Dear Mr. Spitler:

We are pleased to inform you that the U.S. Board on Geographic Names, at its April 13, 2023 meeting, approved the proposal to change the name of <u>Jeff Davis Gulch</u> in Lewis and Clark County to <u>In-qu-qu-leet Gulch</u>.

The change has been made in the Geographic Names Information System, the nation's official geographic names repository, available at <a href="https://edits.nationalmap.gov/apps/gaz-domestic/public/search/names">https://edits.nationalmap.gov/apps/gaz-domestic/public/search/names</a>. The decision reads as follows:

In-qu-qu-leet Gulch: valley; 1.9 mi. long; heads 0.9 mi. NW of Dreadnaught Hill at 46°40′53″N, 112°14′12″W, trends generally ESE through Bureau of Land Management lands, to join Skelly Gulch; the name is an Anglicized phonetic spelling of the Salish word Nq wq wli7t, meaning "place of lodgepole pine," a tree of great importance in the traditional way of life of the Séliš and Qlispé people; Secs 34,27&28, T11N, R5W, Principal Meridian, Montana; Lewis and Clark County, Montana; 46°39′40″N, 112°13′56″W; USGS map – Austin 1:24,000; Not: Jeff Davis Gulch.

The remaining proposals, to change the names of <u>Jeff Davis Creek</u> and <u>Jeff Davis Peak</u> in Beaverhead County, are pending additional research.
