### St. Leo's Obtains Residence to Convert Into Nun's Convent

Early in January of this year the Sisters of St. Joseph who teach at St. Leo's parish school will move into their new home. St. Leo's school opened in 1947, staffed by St. Joseph Sisters who resided at the Provincial house at St. Catherine's College. Last fall, due to lack of room at the Provincial house the Sisters moved to Holy Angels Academy at Richfield.

The parish obtained the Laurence Marvy residence at 2036 Bohland. This large home was designated as a four family residence. The home is admirably suited to Convent needs. It provides a large community room, recreation room, dining room, office, and sleeping quarters for the Sisters.

At a parish shower sponsored by the St. Leo's Women's Guild, hundreds of beautiful and useful gifts were provided for the Sisters. At the present time a campaign to raise funds for the payment of the Convent is being conducted.

Sister Martina, C.S.J. is principal of the school and Mother of the Convent. The enrollment of the parish school is 452, staffed by nine Sisters and three lay teachers.

It will be presented by the Women's Auxiliary whose co-chairmen in charge of general arrangements are Mrs. Sidney Adelman, 1865 Highland Pkwy. and Mrs. Paul Allan, 1836 Ford Pkwy.

All guests are invited to a Sholom Ceremonial Service, which precedes the dinner, in the Sanctuary of the Temple. This ceremony which will culminate in a candlelight procession into the dining room is being directed by Mrs. Victor Tushin.

Entertainment has been planned with Mr. John N. Christianson as Toastmaster, and Shick's Sextet produced by Glyde Snyder.

Mrs. Jack Edelstein, 2040 Yorkshire serves the 1000 members of the Sholom Residence Auxiliary as their President.

Hurok brought the Moiseyev Dance Company to this country from Russia earlier this year it seemed impossible that he would ever find another company to compare with it, but the redoubtable Mr. Hurok has now produced another surprise from his bottomless bag of great art attractions in the Beryozka Dance Company of Moscow.

## Atom Scientist Will Speak at St. Catherine

Dr. James B. Kelly, an Atomic Scientist, will be a two day visitor at The College of St. Catherine on January 9 and 10.

"Men on the Moon" is the topic of his convocation address in the Jeanne d'Arc Auditorium on Friday, January 9 at 10:30 a. m. at 1:30 p. m., Dr. Kelly will speak on "What Atomic Energy Means to You" in the Auditorium.

On Saturday, January 10, he will address members of the Science Workshop.

The Beryozka, which appears in Northrop Memorial Auditorium on January 13 and 14, is the first Russian dance company ever to appear in Minneapolis.

Where the Moiseyev was all masculine fire, the Beryozka is filled with the enchanting beauty of lovely young women. There is plenty of fire, too, and excitement; and the ever-changing patterns of movement and beautiful costumes produce their own special excitement.

The Beryozka offers traditional folk dance forms moulded into stage pieces of great beauty. The dancers are all trained in the famed Bolshoi Ballet School and selected for the Beryozka by Mme. Nadezhdina, artistic director of the company.

Proceeds from this presentation will go to the Variety Club Heart Hospital at the University of Minnesota. The Beryozka is presented locally under the auspices of the University and the Women's Auxiliary of the Variety Club.

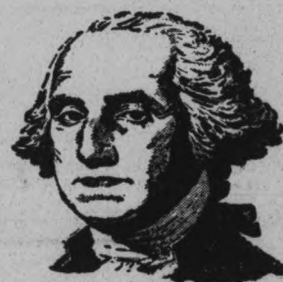

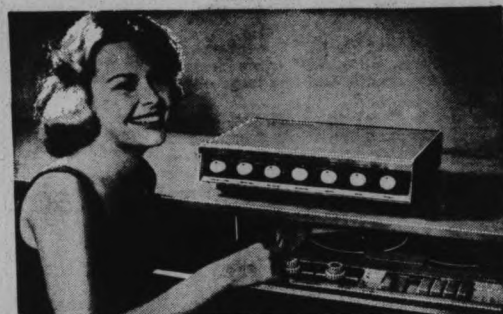
