COMMISSIONER AMBROSE EXPOSES "SHAM" ETHICS COMPLAINT BY LIBERAL OPPONENTS; REFUSES TO BACK DOWN ON TAX CUTS FOR MONROE COUNTY

FORSYTH, GA — February 4, 2026 — Monroe County District 3 Commissioner John Ambrose is taking the fight directly to the Radical Left today by proactively exposing a secret political "Witch Hunt" being orchestrated within the County Commission.

Ambrose has learned that a baseless and disgusting ethics complaint is being cooked up behind closed doors led by liberal Democrat Commissioner **Lemarcus Davis** and his allies.
