to utilizing the program with fidelity.
- Proficiency Based Education – We are continuing to shift towards a proficiency based model. This means that the teacher's in grades K-6 will be focusing on evidence to determine a student's proficiency level on state standards. Teacher's in grades 7-12 will receive professional development this school year to start shifting their practices in this direction.
- Math Curriculum update. OPI recently updated their Math standards so we'll be spending the year updating our math curriculum and start the process for program adoption.

Grants

- Montana Reads Grant – This grant is focused on strengthen the local education systems (Prek – 12th grade) to provide and implement high-quality, evidence-based literacy instruction (
- Advanced Opportunity Grant – Helps families with out of pocket costs for students who are interested in taking Dual Enrollment Courses or any advanced opportunity that goes above the regular curriculum offerings of district (grades 6 – 12th grade)
- 21st Century Grant –Provides funds for districts to provide opportunities for academic enrichment after school and during the summer months. (Grades 3-12)

Immunizations

There are five vaccines or types of immunizations required for school attendance in the State of Montana. Each vaccine has its own series of booster shots to acquire adequate immune protection.

The below picture shows the immunizations required for school attendance and when they should be given to your student.

The immunization status of all students are evaluated upon school registration and then annually during the fall of every school year. (This follows State law.)

For children who are in elementary school, the due dates for DTaP #5, MMR #2, Varicella #2, and Polio #4 are immediately following the student's 4th birthday.

For entry into 7th grade, students must have received their first dose of Tdap (which can be given any time between age 7 years and entrance into 7th grade).

For students who are allergic to vaccines, the Medical Exemption Form HES101A must be completed by the student's healthcare provider and submitted to the school nurse upon school entry.

For students whose guardians do not want them to have vaccinations, the Religious Exemption Form HES113 must be completed, notarized, and submitted to the school nurse annually for school entry.

Vaccines Required for School Attendance, Preschool -12th Grade

Five types of vaccines are required for students to attend Anaconda Public Schools. All students **4 years of age** or older must meet the doses indicated in the Kindergarten column (EK, KT, or K). All 7th Graders must have received a dose of Tdap **prior to starting 7th grade** (circled in red). A provider-signed Medical exemption (HES 101A) is allowable for students with vaccine allergies, or a parent-signed Religious exemption (HES 113) is allowable for students with parents against vaccinations. To obtain these HES forms, contact a school secretary, a school nurse, or visit <https://dphhs.mt.gov>

5.	Varicella "chickenpox" (Var)	1 dose (dose must be given on or after 1 st birthday) ⁶	2 doses (first dose must be given on or after 1 st birthday, spacing between doses is 12 weeks for children under 13 years, and 4 weeks for those older than 13 years) ^{5,6}

¹Per MCA 20-5-402, a preschool is defined as a facility that provides, on a regular basis and as its primary purpose, educational instruction designed for children 5 years of age or younger and that: (a) serves no child under 5 years of age for more than 3 hours a day; and (b) serves no child 5 years of age for more than 6 hours a day.

²Hib vaccine is not recommended for children older than 59 months.

³When following the ACIP schedule, children will have at least 5 doses of DTaP and 4 doses of polio vaccine.

⁴A pupil 7 years or older who has not completed the DTaP requirement must receive additional doses of Tdap vaccine or Td vaccine to become current in accordance with the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practice (ACIP) recommendations per ARM 37.114.705.

⁵While it is not recommended, if a child younger than 13 years receives their second dose of varicella at an interval of 4 weeks or longer, the dose does **not** need to be repeated.

⁶As of October 1, 2015 pupils are required to have varicella vaccine and all pupils 7th-12th grade must have a Tdap vaccine.

Note: A four-day grace period may apply, as appropriate, per the ACIP recommendations.

Documentation of a valid exemption or conditional enrollment may be submitted in lieu of receiving all required vaccines.
