## to perform at 17th Annual An Rí Rá

#### TRINITY IRISH DANCERS

he world-famous Trinity Irish Dance Company, an An Rí Rá partner since the event's beginnings, is sending its top performers to the festival this year.

The Trinity Irish Dance Academy, which shares founder Mark

The Trinity Irish Dance Academy, which shares founder Mark Howard and its name with the professional company, has frequently sent teen-aged dancers to An Rí Rá. But this year, the Trinity Irish Dance Company, the professional, non-profit performing arts company, is sending 11 adult dancers to Butte.

Howard is coming to An Rí Rá this year – for the first time in more than a decade – and will present a lecture, "Carving New Traditions," about the history of Irish dance and his journey through it.

Chelsea Hoy, the professional company's associate artistic director, is one of the dancers who will perform at An Rí Rá and she will lead workshops during the festival.

The company, hailed as "the birthplace of progressive Irish dance," is excited to bring its uniquely creative, dynamic message of female empowerment to the Original stage. Over the past 29 years, Trinity has performed to great acclaim around the world, including such venues as Washington's Kennedy Center, New York's Joyce and New Victory theatres, Tokyo's Orchard Hall and Los Angeles' Royce Hall, among many others.

By using Irish dance as an instrument and a metaphor, TIDC crossed both cultural and disciplinary boundaries in important ways. Through the years, TIDC has collaborated



with many noted contemporary choreographers which have led them to an increased vocabulary of movement. The result is a thoroughly fresh and engaging artistic vision that goes beyond the source without losing touch with its essence. TIDC holds a unique place in the dance world, offering both a highly skilled presentation of traditional Irish step dance and a brilliantly engaging interpretation of contemporary world vision.

The company believes that "we live in a world where gender inequality has been normalized – where attention is too often directed at men for their intelligence and women for their bodies," Hoy said. For nearly three decades the company has "celebrated the strength, poise and resilience of young female artists, consistently presenting males and females on equal footing," she added. "Through intentional casting, choreography and costumes, we are utilizing our artistic platform to denounce the objectification of women."

Hoy stressed "our company members' uncompromising determination to empower females, both on and off the dance floor."

Trinity's long relationship with Butte and An Rí Rá will grow richer and deeper at this year's festival, and audiences will revel in the company's dynamism, skill, creativity and strong message of female empowerment.

Hoy said that she and Howard will also be thrilled to spend time with the Tiernan Irish Dancers.

"A long time ago, when Cindy Powers was interested in opening an Irish dance school in Butte, she contacted Mark. We're so excited to come back and see how much they've grown."

"From the start of the Tiernan Irish Dancers, we have looked

to the Trinity Company as our main inspiration," said Kerry Powers Hall. "We have watched through social media as they have traveled the world, but this year's An Rí Rá will bring them face to face with their biggest fans."

Hoy commented on the fact that Tiernan is a performance-based academy. "It's incredible to see dancers at such a young age flourishing while celebrating the art form through a performing-arts lens.

"We're really fortunate to have a connection with Butte that extends beyond An Rí Rá."





or the second year in a row, An Rí Rá will feature the ancient Irish sport of road bowling.


The sport, which dates from the 17th century, is today centered in counties Cork and Armagh, but is enjoying a revival.

Participants throw an iron and steel ball, or bullet, along a predetermined road course. The tournament will begin at 9 a.m. Saturday at the Original Mine Yard, with registration preceding the tournament at 8:30 a.m.

The course, over the walking trail above the Original, is expected to take between an hour and a half and two hours to complete.

For safety, competitors must wear closed-toe shoes, and no small children or strollers will be allowed on the

nce again this year, the Montana Irish Festival includes a series of lectures.

The lectures will take place at the Covellite Theatre, 215 W. Broadway, on Friday August 9 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The lineup includes:

•10 a.m.: Mark Howard with the Trinity Irish Dance Company will present a lecture entitled "Carving New Traditions." The lecture will trace the history of Irish dance, focusing on Howard's creative path through the medium and the Trinity Irish Dance Company's evolution and philosophy. Howard is the founder of both the Trinity Irish Dance Academy and the Trinity Irish Dance Company, both based in Chicago. Born in Yorkshire, England, and raised in Chicago, Howard began his dancing career at age eight. At age 10, he would go on to compete at the World Championships of Irish Dance and feature well at the North American Nationals until his retirement at age 15. He began teaching dance at 17, and at age 19 launched the Trinity Academy of Irish Dance, and then founded the Trinity Irish Dance Company. He also contributed to the founding of the Tiernan Irish Dance Company in

he has primarily left his mark on the Butte-Silver Bow Public Archives, the Butte High School History Club, and as co-leader of a Butte history adult education class. He is known for sharing his love of history with all. Mc-Carthy graduated from the University of Montana with degrees in history and political science. He worked for Butte-Silver Bow for 35 years as park superintendent and road foreman, until he retired in 2009.

•Noon: Tom Sweeney: Come All Ye Gallant Irishmen – a look at historic Irish ballads. Sweeney is a balladeer, songwriter and storyteller from Omagh, County Tyrone and a genuine 'rarity' in the field of Irish singing. Along with brother, Jimmy, the late Donegal fiddle player, P.V.O'Donnell, and fellow Omagh man, Brian Doherty, Tom founded the musical collective known as Barley Bree. He then spent nearly twenty years in Nova Scotia, Canada plying his musical trade. Tom has extensively toured Ireland, USA and Canada. In 1998 he accepted a personal invitation from President Bill Clinton to perform his song "Anthem for the Children" in the White House. His audiences range from four and five vear-olds right up to the thousands who regularly attend his performances on the stages of the U.S. and Canada's premier Irish music festivals.
