



Community and Business Development

The Community and Business Development Department works in conjunction with the Butte Chamber of Commerce, Butte Local Development Corporation, Port of Montana, Headwaters RC&D and the Bert Mooney Airport in our efforts to improve the economic opportunities for our citizens and improve the community in which we all live.

One of the main tools used by the Community Development Department is Tax Increment Financing. Tax Increment Financing allows a district to capture increased incremental taxes and use the increment to address blight and infrastructure issues within the district. Butte-Silver Bow has four tax increment districts:

- Urban Renewal Agency (URA) consisting of the Uptown Business District. The URA's goal is to work with developers through loan and grant funding to reduce blight in the district. In the past 5 years, the URA has granted over \$800k, which encouraged a minimum of \$3.5 M private investment. The projects range from new signage to complete building rehab for commercial and residential properties.
- Renovation and Rehabilitation Agency (RRA) consisting of the east Butte area between Montana Resources and Utah Ave. The RRA started as a mostly vacant properties and has seen a lot of new development over the years. In 2019, the RRA granted funds for the construction for the new MarCom, LLC lab.
- Tax Increment Financing Industrial District #2 (TIFID #2) also known as Montana Connections Business Development Park consists of over I000 acres west of Butte. Montana Connections focuses on constructing large industrial infrastructure to assist developers with construction costs. 2019 was a great year for Montana Connections with the continued construction of Montana Craft Malt, start of construction on the Western States Asphalt plant, expansion of Montana Precision Products, expansion and relocation of Old Dominion and completion of the Butte-Silver Bow spec building for manufacturing and/or distribution/ware-housing. And 2020 will be another great year with the start of construction of rail spurs and two new potential distribution projects.
- South Butte Industrial Park (TEDD) consisting of the Industrial Park around Technology Way and South Parkmont was created with a base year of 2017. The TEDD Board has decided to invest in an infrastructure analysis project to determine how future increment should be invested in the area.
- Harrison Avenue South (HAS) consisting of the Harrison Avenue corridor from Sampson Street to Sunset Road was created with a base year of 2019. This District is intended to create a more robust neighborhood featuring mixed uses and a thriving commercial center.

Other duties of the Community Development office include the management of the Greenway Service District. The Greenway Service District is responsible for the planning, construction and management of the trail. The trail is a 26 mile corridor that will provide passive recreation opportunities between Butte and Opportunity including walking, running and bike riding. To date 3 trail heads and 16 miles of trail have been constructed. In 2019, the announcement of the Great American Rail-Trail project, a 3,700-mile connecting the country across 12 states and the District of Columbia connected the Silver Bow Creek Greenway to this greater, emerging trail system. Existing trails along the route already comprise over 1900 miles of trail.




Montana Tech

Montana Tech possesses an internationally esteemed, century-old tradition of excellence in higher education. Specializing in the science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) disciplines, any field of study you choose at Montana Tech will lead you toward success. Our students learn in state-of-theart facilities performing hands-on work relevant to today's industries.









In 1900, the Montana State School of Mines opened its doors to 39 students pursuing a mining or electrical engineering degree. Today, Montana Technological University specializes in the areas of science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) disciplines.

Montana Tech's north campus offers four-year degrees, graduate degrees, and a doctoral degree in Materials Science. Many of Montana Tech's engineering programs are unique to the region and are among only a few in the country. For example, Montana Tech is one of ten universities offering a BS degree in metallurgical engineering, one of nineteen that offer a BS degree in mining engineering, and one of only twenty that offer a BS in petroleum engineering. Montana Tech also provides more traditional engineering programs, including mechanical, civil, electrical and environmental engineering. The university's south campus, Highlands College, is a comprehensive two-year college embedded within Montana Tech. Highlands offers associate degrees and certificate programs, continuing education, and customized training. Highlands College allows graduates to enter the workforce immediately, or earn credits that may transfer to a 4-year degree program.

Also, Montana Tech offers non-engineering degree and certificate programs in interdisciplinary arts and sciences, cybersecurity and a certificate in pre-apprenticeship lineman. A number of Montana Tech's non-engineering programs have specialized accreditation/certification from entities such as the American Chemical Society (ACS) and The Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE).

The campus is home to the Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology (MBMG) whose state agency mandate is to collect and publish information on Montana's geology to promote orderly and responsible development of Montana's energy, groundwater and mineral resources. The MBMG provides these services to the public and a variety of constituents within the private sector, as well as federal, state and local governments. The MBMG's research faculty also closely collaborate with the academic faculty on research and in the mentoring of graduate students.

Montana Tech's commitment to research has resulted in significant growth over the past few years to exceed \$12.5 million annually from local, state, and national agencies and the private sector. Research specialties emphasize natural resources engineering, materials science and engineering, energy, geosciences and water, restoration ecology and envi-

ronmental engineering, health and bioscience. The distinctive research infrastructure includes an on-campus underground mine; the Center for Advanced Mineral, Metallurgical, and Materials Processing; a High-Performance Computer with 3-D visualization; and the Montana Bureau of Mines and Geology. Projects involve undergraduates and graduate students working closely with faculty.

With over \$36 million in recently completed building and renovation projects and another \$3 million under design, the Montana Tech campus blends historic architecture with new state-of-the-art living and instructional facilities. In the fall of 2019, the new Student Success Center/Living Learning Center opened, providing an ideal environment for students to live, learn, gather and develop lifelong friendships. A new Natural Resource Research Center was recently constructed, which features one of the most high-tech nanotechnology clean labs in the country and will soon house the Schweitzer Engineering Power-Systems Lab. A Nursing Simulation Lab is also under design, which will allow the Nursing department, a recognized leader in education in the state, to increase the intake of students along with integrating real-life simulation opportunities throughout the entire nursing curriculum. Investments have also continued on the underground mine education center, which is the only on-campus underground mine in the country. In 2019, Montana Tech and the Montana Tech Foundation completed a \$40 million campaign. The campaign contributed significantly to improve Tech's campus infrastructure through capital projects while adding \$12 million in new scholarships, including \$7.6 million in new endowed scholarships, \$2 million in investments in our faculty and \$5 million in our programs.



Outstanding teachers are a big part of the Central experience. All faculty members are certified by the State of Montana which requires a minimum of a bachelor's degree. Many BC members have earned advanced degrees.

Butte Central High School is accredited by the National Association of Catholic Schools. In 2012, Butte Central was awarded an additional accreditation through the Western Catholic Education Association. This prestigious accreditation was granted after an extensive 18-month application process and an on-site visitation by a team of educators from the Western United States.

In 2016, Butte Central Catholic Schools added the Esther (Sullivan) Cote Resource Program to provide academic assistance to students with special academic needs. The program, which is staffed by a certified special education teacher, is available to students in kindergarten through high school.

In 2017, Butte Central Catholic High School introduced the Bishop Thomas Scholars Academy. This innovative program is designed to promote advanced academic opportunities for students who are serious about preparing for college. Ramsay School serves kindergarten through eighth-grade students. Ramsay has a Special Education Program and additional support is offered in conjunction with the Butte School District #I. There are I2 teachers. The student-teacher ratio is approximately I4-I. The school also has a Counselor and a CSCT program that is contracted with AWARE. The hot lunch and breakfast program is available. There are three bus routes with bus monitors on all buses. Ramsay School has 29 employees — classified and certified.

Ramsay School has a quarterly Honor Roll and has a Life Long Learner annual award that is given to an eighth grade student. Ramsay participates in the BUG Program.

Several special activities in conjunction with the regular and technology curriculum are offered. These special activities include a sports program for Grades 5-8 (volleyball, basketball, and track), a swimming program (Grades K-8), skiing program (Grades I-8), bowling (Grades 7-8), an archery program (Grades 5-8), and the Clark Fork Restoration and Watershed Program (Grades 7-8). 

Southwest Montana Community Health Center (SWMTCHC)

Southwest Montana Community Health Center has been serving southwest Montana since 1986. Healthcare is available for all people regardless of insurance status or their ability to pay. The SWMTCHC offers a sliding fee schedule that allows us to adjust charges for healthcare services according to family income. In addition, SWMTCHC accepts payment from Medicare, Medicaid, Healthy Montana Kids, and private health insurance plans. The SWMTCHC has locations in Butte, Dillon, Sheridan and Anaconda.

Services

Medical

The SWMTCHC provides comprehensive medical care, including physical exams and preventive care for all ages, urgent care, chronic disease management, substance abuse care, pediatrics and immunizations. Same day appointments for both urgent and routine care.

Dental

The dental team works with patients to promote overall oral health, including check-ups, cleanings, x-rays, fillings and extractions. Each weekday morning a walk-in clinic for dental emergencies is available. The second and fourth Friday of each month is Free Kids Day and all children are seen free of charge.

Behavioral Health

Behavioral health therapists work hand in hand with the medical team to assess and treat patients.

Pharmacy

The SWMTCHC has a full-service retail pharmacy serving both SWMTCHC patients and the public. SWMTCHC patients are eligible for discounted medications based on income. Also, clinical pharmacists work directly with their medical providers to care for patients needing medication assistance and education inside the clinic.

Healthcare for the Homeless

SWMTCHC provides temporary medical services for homeless persons and ongoing medical care for people who remain in the Butte area. Case management is available to assist patients in finding local resources they may need.

The Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement Department is a professional police department and is the only law enforcement department serving The City and County of Butte-Silver Bow. The law enforcement department is the result of the consolidation of the Butte Police Department and the Silver Bow County Sheriff's Department that occurred in 1977. The law enforcement department is led by an elected sheriff. The current sheriff is Ed Lester, a 30-year veteran of law enforcement in Butte-Silver Bow.

The law enforcement department also oversees the operation of the Butte-Silver Bow Emergency Dispatch Center and the Butte-Silver Bow Detention Center. The Law Enforcement Center is located at 225 N. Alaska Street in Butte. The detention center is located nearby, at 155 W. Quartz Street.

The mission of the Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement Department is to protect life and property from criminal activity and maintain the public peace and safety by enforcing the law. Activities of the law enforcement department include arresting and detaining suspects committing or attempting to commit criminal offenses, serving legal papers, suppressing breaches of the peace, riots, or insurrection, investigation of crimes and administration of various community relations programs.

The law enforcement department is divided into three divisions.

They are: The patrol division, the investigative division and the detention center. The department also has a Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team as well as a number of trained hostage negotiators. The law enforcement department recently joined the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (ICAC) and placed an investigator on The Southwest Montana Drug Task Force (SWMDTF). A canine unit has also been added to increase drug enforcement capabilities. The department also has 2 School Resource Officers and a Public Housing Authority officer.

Nearly all sworn personnel, 911 Communication Officers and Detention Officers are trained in Crisis Intervention Techniques in order to interact with persons who are in crisis situations.

The law enforcement department currently has 52 sworn law enforcement officers, 12 dispatchers, 29 detention officers and approximately 15 other civilian employees.

The Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement department responded to over 32,000 calls for service in 2019.

The men and women of the Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement Department are well trained professionals who are devoted to serving the citizens of Butte-Silver Bow.

Butte-Silver Bow Fire Department

The mission of the Butte-Silver Bow Fire Department is to provide the highest level of fire protection and emergency medical services to all of the citizens that we so proudly serve.

The members of the Butte-Silver Bow Fire Department are committed to delivering these services in the form of fire suppression, emergency rescue, fire prevention education, fire investigation, property inspection, emergency care for the sick and injured and any other function that we may be called upon to provide in an emergency.

Career suppression staff work a 24/72 hour schedule Career suppression staff is organized into four shifts - A, B, C, and D. Each Shift has a battalion chief, two captains and six firefighters assigned to it. Career administrative staff consists of the Director of Fire Services, the Assistant Chief/Fire Marshal and a Fire Services Office Coordinator. The Fire Department operating budget also supports two 911 Emergency Dispatcher positions.

Volunteer Departments consist of nine individual departments, Big Butte, Boulevard, Centerville, Floral Park, Home Atherton, Little Basin Creek, Race Track, Rocker and Terre Verde. Each of the nine volunteer fire departments has its own command structure and elected board of district trustees with the exception of Little Basin Creek which is categorized as a volunteer fire company.

Volunteer staffing varies but typically runs in the range of 125 active volunteer firefighters.

The Fire Department budget supports 14 facilities which include the Silver Bow Fire Training Center and a fleet comprised of 33 pieces of fire apparatus and support vehicles.

Insurance Services Office (ISO) Public Protection Classification is a split classification- 4/I0. Their most recent reviews and improvement of the Public Protection Classification was the result of several years of hard work and cooperation between several local government agencies.

MISSION STATEMENT

Our purpose is to enhance the Butte Economy through promoting and supporting sporting and related events in Butte.

BACKGROUND

Advantage Butte was founded when a group of local business leaders recognized that sporting events bring millions of dollars annually into our community. Most of these events can be self-supporting. Many of the potential sponsors of these events, however, lack the resources to provide some of the initial funding to attract and promote the events or lack the resources to cover potential shortfalls. By bringing together broad-based support from throughout the community, the group can provide the financial resources to allow event sponsors to compete effectively in the state and regional market.

Advantage Butte provides Economic Development for Butte through the sponsorship / underwriting of sporting events in the community. The easiest way to measure the success Advantage Butte has had is the number of tournaments we have hosted. Since our organization was founded in 2004, through the spring of 2019, that number stands at over 160. The financial impact of these tournaments is just over \$43 Million dollars added to our local economy.

Since Advantage Butte is a 100% volunteer organization, all money raised goes to the successful bidding and hosting of tournaments. Advantage Butte has always relied on donations from the Butte business community to create Economic Development.

MEASURING IMPACT

The Montana Chamber of Commerce has established a formula to assist communities in measuring the economic impact generated by sporting events.

- Each team member is valued at \$100 per day. (avg. team is 18 players)
- Each team brings 2 fans per athlete -- the exception to this is the class C boys' basketball which is the largest single basketball tournament in the state. Each fan is valued at \$100 per day.







Butte-Silver Bow Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB)

Montana lodging properties began collecting a "bed tax" in the late 1980s, with the sole purpose of promoting our great state to non-resident travelers. Montana statewide collections have risen from \$4.8M in 1988 to \$33.3M in 2018, Butte collections have risen from \$266K in 1988 to \$1.1M in 2019. The increase in "bed tax" collections is due to the success of promotional campaigns, as well as in guest room rates and occupancy over the years. On top of the promotional dollars; an additional 3% is collected and put toward the General Fund. Beginning in January 2020 an increase to 4% will be collected for the General Fund.

Butte has a designated CVB, meaning we receive a portion of the collected promotional funds. The amount of money Butte receives is roughly \$125,000 annually. Because these are tax dollars there are specific rules and regulations pertaining to how these dollars can be spent. An annual marketing plan is prepared and presented to the Governor's Tourism Advisory Council for their input and subsequent approval. At the end of each fiscal year, July I – June 30, each CVB and travel region is audited by the Compliance Specialist at the Montana Office of Tourism and Business Development (MTOBD).

Here is an overview of some of the Butte CVB expenditures for FY18-19:

- Director salary and summer staffing for the Visitor Information Center at the Chamber of Commerce: \$38,000
- Attendance at consumer travel shows and tradeshows promoting our region to tour operators and individuals who have a link to the historic and outdoor recreational opportunities in the Butte area: \$16,000
- Advertising in travel guides: Southwest Montana, Glacier Country and the Yellowstone Journal: \$12,000
- Creation and printing of Visitor Guide and other pieces for distribution: \$12,000
 - Festival sponsorships: \$5,000
 - Attendance at mandatory functions: \$1,200
 - Digital & online promotion: \$60,000
- Payment of postage for sending visitor information, 800#, website domains and email: \$900

Butte-Silver Bow Tourism Business Improvement District (TBID)



The Butte-Silver Bow Tourism Business Improvement District (TBID) was created in July 2011 at the request of Butte hoteliers, to build a promotional fund to increase hotel guest room sales and revenue. Butte lodging facilities collect \$1.00/occupied guest room/night from hotel guests. These funds are billed with the Butte-Silver Bow November property tax bills. From October 1, 2018 to September 30, 2019, Butte collected just over \$250,000. Annually a budget is produced and presented to the Butte-Silver Bow Council of Commissioners and Chief Executive for their review and approval.

TBID dollars are allocated to the following areas:

- Festival Sponsorship
- Events & Tournament Sponsorships
- Meetings & Group Market to promote our convention facilities and offerings to groups looking to visit Butte
- Special Projects (an example is the campaign with the Bert Mooney Airport)
 - Administration salary and operating expenses

The TBID accepts grant applications for funding events, tournaments and projects. Grant applications are reviewed and scored according to guidelines set forth in the grant application process. The TBID operates under two funding cycles; application submittals are accepted


from January I-30, and again June 1-30. The TBID board meets in February and July to review and determine grant awards.

Along with funding grant applications, the TBID works cooperatively with the Butte CVB, Southwest Montana travel region, and the Montana Office of Tourism and Business Development (MTOBD), capitalizing on advertising buys and projects; keeping with the Montana Brand to present a cohesive message for our state and area.

The TBID funded the following projects and events in 2019: Montana Folk Festival, Copper City Cross Fit Hypoxia, Stodden Park/Ridge Waters promotion, tournaments and events at the Butte Civic Center and Maroon Activities Center, Mother Lode Theatre website, conference assistance and the new website Butteelevated.com. The TBID put aside \$200,000 toward the needed minimum revenue guarantee to bring in additional air service into the Bert Mooney airport.

This year the TBID will again work with the CVB on a year-round campaign, promoting area activities, attractions, events, outdoor recreational opportunities expanding the website.

The Copper Sprockets team welcomes riders in grades 6-12 from Butte and Anaconda to ride with the team. The team rides and races in the Montana Cycling League (www.montanamtb.org). Our team philosophy is to get kids on bikes and have fun. Our central goal is for students to develop a strong body, mind and character through mountain biking.

There are no tryouts. Everyone rides no matter his/her ability and skill level. Racing is optional and not required to join the team.

The Copper Sprockets compete in cross-country style racing, based on National Interscholastic Cycling League standards (www.nationalmtb.org) in the fall. Student-athletes will practice with us in the summer and can compete in other fall sports at their own discretion.

We put on four group rides including a Halloween Ride. The club organizes and helps contribute to many hours of trail clearing efforts through the year including groomed 6 miles of winter trails for fat bike riding. We were also involved in organizing the 2019 & 2020 SNöFLINGA snow bike (fat bike) race.

In addition to the above, the Highlands Cycling Club helped secure a grant to pay for new Thompson Park fliers and grooming efforts for fat bike trails.

Starting in 2007 as a small group of mostly locals, the Butte I00 has seen substantial growth in its short history. The race has recently been recognized in nationwide publications as an ultimate test of mountain biking physical and mental aptitudes. A focus of the volunteer-staffed race is continued improvement in racer experience each year. The Butte 100 is proud to be contributing to the growing awareness of Butte, Montana as a world-class recreation city.

Though this entire event is named the "Butte 100", it consists of three individual races: the 25 mile, 50 mile and 100 mile, run in conjuction and support of the other, sharing portions of course, supplies and aid stations and the start/finish area. The trails are the "Most difficult mountain bike race in the country. The race course is staffed by the "Neon Army" an army of volunteers who were honored by the Butte Local Development Corporation as "Volunteer Group of the Year for 2016".

The 100-mile racers will endeavor to complete a full figure-8 course that includes pedaling the equivalent of climbing Mt. Rainier. Only the 100s will experience the desert riches awaiting them in the BLM's Pipestone area. As the 100s are hammering the top portion of the "figure-8," the 50-milers begin the daunting southern portion of the "8." The 100s return through the start/finish area before taking on the now warmed-up southern loop.

The 50-mile course (south loop) is known for the notorious 6-mile Basin Creek Climb that looms over all racers-50s and 100s alike-halfway through the loop. The first male and female in both races to the top are rewarded with King & Queen of the Mountain honors. Those surviving this and the ensuing "8 Miles of Hell," are greeted with a silky 35-mile stretch of single-track on the USFS maintained Continental Divide Trail-the jewel in the Butte 100s crown. A downhill finish reawakens racers from their trail trance and wills them across the finish

The Sorini 25, which was added in 2015 was named after Dr. Peter Sorini, who raced in the 50 and 100 mile races numerous times and supported the Butte 100 since day one, gives the racers another option. This year the race will have a new course with a 5000-foot elevation gain. Dr. Peter Sorini passed away on February 8, 2016, after a 14-month battle with brain cancer.

The Butte 100 is incredibly proud to have developed one of the nation's best mountain bike race events, attracting the highest caliber of racers from across the country and Canada. More so, the race is just as proud of the positive effects the race has had on our home, including its contribution to conversations spotlighting Butte's abundant recreational opportunities.



Winter Trails and Fun

When it comes to winter adventures in southwest Montana, the challenge is what to do – sking, snowmobiling or fat-tire bicycling. With so many options for skiing you can choose which set of skis you strap on for the day: Cross country? Back country? Skinny skate skis? Downhill skis? Telemark skis? Alpine touring skis?

Southwest Montana offers a treasure-trove of skiing options. People lucky enough to live here go where the snow is good. Southwest Montana boasts two downhill ski areas for the family and those wanting challenging slopes that are uncrowded and offer incredible vistas.

Discovery Ski Area, west of Anaconda is a family-run area, known for its expansive variety of terrain — from beginner and intermediate to the hair-raising double-black diamond runs on the famous "Back Side." In the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest. When the snow comes through the area you can bet the next day, when the sun breaks out and all is right with the world, that the deep powder skiing will be unforgettable at Discovery and because the mountain can accommodate a crowd, you'll likely have some runs all to yourself. www.skidiscovery.com. Discovery Ski Area is open 7 days a week from 9:30 – 4 pm. If some in your crowd would rather cross country ski, the Echo Lake Trails are situated adjacent to Discovery Ski Area and offer I4 km of wooded adventure, and groomed trails for classic and skate ski, dogs are also welcome. These Forest Service trails are maintained by the Echo Lake Trails Association. Maps and information about ELTA can be accessed at www.echolaketrails.org.

Further south from Butte is the Maverick Mountain area, located west of Dillon, skimaverick.com/Like Discovery, it's a locally owned operation that caters to families as well as hardcore skiers. Maverick is located just off the Pioneer Mountain Scenic Byway in the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest. Set in the Pioneer Mountains, Maverick boasts exceptional skiing and unparalleled views. The terrain accommodates novice and expert skiers in a relaxed environment. Both Discovery and Maverick can brag: No crowds. No attitude. Rarely are there lift lines. Wide open skiing.

Southwest Montana also features a host of private and public cross country ski options. Homestake Lodge, located minutes from Butte, atop Homestake Pass on the continental divide offers 35 km of high quality skate and classic ski trails, some of which are lit for night skiing. Rent a cabin or yurt for a weekend getaway or relax in the spacious lodge with a cup of soup or hot chocolate. Visit www.homestakelodge.com for more information.

The Mile High Nordic Ski Education Foundation partners with the state of Montana and Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest to groom trails at Mount Haggin and Moulton Ski Area. The Mount Haggin trails are located on Mill Creek Road (SH 274) 11 miles south of Highway I, near Anaconda. At Mount Haggin, the foundation maintains approximately 33 km of groomed cross-country ski trails in cooperation with the Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks. Approximately 10 km are groomed for skate skiing, and 15 km are groomed for classic skiing.

Ski trails can also be used as access to backcountry skiing and telemarking along the Continental Divide. Please no pets on the trails here.

Trails at Moulton Reservoir five (5) miles north of Butte are named after mine sites (e.g. Neversweat, Orphan Girl) and wind through forested areas. 14 km of trails are intermittently groomed for skate and classic skiing, dogs are welcome. Visit www.milehighnordic.org for information and maps for Mount Haggin and Moulton.

For those who prefer to haul a backpack and put climbing skins on their telemark skis, the options for back country travel are endless in southwestern Montana, with so much public land available.

If snowmobiling is your winter adventures there are hundreds of miles of groomed snowmobile trails for family fun and off-trail adventure all within an hour of Butte. Enjoy the Pioneer Scenic Byway by snowmobile south of Wise River and stop in at the family-owned Elkhorn Hot Springs. Georgetown Lake provides hours of family fun located an hour from Butte between Anaconda and Philipsburg on MT Highway I. Just north of Butte over 50 miles of groomed trails are waiting to take you across the continental divide in several places. For more information on trails visit www.stateparks.mt.gov or www.mtrecmaps.com.

However, be aware of avalanche danger and other hazards of back country exploration in winter. Check www.mtavalanche.org or www.missoulaavalanche.org for current conditions.

For those who can't give up mountain biking when the snow arrives Thompson Park, in the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest and Butte-Silver Bow County located I0 miles south of Butte, offers I4 miles of groomed trails including the Milwaukee Rail Trail that travels through two tunnels and a trestle to access the continental divide at Pipestone Pass. Another I2 miles is great for snowshoeing or hiking on mostly packed trails. Visit http://co.silverbow.mt.us/454/Trails-Outdoor-Recreation for information on this and other local trails open for winter hiking and snowshoeing.

A good place to get information for any outdoor adventures in south-western Montana is the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest website at www.fs.usda.gov/bdnf.

In addition to the many winter adventures available on public lands, there are many activities available in Butte. Butte-Silver Bow Parks and Recreation manages several ice rinks for skating fun.

If hockey is the sport you want to participate in, The Copper City Kings youth hockey program provides an opportunity for youth to learn the fundamentals of the exciting game of ice hockey and continue to develop those skills through the experience of playing the game of hockey on Copper City Kings' age specific teams against other local programs and/or in a league. Check out their website at www.coppercitykings.org for more information.

Butte High Altitude Skating Center, originally built as an Olympic Training Center has a 400m skating oval is open for family skating and lessons. Former Olympic skater David Silk is active with operation of the center. davidwsilk@hotmail.com

Created by a geologic explosion that resulted in the Boulder Batholith, the upheaval created lots of exposed rocks, thus making for a wealth of good rock climbing in the Butte area.

A particular favorite is in the Whitetail recreation area, east of Butte. Take Interstate 90 east toward Whitehall, and exit at the Pipestone Exit. Turn left, go under the overpass, then turn left again and follow the gravel road for approximately

A particular favorite is in the Whitefail recreation area, east of Butte. Take Interstate 90 east toward Whitefail, and exit at the Pipestone Exit. Turn left, go under the overpass, then turn left again and follow the gravel road for approximately five (5) miles. Turn right on Forest Road 8635, which will take you to the area's famous Spire Rock. You can see Spire Rock from Four Corners — just look to the northwest.

Spire Rock is a compilation of many different climbs ranging from 5.7 to 5.11 in difficulty, with a variety of multipitch and sport climbing routes available. The semi-arid almost desert-like area that surrounds Spire Rock could be compared to Moab, Utah — except the soil is cream-colored, not red. The area also plays host to a variety of other recreationalists — mountain bikers, four-wheelers, motorcyclists, hikers, rockhounds and horseback riders. So be ready to share the resource. https://www.mountainproject.com/area/108200493/spire-rock

26 miles south of Butte on Interstate 15, take exit 99 and drive three miles east up Moose Creek to the Humbug Spires trailhead. Hike four miles in to where the Highland Mountains shelter about 50 quartz monzonite spires, some of which are 600 feet tall. Novices and experts alike will find the Spires a rock climbing playground for free climbing or gear-required ascents. https://www.mountainproject.com/area/106938732/humbug-spires

Altogether, Butte-Silver Bow's park sites total more than 450 acres of developed and undeveloped park land that provide both active and passive recreation opportunities for residents of Butte-Silver Bow and the surrounding areas, supplemented by the incredible public lands and open spaces in the Butte-Silver Bow area.

There are nearly 45 developed parks and 60 miles of recreational trails (Approximately 27.5 miles paved) in Butte-Silver Bow. The parks amenities include skating rinks, cross country skiing, a skate park, tennis, basketball volleyball, and pickleball courts, a wading pool, splash pad, water park, cemetery, an all-abilities accessible playground, sports fields, 9 hole golf course, par 3 golf course, driving range and two folf courses.

Butte-Silver Bow natural areas include Thompson Park, a 3,800-acre forested park south of Butte that is co-owned and co-managed by the U.S. Forest Service; Big Butte, which is 310 acres; Skyline Park, which is 60 acres; Basin Creek Reservoir, which is 42 acres; and Blacktail Creek, which is 10 acres.

Butte-Silver Bow organizes adult sports including softball, pickleball and volleyball. Partnerships with local youth organizations provide recreation opportunities including little league, football, tennis and soccer.

Thompson Park provides non-motorized trails for hiking, mountain biking, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, and horseback riding, picnic areas and a regulation disc golf course. Skyline Park provides a children's fishing pond, off leash dog parks, all-abilities accessible playground, walking trails and a hang gliding landing site. Big Butte provides non-motorized trails for hiking and mountain biking. Stodden Park is home to Ridgewaters, Montana's newest family waterpark, Highland View Golf Course, the Spirit of Columbia Gardens Carousel, and a destination playground which is all-abilities accessible.



Covellite International Film Festival - June 18-21

The Covellite Theatre, built in 1896 and located in Butte Montana, is a non-profit theatre and arts space. The theatre has seating for 250 people, and a downstairs lobby bar equipped with Beer & Wine, and it's own screen and stage with seating for about 75 people. With an updated sound system and heating system, as well as local and regional tap beers the Covellite Theatre is quickly becoming a favorite stop for musicians and their fans. With all the recent improvements and upgrades the Covellite Theatre has increased its average number of events annually. As word gets out, the Covellite Theatre wishes to bring quality music, art and entertainment to Butte for years to come!

The Covellite International Film Festival (CIFF) is a non-profit event formed in November of 2015. CIFF hosted the first event in September 2016. The Montana Folk Festival returns to Uptown Butte for its tenth presentation this July 10, 11 and 12. Including three years as the National Folk Festival from 2008-2010, this will be the 13th presentation of this much-anticipated event. The festival is a three-day celebration of traditional music, dance, arts and ethnic cuisine. Admission is free of admission for all performances.

The festival is one of the largest free-admission outdoor events in the Northwest, attracting well over 150,000 attendees each year from throughout Montana and surrounding states. This signature event at the beginning of the summer season has grown to become a major economic and cultural magnet for Butte and Southwest Montana.

While admission to all performances is free, attendees are encouraged to consider a suggested \$20 contribution each day of the festival weekend or \$25 for families each day to keep the festival free in this and future years.



Berkeley Pit

From 1955 until 1982, the Berkeley Pit produced enough copper to pave a four-lane highway, four inches thick, from Butte to Salt Lake City, Utah and 30 miles beyond. When mining operations ceased in 1982, the underground pumps were shut off, and the Berkeley Pit began filling with acidic water, heavy metals and unique microscopic lifeforms. Beginning in September 2019 the water is being treated and discharged downstream. The Pit with its water and colorful landscape can be seen via a visitor viewing stand.

Today, open pit mining continues behind the Berkeley Pit in the Continental Pit operated by Montana Resources, employing 350 people year-round. The Viewing Stand and Gift Shop are open May – Mid-September.



Butte-Silver Bow Courthouse

Built in 1911, the rotunda walls are adorned with golden mosaic murals of personified muses; Justice, Geography, History, Philosophy and murals of Presidents Lincoln, McKinley, Washington and Wilson. Large pillars of Montanaquarried travertine draw the eye upward



toward the mosaics and stained-glass dome. The impressive 1,500-pound, 28' in diameter, stained glass dome atop the rotunda was renovated in 2015. The Courthouse is open year-round, Monday-Friday, closed weekends and holidays.

the National Register of Historic Places in 1970. The home is operated as a year-round bed and breakfast. Guided tours are available May – September, and many times by appointment during the winter months.

Butte is the home to two golf courses: Highland View municipal course and the Butte Country Club course.

As the name suggests, Highland View has a wonderful view of the Highland Mountains south of town. The regulation nine-hole course was built in 1939. It is a par 35. This course has two challenging par 3 holes, small greens require accuracy and different tees for the back nine. It takes about two hours to play even when busy. The par 3 course was built in 1980, and has a full swing on every hole. The greens are excellent with a lot of character. It's great fun for all members of the family and a nice walk in the park.

The course is host to the Memorial Tournament in May, the Men's City Championship in July and the Bonnie Highlanders Women Invitational in August, along with local charity fundraiser golf tournaments. Highland View is located in Butte's Stodden Park. The park entrance is off Dewey Boulevard on South Utah Avenue.

The Butte Country Club is a member-owned private country club that provides its members golf, racquetball, swimming, tennis, and fine dining opportunities. The course is an 18-hole, challenging par 70. The club also provides a driving range to master technique or warm up before a round.

The Butte Country Club is located at 3400 Elizabeth Warren Ave. Both of Butte's courses offer golf lessons.

Fairmont's golf course features an outstanding 6,741 yard, 18-Hole, par 72 layouts. Fairmont's "mile high, mile-long" 5th Hole is recognized as one of the most challenging among Montana golf courses. The green is a mile high and the tee box is 649 yards away, making this par 5 one of the longest holes in Montana. Fairmont's 3rd hole features Montana's largest green, a three-tiered 10,000-square-foot putting surface.

Over the last three seasons, Fairmont completed over \$2 million in renovations to the golf course. Projects included rebuilding all of the golf course's bunkers, rebuilding tee boxes and several greens, upgrading the driving range and completely replacing the irrigation system with a stateof-the-art system. The Summit Valley is home to three regulation disc golf courses. Eagles Nest Course, located in Thompson Park on the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest just south of Butte, is a hilly and wooded 18-hole regulation course. The course is a marked course with tee boxes and baskets. Enjoy a long and challenging course surrounded by unbeatable scenery. The course is open May through October, but visitors can walk in throughout the year from the Montana Highway 2 parking area. Mining City Disc Golf Club organizes weekly league play and competitions.

Montana Tech disc golf course is located just west of the Natural Resources Building. The 18-hole disc golf course is located within Montana Tech's Whiskey Gulch Mountain Bike Skills Park. The course is open to the public and Montana Tech's Folf Club hosts tournaments and competitions at the course.

Copper Mountain Park is an 18-hole disc golf course, which follows the perimeter of the park and includes a putting green. Enjoy a round with great views of Butte and the 'M' hill, at a park that includes softball and baseball diamonds and public rest rooms.
