Providing Butte School District Students with 21st Century Skills

In today's knowledge-based economy, the types of skills our students need to succeed are very different from what we needed in the past. Reading, writing, math, science and history remain the foundation to our education, but broad access to information by way of the Internet has changed how students get their information and the skills they need. (see below)

The Butte School District combines the basic skills of the past with newer skills that are necessary for students to succeed in the workforce of the future. Each of the 21st Century skills is unique in how it helps students, but all are essential in the informational age. The following is a brief summary of the 21st Century skills that are integrated throughout our entire K-12 curriculum.

- **Critical thinking and problem solving:** Solving complex problems are key skills that students will need for high-skilled jobs.
- **Creativity and Innovation:** Employers want employees who can think creatively to find solutions to problems. Creativity empowers students to see concepts differently which leads to innovation.
- **Collaboration:** Students need to learn how to work together and reach compromises to achieve the best possible solutions. Students must have a deep understanding and commitment to the idea of the "greater good".
- **Communication Skills:** Students need to learn how to effectively articulate ideas and concepts to diverse groups of people. Good communication is one of the most important soft skills students can bring to the work place. Good communicators are valuable members of any department or company. Oral and written communication are critical 21st Century skills.
- **Media/Information Literacy:** These are foundational skills that

help students understand facts, figures, statistics, data, publishing methods and sources. Students learn how to analyze publishing methods and sources in order to accurately identify those that are credible.

- **Technology Literacy:** Students learn the basic information that they need to understand computers, cloud programming, and mobile devices in order to adapt to an ever-changing world. Understanding how technology works is critical in order to succeed in the Information Age.
- **Life and Career Skills:** Students must develop adequate life and career skills that include; flexibility and adaptability, initiative, self-direction, accountability, leadership, responsibility and citizenship.

The Butte School District realizes the importance of creating 21st Century learning environments that are student centered and that empower students to be active participants in the learning process. We are committed to designing learning environments that are safe, secure, and that celebrates the unique talents of every student.

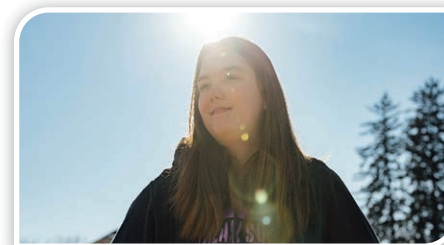

It's Time to Team Up for Attendance

The Butte School District Board of Trustees recently approved a proclamation recognizing September as Attendance Awareness Month. This proclamation is part of the Butte School District's Team Up For Attendance Campaign. The purpose of the initiative is to raise public awareness about the importance of school attendance and the effects of chronic absenteeism. Improving student attendance is an essential cost-effective but critical strategy for ensuring our students are on track to learn and succeed. When students are chronically absent they are missing on average two or more days a month, or 10 percent or more of school days over the academic year. Chronic absence is a leading, early warning indicator of academic trouble and later dropout. Reducing chronic absence is critical to ensuring that all students and their families can realize their hopes and dreams for academic success and opportunity.

Increasing school attendance can be achieved when the whole community works with families and schools. All of us can make difference by helping create a positive school climate that engages students and families in learning and sets the expectation that ATTENDANCE MATTERS!! HELP US SPREAD THE MESSAGE:

•**Good Attendance helps children do well in school and eventually in the workplace.** Good attendance matters for school success, starting as early as prekindergarten and throughout elementary school, and helps students stay on the path to academic success. By middle and high school, poor attendance is a leading indicator of dropout. Absences represent lost opportunities to learn in the classroom.

•**Students are at academic risk if they miss 10 percent or more of the school year, or about 18 days a year.** Once too many absences occur, they can affect learning, regardless of whether absences are excused or unexcused. Sporadic, not just consecutive, absences

matter. Before you know it, just missing two or more days every month can add up to missing 10 percent of the school year. Prevent absences whenever possible. Some absences are unavoidable, for example, due to serious or a contagious illness. But some absences may be preventable by, for example, scheduling family trips during school breaks or helping families with transportation.

•**Chronic absence does not just affect the students who miss school.** If too many students are chronically absent, it slows down instruction, as teacher are likely to repeat material for students who have missed too much school.

•**The key to success is taking a proactive, positive, data driven, problem solving approach.**

Let's make school attendance a community priority so that all our students achieve success!!!

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Prepare for College

Freshmen & Sophomores

Get familiar with the college prep curriculum if you plan to attend a four-year program in the Montana University System. Outline your plan with your counselor.

- Organize your assignments and activities using a student planner or a system that works for you.
- Get involved in extra-curricular activities.
- Find out about college prep courses. See which Advanced Placement, Running Start, Tech Prep or International Baccalaureate courses are offered at your school. If they aren't offered at your school, talk to your counselor about your options.
- Take PSAT 10 as practice for the PSAT test your junior year. (PSAT scores count for National Merit Scholar consideration in your junior year.)
- Research potential careers you might want to pursue, and postsecondary institutions where you can gain the required skills.
- Talk to your parents about your plans for after high school.
- Save for postsecondary education.

Juniors

Enroll in college prep courses. (Advanced Placement, Running Start, Tech Prep or International Baccalaureate). If they aren't offered at your school, talk to your counselor about your options.

- Register for the PSAT in the fall. (Scores count for National Merit Scholar consideration.)
- Take the SAT or ACT in the spring.
- Research careers of interest to you, and explore postsecondary institutions where you can gain the required skills.
- Begin searching for scholarships to help you pay for postsecondary education. Some deadlines come earlier than you might think, so don't delay. Use our Scholly app. Free access provided courtesy of Reach Higher Montana.
- Attend a financial aid night at your school. It's not too early to be learning about your options to pay for your education.
- Plan visits to the campuses of colleges you are interested in attending.
- Save for postsecondary education.

Seniors

Visit with your counselor to make sure you are meeting all of the requirements of the postsecondary institution you want to attend.

- Continue to take college prep courses. (Advanced Placement, Running Start, Tech

Prep or International Baccalaureate). If they aren't offered at your school, talk to your counselor about your options.

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon after October 1 as possible. Check with your school regarding the priority FAFSA filing date at that institution.
- If you need help filling out the FAFSA, look for a Reach Higher Montana FAFSA Help event in your community, or contact the Reach Higher Montana advisor in your area.
- Take the SAT or ACT in October or November.
- Continue to research and apply for scholarships to help you pay for school.
- Check with schools you are interested in attending regarding application and other important deadlines.
- Create a planner on which to log all important dates and deadlines.
- Attend college application nights and college fairs.
- Send high school transcripts to colleges with your initial admissions application in the fall, and send your complete transcripts after final grades and graduation status are recorded.
- Register for selective service at the post office or online. This applies to males, 18 years of age. (You can't receive financial aid if you don't register.)
- Attend financial aid nights at your school.
- Check your Student Aid Report (SAR), sent via email. The SAR is the U.S. Department of Education's summary of information you submitted on the FAFSA and provides an estimated Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and estimated Pell and loan eligibility. Make sure your colleges of choice are listed. If corrections or updates are needed, complete them as soon as possible.
- Evaluate financial aid packages offered by the schools to which you applied. Accept only the aid you need.
- Expect to hear whether you have been accepted to colleges by April 15. Compare the acceptance letters, financial aid and scholarship offers. Reply promptly to acceptance letters from colleges. Pay a non-refundable deposit to your selected college for tuition and housing for your freshman year.
- Participate in summer orientation programs for incoming freshmen.
- Save for postsecondary education and create a budget. Live like a student.

Math & Reasoning

- I count in order to 20

- I know 12 colors.
- I name and sort objects by color, shape, and size
- I recognize numbers and quantities to 10
- I create and repeat 2 to 3 step color patters.

Social & Emotional

- I "settle in" to new groups or situations with minimal stress.

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Enrollment & Vaccinations

You need to bring the following:

- Copies of the child's birth certificate
- Immunization records
- Parent, legal guardian, or legal custodian must be present at the time of enrollment

Current list of immunizations required according to the Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS).

- **Polio:** 3 doses and at least 1 does after the 4th birthday.
- **DTP/DT/DtaP/Td:** 4 doses and one dose must be given after the 4th birthday
- **Tdap/booster:** 1 dose (Prior to entering the 7th grade a pupil must receive a dose of Tdap containing vaccine. This Schedule applies to pupils who have completed the prior 4 doses listed above.)
- **MMR:** Dose 1 on or after the first birthday and dose 2 prior to kindergarten entry. A pupil entering any grade from 7 to 12 who has not already received the 2 required doses at kindergarten age must receive the second dose
- **Varicella:** 2 doses prior to entering kindergarten



The vaccines are available from your private health care provider or the Butte Silver Bow Health Department on an appointment only basis. Contact 497-5026.

If a child has not completed the minimum vaccination series required by Montana Law, a Conditional Attendance Form, No. HES 103-1B should be completed and attached to the Blue immunization Form (HES-101). If the pupil received at least one or more doses of the required vaccine, he/she can conditionally attend until the next dose is due. In order to remain in school the student must continue to receive all remaining doses as specified on the conditional form. If the student fails to complete the immunizations within the time period indicated, he/she must either qualify for or claim an exemption or be excluded immediately from school by the school administrator or the person designee.

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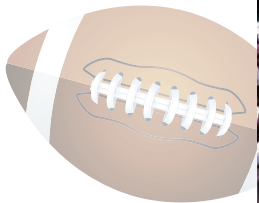
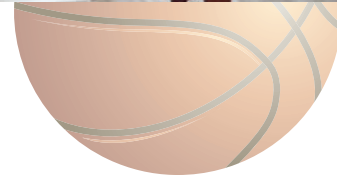
