Community and Business Development

The Community and Business Development Department works in conjunction with the Butte Chamber of Commerce, Butte Local Development Corporation, Port of Montana, Headwaters and the Bert Mooney Airport in our efforts to improve the economic opportunities for our citizens and enhance the community in which we all live.

One of the main tools used by the Community Development Department is Tax Increment Financing. Tax Increment Financing allows a district to capture increased incremental taxes and use the increment to address blight and infrastructure issues within the district. Butte-Silver Bow has four tax increment districts:

- Urban Renewal Agency (URA) consisting of the Uptown Business District the URA's goal is to work with developers through loan and grant funding to reduce blight in the district. The URA recently completed the construction of the parking garage.
- Renovation and Rehabilitation Agency (RRA) consisting of the East Butte area between Montana Resources and Utah Ave. The RRA started as mostly vacant properties and has seen a lot of new development over the years including Water and Environmental Technologies, CCCS and the Butte Brewery.
- Tax Increment Financing Industrial District #2 (TIFID #2) also known as Montana Connections Business Development Park consists of over 1000 acres west of Butte. Montana Connections focuses on constructing large industrial infrastructure to assist developers with construction costs. Montana Craft Malt is constructing a \$15 million facility in the Park.
- South Butte Industrial Park (TEDD). consisting of the Industrial Park around Technology Way and South Parkmont was created with a base year of 2017. The newly appointed board is working on developing programs for the new district.

Other duties of the Community Development office include the management of the Greenway Service District. The Greenway Service District is responsible for the planning, construction and management of the trail along Silver Bow Creek. The trail is a 26 mile corridor that will provide passive recreation opportunities between Butte and Opportunity including walking, running and bike riding. To date 3 trail heads and 16 miles of trail have been constructed.

Opening in 1900 as the Montana State School of Mines, Montana Tech has a century-old reputation as one of the finest science and engineering universities in the nation. Montana Tech specializes in the areas of science, technology, engineering, math, and healthcare disciplines and has repeatedly been recognized among the top universities in America. Recently, Montana Tech was named the #1 best value engineering school in the United States.

The university offers certificate programs, associate, bachelor and master's degrees along with a PhD in Materials Science. All degree offerings derive a special emphasis from the unique setting and continued tradition of high quality that has characterized Montana Tech since its founding.

The university has a long-standing reputation for producing hardworking leaders, difference-makers, problem-solvers and healers who come from ordinary beginnings, and who go on to lead extraordinary lives. Montana Tech currently has 13,191 alumni making Montana and the world a better place for us all to live. For example, Dr. Janalee Stokken, a 2005 Montana Tech biological sciences graduate, is an Otolaryngologist (ear, nose, and throat specialist) at the famed Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN. Stokken, who grew up in Lewistown, MT, a small ranching community, is currently ranked #2 in the nation for Ear, Nose, and Throat surgery. There's also Montana Tech alums, Bryan Larson, a native of Gillette, WY, and Chris Whitmore, from Great Falls, MT, who work for biomedical giant Stryker. Larson, a 1997 engineering science graduate, serves as Vice-President for Product Excellent, overseeing product development, quality, and regulatory for the growing division. Whitmore, a 1999 environmental engineering graduate, is the General Manager of Stryker ProCare, overseeing more than 800 Stryker technical specialists in the U.S. Teamwork, leadership, and problemsolving skills helped Larson and Whitmore find success with Stryker. Leading and problem-solving are a large part of Montana Tech 1984 petroleum engineering alumnus Ryan Lance's daily tasks. Lance is currently the chairman and chief executive officer of ConocoPhillips, the world's largest independent exploration and production company based on production and reserves.

Montana Tech is helping produce the next generation of medical professionals. Tech is one of two state-supported bachelor of science in Nursing programs in Montana. Tech's nursing students continually receive a 100% pass rate on the NCLEX-RN exam. 90% of Montana Tech students who applied to medical, dental, pharmacy, and other professional schools are accepted.

With over \$32.5 million in completed building and renovation projects over the past years and another \$25 million currently under construction, the campus blends its historical buildings with new, state-of the-art laboratory, instructional, recreational and living facilities that enrich the student experience. Much of the work completed and in process is in partnership with alumni, friends, and industry with over \$18 million raised by the Montana Tech Foundation toward these campus capital improvements. The building serves as a strong recruitment tool and provides state-of-the art research and laboratory space.

The campus continues to expand, as currently under construction is a Student Success/Living & Learning Center (SSC). The 25,000-square-foot facility will complete the student life experience on campus, providing an inspiring environment for students to live, dine, socialize and cultivate valuable leadership skills. The SSC will be up and running by the spring of 2019.

Research continues to grow at Montana Tech. Mary MacLaughlin in geological engineering won two grants to work with students to develop the capability of drones for geological mapping in underground mines. Funded by the National Institutes of Health, biologist Marisa Pedulla is collaborating with Rayelynn Brandl to bring the excitement of phage discovery research to high school students and teachers throughout Montana. While mechanical engineers and materials scientists Dario Prieto, Jack Skinner, and Ronda Coguill partnered through Tech's Center for Advanced Mineral, Metallurgical and Materials Processing (CAMP) with Butte-based sp2nano to prove a novel technology for advanced military body armor and other applications. Based on the progress, the company plans to start commercialization this year with a manufacturing facility in Butte. These projects and many others bring research funding to campus, so Tech faculty and students can solve problems that contribute to economic development and environmental sustainability to better the Montana communities where we live and work.

With new buildings, new program offerings, and faculty conducting real-world research, Montana Tech is the solution for the state of Montana and beyond.

In addition to strong academics and school ministry programs, Butte Central






Ramsay School

Ramsay is located 10 miles west of Butte on I-90. The school district includes Ramsay, Fairmont, German Gulch, Dawson, Rocker, Beef Trail, Silver Bow, Juniper Acres and Buxton areas.

Ramsay School serves kindergarten through eighth-grade students. Ramsay has a Special Education Program and additional support is offered in conjunction with the Butte School District #1. There are 11 teachers. The student-teacher ratio is approximately 13-1. The school also has a Counselor and a CSCT program that is contracted with AWARE. The hot lunch and breakfast program is available. There are three bus routes with bus monitors on all buses. Ramsay School has 27 employees – classified and certified.

In addition to the regular curriculum, Ramsay's 7th and 8th Grade students are taught shop, consumer education, drafting, and keyboarding. Ramsay School has a quarterly Honor Roll and has a LIFE LONG LEARNER annual award that is given to an Eighth Grade student. Ramsay participates in the BUG Program.

Several special activities in conjunction with the regular and technology curriculum are offered. These special activities include a sports program for Grades 5-8 (volleyball, basketball, and track), a swimming program (Grades K-8), skiing program (Grades I-8), bowling (Grades 7-8), an archery program (Grades 5-8), Career Day (Grades 7-8), a JOBS program (Grades 7-8), and the Clark Fork Restoration and Watershed Program (Grades 7-8). Ramsay School has several traditional activities – Christmas Play, Mother's Day Tea, annual trip to Yellowstone for 8th grade students and class field trips.



Acadia Montana is composed of Altacare, a school and community-based mental health services program contracting with over 160 schools across Montana and a psychiatric residential treatment facility with 92 beds serving children and adolescents with behavioral, emotional and psychiatric issues. Each Altacare program employs a masters level therapist and mental health associate in each school. The facility in Butte employs 145 people and includes a child and adolescent psychiatrist, psychiatric nurse practitioners, a full time nursing staff, mental health, recreational and addiction therapists, teachers for the on-campus school and a full range of staff to meet the needs of their resident population.

Altacare works with elementary, middle and high school children throughout Montana; their residential center serves children and adolescents from throughout Montana and neighboring states. Altacare also has two Head Start programs.

Southwest Montana Community Health Center (SWMTCHC)

Southwest Montana Community Health Center has been serving southwest Montana since 1986. Healthcare is available for all people regardless of insurance status or their ability to pay. The SWMTCHC offers a sliding fee schedule that allows us to adjust charges for healthcare services according to family income. In addition, SWMTCHC accepts payment from Medicare, Medicaid, Healthy Montana Kids, and private health insurance plans. The SWMTCHC has locations in Butte, Dillon and Sheridan.

Services

Medical

The SWMTCHC provides comprehensive medical care, including physical exams and preventive care for all ages, urgent care, chronic disease management, substance abuse care, pediatrics and immunizations. We provide same day appointments for both urgent and routine care.

Dental

Our dental team works with patients to promote overall oral health, including check-ups, cleanings, x-rays, fillings and extractions. Each morning we hold a walk-in clinic for dental emergencies. The second and fourth Friday of each month is Free Kids Day and all children are seen free of charge.

Behavioral Health

Their behavioral health therapists work hand in hand with the medical team to assess and treat patients.

Pharmacy

The SWMTCHC has a full-service retail pharmacy serving both SWMTCHC patients and the public. SWMTCHC patients are eligible for discounted medications based on income. Also, clinical pharmacists work directly with their medical providers to care for patients needing medication assistance and education inside the clinic.

Healthcare for the Homeless

SWMTCHC provides temporary medical services for homeless persons and ongoing medical care for people who remain in the Butte area. Case management is available to assist patients in finding local resources they may need.

The Beeftrail area served as one of Butte's original ski areas and has since been developed into a premier residential area offering relative privacy, views of the surrounding mountain ranges, and proximity to the city of Butte. Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement Department

The Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement Department is a professional police department and is the only law enforcement department serving Silver Bow County. The law enforcement department is led by an elected sheriff. The current sheriff is Ed Lester, a 28 year veteran of law enforcement in Butte-Silver Bow.

The law enforcement department also oversees the operation of the Butte-Silver Bow Emergency Dispatch Center and the Butte-Silver Bow Detention Center. The Law Enforcement Center is located at 225 N. Alaska Street in Butte. The detention center is located nearby, at 155 W. Quartz Street.

The mission of the Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement Department is to protect life and property from criminal activity and maintain the public peace and safety by enforcing the law. Activities of the law enforcement department include arresting and detaining suspects committing or attempting to commit criminal offenses, serving legal papers, suppressing breaches of the peace, riots, or insurrection, investigation of crimes and administration of various community relations programs.

The law enforcement department is divided into three divisions. They are: The patrol division, the investigative division and the detention center. The department also has a Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team as well as a number of trained hostage negotiators. The law enforcement department recently joined the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (ICAC) and placed an investigator on The Southwest Montana Drug Task Force (SWMDTF). A canine unit has also been added to increase drug enforcement capabilities.

The law enforcement department currently has 52 sworn law enforcement officers, 11 dispatchers, 28 detention officers and approximately 15 other civilian employees.

The Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement department responded to over 33,500 calls for service in 2017.

The men and women of the Butte-Silver Bow Law Enforcement Department are well trained professionals who are devoted to serving the citizens of Butte-Silver Bow.

Career Suppression Staff is organized into four shifts - A, B, C, and D. Each Shift has a battalion chief, two captains and six firefighters assigned to it. Career administrative staff consists of the Director of Fire Services, the Assistant Chief/Fire Marshal and a Fire Services Office Coordinator. The Fire Department operating budget also supports two 911 Emergency Dispatcher positions.

Volunteer Departments consist of nine individual departments, Big Butte, Boulevard, Centerville, Floral Park, Home Atherton, Little Basin Creek, Race Track, Rocker and Terre Verde. Each of the nine volunteer fire departments has its own command structure and elected board of district trustees with the exception of Little Basin Creek which is categorized as a Volunteer Fire Company.

Volunteer staffing varies but typically runs in the range of 125 active volunteer firefighters.

The Fire Department budget supports 14 facilities which include the Silver Bow Fire Training Center and a fleet comprised of 32 pieces of fire apparatus and support vehicles.

Insurance Services Office (ISO) Public Protection Classification is a split classification- 4/I0. Their most recent reviews and improvement of the Public Protection Classification was the result of a number of years of hard work and cooperation between a number of local government agencies.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

Advantage Butte provides Economic Development for Butte through the sponsorship/underwriting of sporting events in the community. Advantage Butte's major sources of funding are member dues, and grants Economic Development Grant money. Using these funding sources wisely, Advantage Butte has been able to bring multiple divisional and state tournaments to Butte.

2017's Economic Development Grant funding will allow Advantage Butte to assist with 5 major events: Montana Tech Big Sky Volleyball Challenge, NRA Rodeo Finals, Class AA Boys and Girls State Golf, Class AA Boys and Girls State Basketball, and Class AA State Softball.

The easiest way to measure the success Advantage Butte has had is the number of tournaments that have been hosted with Advantage Butte assistance. Since the organization began in 2004, through the spring of 2017, that number stands at over 140. The financial impact of these tournaments is just over \$37 Million dollars added to our local economy.

Since Advantage Butte is a 100% volunteer organization, all money goes to the successful bidding and hosting of tournaments. Advantage Butte has always relied on donations from the Butte business community to create Economic Development.

In 2016-2017 Advantage Butte received the continued support of 30 local business members and a non-profit donation for a combined financial contribution of \$13,000. Economic Development Grant money allows our business community to utilize their dollars further to assist in bringing more worthwhile projects into our community that we could not otherwise afford. In the highly-competitive bidding process, the Economic Development Grant money can be the difference between winning and losing a bid.

The success of Advantage Butte has been noticed around the state with communities like Billings, Great Falls, Missoula and Bozeman/ Belgrade all starting up organizations modeled after ours. The competition has never been greater and the spotlight on the positive economic impact a tournament has on communities is forcing us to all get more competitive and creative to keep or increase our share of the pie.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

The Montana Chamber of Commerce has established a formula to assist communities in measuring the economic impact generated by sporting events.

Each team member is valued at \$100 per day. (avg. team is 18 players)
Each team brings 2 fans per athlete, the exception to this is the class C boys' basketball which is the largest single basketball tournament in the state. Each fan is valued at \$100 per day.

BACKGROUND

Advantage Butte was founded when a group of local business leaders recognized that sporting events bring millions of dollars annually into our community. Most of these events can be self-supporting. Many of the potential sponsors of these events, however, lack the resources to provide some of the initial funding to attract and promote the events or lack the resources to cover potential shortfalls. By bringing together broad-based support from throughout the community, the group can provide the financial resources to allow event sponsors to compete effectively in the state and regional market.



Butte-Silver Bow Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB)

Montana lodging properties collect a 7% Accommodations Tax or Bed Tax - this tax is added onto the room rate. This tax is divided down in two increments; 3% going back to the General Fund with the remaining 4% going to the Department of Commerce for tourism promotion, primarily targeting non-residents to visit our grand state. As a designated CVB, Butte receives a portion of these funds. The collections vary from year to year, but generally our CVB receives around \$90,000/year. Because these are tax dollars, there are very specific rules with how these dollars can be spent. The Butte CVB submits an annual marketing plan to be approved by the Governor's Tourism Advisory Board. At the end of the fiscal year, which runs from July I – June 30, each CVB is audited by the Montana Office of Tourism and Business Development.

These dollars are spent on the following:

- Director salary and summer staffing for the Visitor Information Center at the Chamber of Commerce
- Travel shows to promote our region to both domestic and international tour operators and visitors
- Advertising in the travel guides representing our travel region of Southwest Montana, Glacier Country and Yellowstone Journal
- Attraction sheet and visitor guide creation and printing
- Postage, 800#, website domains and email

Butte-Silver Bow Tourism Business Improvement District (TBID)



The Butte-Silver Bow Tourism Business Improvement District (TBID) was created in July 2011 at the request of Butte hoteliers. An assessment of \$1.00 per night per room is passed along to visitors when they stay in hotels. The annual collection is more than \$240,000. The most recent collection period saw an increase of \$17,000 over the same previous period. A budget is produced with dollars allocated to the following market segments: Leisure, Festivals, Events/Tournaments, Meetings/Groups, Special Projects, Opportunity and Administration. A board of director's reviews grant applications allocating dollars according to the number of potential guest rooms that will be occupied, time of year, and the amount of money in each market segment. There are two funding cycles where grant applications are accepted, January I-30 and June I-30. Grants are reviewed with awarded funds determined in February and July.

The goal of the TBID is to increase hotel occupancy through event promotion sponsorship, conference solicitation and assistance, marketing campaigns targeting the leisure market visitors. The TBID works with the Butte CVB and the Montana Office of Tourism (MTOT) cooperatively in marketing efforts, capitalizing on advertising buys in the presentation of a common message for our state and area.

The TBID has given financial support to be used for promotion of the following events: Evel Knievel Days, Montana Folk Festival, An Ri Ra, Northern Rodeo Association, Covellite International Film Festival, Snoflinga and basketball tournaments.

The TBID worked with the Bert Mooney Airport and The Wendt Agency to develop a marketing plan to increase boardings at the Butte airport. Funding for the marketing plan development and execution will be provided with TBID funding. A year-round leisure campaign continues promoting the offerings of the community and the surrounding area.

This year, the TBID is funding a new a website, working with the Butte Economic Development Coordinating Councils' campaign "Butte. Elevated" to promote all Butte has to offer; tourism, recreation, lodging, restaurants, businesses, business development as well as showcasing the lifestyle in southwest Montana. This new site will be used in all promotional campaigns to gather more information on Butte. In addition to tourism related information, links to other sites will be included: Butte Local Development Corporation, Butte-Silver Bow, Butte Chamber of Commerce, US Forest Service, State Parks and Bureau of Land Management.


BIKEBUTTE



A "sharrow" simply indicates a road that is used as an established bike route or shared space with automobiles. Often painted in the middle of the traffic lane to increase paint longevity, MT law states that bikers must always ride as near to the right side of the roadway

the right side of the roadway as practicable and safe.

BIKELANES



Your One Stop Union Print Shop Bicycle lanes are designated by a white stripe and a bicycle symbol to alert all road users that a portion of the road is designated for use by bicyclists only. Bike lanes enable bicyclists to travel at their preferred speed and facilitate predictable behavior between bicyclists and motorists.

CAN BIKES REALLY 'TAKE THE LANE?'

In short, yes. "Taking the lane" is essentially riding in the center of the lane. Cyclists have the lawful right to do this when (a) overtaking and passing another vehicle; (b) preparing for a left turn (c) it is necessary to avoid unsafe conditions along the right side of the rOadWay (including but not limited to a fixed or moving object, parked or moving vehicle, pedestrian, animal, surface hazard, or a lane that is too narrow for a bicycle and another vehicle to travel safely side by side within the lane).

SHARE THE ROAD TIPS FOR MOTORISTS

STAY ALERT A bicycle is a legal vehicle with the same rules, rights, and responsibilities as any other vehicle on the road, including the right to ride in the traffic lane.

GIVE SOME ROOM Pass a cyclist only when it is safe to do so; give at least 5 feet of space when passing. TAKE A LOOK Look for cyclists before turning or opening your door, especially while using designated bicycle routes where cyclists will more likely be.

LAY OFF THE HORN Don't honk at cyclists unless they are in immediate danger.

PAY ATTENTION Texting while driving puts everyone in danger!

YIELD TO PEDESTRIANS Pedestrians have the right of way at all intersections, regardless if there is a marked crosswalk.

SHARE THE ROAD TIPS FOR BICYCLISTS

OBEY THE LAW A bicycle is a legal vehicle with the same rules, rights, and responsibilities as any other vehicle on the road.

RIDE ON THE RIGHT Cyclists must ride on the right side unless the road is too narrow for cars to safely pass or when there are hazards, then ride in the center of the right most lane.

SIGNAL TURNS AND BE PREDICTABLE Bicyclists must use proper hand signals when turning or changing lanes. Be sure to let all road users know where intend to be going.

OBEY TRAFFIC SIGNS AND SIGNALS Bicyclists must follow all traffic rules, including stopping at signals and stop signs.

STAY VISIBLE bicyclists must use a front light and rear reflector or light when riding at night. Increase your visibility by wearing bright colors.

PROTECT YOUR HEAD Always wear a properly fitted helmet. Helmets reduce injuries and are proven to save lives.



Butte 100 - July

Starting in 2007 as a small group of mostly locals, the Butte 100 has seen substantial growth in its short history. The race has recently been recognized in nationwide publications as an ultimate test of mountain biking physical and mental aptitudes. A focus of the volunteer-staffed race is continued improvement in racer experience each year. The Butte 100 is proud to be contributing to the growing awareness of Butte, Montana as a world-class recreation city.

Though this entire event is named the "Butte 100", it consists of three individual races: the 25 mile, 50 mile and 100 mile, run in conjuction and support of the other, sharing portions of course, supplies and aid stations and the start/finish area. The trails are the "Most difficult mountain bike race in the country" per Tinker Juarez, highly talented cyclist who has made significant impacts in the cycling disciplines of BMX Racing, Freestyle BMX and Mountain Biking. He will be back this year to race and going after his course record of just over eight hours in the 100 mile race. The race course is staffed by the "Neon Army" an army of volunteers who were awarded by the Butte Local Development Corporation as "Volunteer Group of the Year for 2016"

The I00-mile racers will endeavor to complete a full figure-8 course that includes pedaling the equivalent of climbing Mt. Rainier. Only the I00's will experience the desert riches awaiting them in the BLM's Pipestone area. As the I00's are hammering the top portion of the "figure-8," the 50-milers begin the daunting southern portion of the "8." The I00's return through the start/finish area before taking on the now warmed-up southern loop.

The 50-mile course (south loop) is known for the notorious 6-mile Basin Creek Climb that looms over all racers–50's and 100's alike–halfway through the loop. The first male and female in both races to the top are rewarded with King & Queen of the Mountain honors. Those surviving this and the ensuing "8 Miles of Hell," are greeted with a silky 35-mile stretch of single-track on the USFS maintained Continental Divide Trail–the jewel in the Butte IOO's crown. A downhill finish reawakens racers from their trail trance and wills them across the finish line.

The Sorini 25-Don't Stop Believing" named after Dr. Peter Sorini, who raced in the 50 and 100 mile races numerous times and supported the Butte 100 since day one gives the racers another option. This year the race will have a new course with a 5000 ft elevation gain. Dr. Peter Sorini passed away on February 8, 2016, after a 14-month battle with brain cancer.

The Butte 100 is incredibly proud to have developed one of the nation's best mountain bike race events, attracting the highest caliber of racers from across the country and Canada. More so, the race is just as proud of the positive effects the race has had on our home, including its contribution to conversations spotlighting Butte's abundant recreational opportunities.

Skiing/Snowboarding

When it comes to skiing in southwest Montana, the challenge is which set of skis will you strap on for the day: Cross country? Back country? Skinny skate skis? Downhill skis? Telemark skis? Alpine touring skis?

Southwest Montana offers a treasure-trove of skiing options. People lucky enough to live here go where the snow is good.

One option is the Discovery Ski Area, west of Anaconda. A familyrun area, it's known for it expansive variety of terrain — from beginner (toddlers can learn here) and intermediate to the hair-raising doubleblack diamond runs on the famous "Back Side." And when those ferocious storms blow through, making roads slick and visibility frighteningly poor, you can bet the next day, when the sun breaks out and all is right with the world, that the deep powder skiing will be unforgettable at Discovery. And because the mountain can accommodate a crowd, you'll likely have some runs all to yourself. www.skidiscovery.com

Further south from Butte is the Maverick Mountain area, located west of Dillon, http://skimaverick.com/Like Discovery, it's a locally owned operation that caters to families as well as hardcore skiers. Maverick is located just off the Pioneer Mountain Scenic Byway in the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest. Set in the Pioneer Mountains, Maverick boasts exceptional skiing and unparalleled views. The terrain accommodates novice and expert skiers in a relaxed environment. Both Discovery and Maverick can brag: No crowds. No attitude. Rarely are there lift lines. Wide open skiing.

Southwest Montana also features a host of cross –country ski options, from the privately operated Homestake Lodge, located atop Homestake Pass http://www.homestakelodge.com/ to the Mount Haggin Nordic

Rock Climbing

Created by a geologic explosion that resulted in the Boulder Batholith, the upheaval created lots of exposed rocks, thus making for a wealth of good rock climbing in the Butte area.

A particular favorite is in the Whitetail recreation area, east of Butte. Take Interstate 90 east toward Whitehall, and exit at the Pipestone Exit. Turn left, go under the overpass, then turn left again and follow the dirt road for several miles. You'll climb into a flat area and come to a parking area called Four Corners, which is marked by two newer latrines. Keep driving, and turn right on Forest Road 8635, which will take you to the area's famous Spire Rock. You can see Spire Rock from Four Corners — just look to the northwest.

Spire Rock is a compilation of many different climbs ranging from 5.7 to 5.11 in difficulty, with a variety of multi-pitch and sport climbing routes available. The semi-arid almost desert-like area that surrounds Spire Rock could be compared to Moab, Utah — except the soil is cream-colored, not red. The area also plays host to a variety of other recreationalists — mountain bikers, four-wheelers, motorcyclists, hikers, rockhounds and horseback riders. So be ready to share the resource.

Twenty-six miles south of Butte on Interstate 15, take exit 99 and head east up Moose Creek to the Humbug Spires trailhead. Hike four miles in to where the Highland Mountains shelter about 50 quartz monzonite spires, some of which are 600 feet tall. Novices and experts alike will find the Spires a rock climbing playground for free climbing or gear-required ascents. Ski Area, south of Anaconda and west of Butte, or the Moulton Trails just a few miles north of Butte. The Mile High Nordic Ski Education Foundation maintains the Mount Haggin and Moulton Trails visit http://milehighnordic.org.

The Mount Haggin trails are located on Mill Creek Road (SH 274) II miles south of Highway I, near Anaconda. At Mount Haggin, the foundation maintains approximately 20 km of groomed cross-country ski trails in cooperation with the Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks. Approximately I0 km are groomed for skate skiing, and 15 km are groomed for classic skiing. Ski trails can also be used as access to backcountry skiing along the Continental Divide.


The trail system is groomed once or twice per week by volunteers using snowmobiles and Yellowstone Track grooming equipment.

Please no pets on the trails here; visit the dog friendly trails at Homestake Lodge and Moulton.

Trails are also groomed at Moulton Reservoir north of Butte in cooperation with the U.S. Forest Service. The trails here are generally not groomed to the same standards as at Mount Haggin but there is excellent skiing and the trails are dog friendly.

For those who prefer to haul a backpack and put climbing skins on their telemark skis, the options for back country travel are endless in southwestern Montana, with so much public land available. However, be aware of avalanche danger and other hazards of back country exploration in winter.

Butte is the home to two golf courses: Highland View municipal course and the Butte Country Club course.

As the name suggests, Highland View has a wonderful view of the Highland Mountains south of town. The regulation nine hole course was built in 1939. It is a par 35. This course has two challenging par 3 holes, small greens require accuracy and different tees for the back nine. It takes about two hours to play even when busy. The par 3 course was built in 1980, and has a full swing on every hole. The greens are excellent with a lot of character. It's great fun for all members of the family and a nice walk in the park.

The course is host to the Memorial Tournament in May, the Men's City Championship in July and the Bonnie Highlanders Women Invitational in August, along with local charity fundraiser golf tourna-

ments. Highland View is located in Butte's Stodden Park. The park entrance is off Dewey Boulevard on South Utah Avenue.

The Butte Country Club is a member-owned private country club that provides its members golf, racquetball, swimming, tennis, and fine dining opportunities. The course is an 18-hole, challenging par 70. The club also provides a driving range to master technique or warm up before a round.

The Summit Valley is home to three disc golf courses.

Sagebrush Flats, located in Thompson Park on the Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest just south of Butte, is a hilly and wooded 18-hole technical course. The course has a combination of tone poles and home-made baskets. Enjoy a long and challenging course surrounded by unbeatable scenery.

Another disc golf course is located just west of the Natural Resources Building on the Montana Tech campus. The 18-hole disc golf course is located within Montana Tech's Whiskey Gulch Mountain Bike Skills Park. The course is open to the public, and Montana Tech's Folf Club hosts tournaments and competitions at the course.

Copper Mountain Park is also known for its 18-hole disc golf course, which follows the perimeter of the park and includes a putting green. Enjoy a round with great views of Butte and the 'M' hill, at a park that includes softball and baseball diamonds and public restrooms.

Stodden Park Pool is now Ridge Waters

Starting on Memorial Day weekend, Stodden Park will be home to Montana's newest family waterpark, Ridge Waters. This state of the art facility will feature two waterslides, Montana's longest lazy river, zero depth entry children's area with interactive play features, a diving board, rock climbing wall, swimming lanes, and more. The fun will extend out of the water as well, with rentable cabanas, ample deck and green space, and a concession stand with outdoor seating.





Montana Folk Festival - July 13-15



The Montana Folk Festival returns to Uptown Butte for its eighth presentation this July 13, 14 and 15. After three years as the National Folk Festival from 2008-2010, this will be the 11th presentation of this much anticipated and beloved event.

The festival is a three-day celebration of traditional music, dance, arts and ethnic cuisine. Admission to all is free for all performances.

The festival is one of the largest outdoor events in the Northwest, attracting well over 150,000 attendees each year from throughout Montana and surrounding states.

This signature event at the beginning of the summer season has grown to become a major economic and cultural magnet for Butte and Southwest Montana.

While admission to all performances is free of charge, attendees are encouraged to consider a suggested \$20 contribution each day of the festival weekend or \$25 for families each day to keep the festival free in future years.

In 2017, the festival will include multiple stages featuring the talents of more than 200 artists presenting music and dance performances and moderated talk/demonstration sessions, a participatory dance area, a Family Area, a Montana Folklife Area, regional and ethnic foods, and a festival folk arts market and the First Peoples' Market that features the creative works of the region's Native American artists.

Organizers have set the theme for the festival's Montana Folklife Area. "Each year, we focus on a theme that highlights an important aspect of Montana's heritage. For 2018, that theme is set -- "Gems and Minerals of Montana and the Mountain West," said George Everett, Festival Director and Festival Executive Committee Member This theme will guide the activities, displays and demonstrations of the popular Montana Folklife Area and will include demonstrations and displays by a variety of Montanans who make their living in some way with precious gems and minerals.

"Attendees to the Montana Folk Festival this July can expect to see a variety of exhibits, and demonstrations of gems and minerals from the bounty of what is known for good reason as the Treasure State.
