WINTER FUN IN MINNESOTA depends partly on good facilities such as the newly-opened recreational shelter building at Homeroft Playground, Edgumbe and Sheridan. Located adjacent to the hockey and skating rinks, the building provides a warming room, lavatories, drinking fountain. Overhead garage door at left pairs with another on opposite side of building to provide storage space for snow plows, tractors and other equipment. In summer both big doors can be opened for fresh-air ping-pong space. Also included in the 30x60' building is office space for a playground supervisor and a storage room for sports equipment. The St. Paul department of parks and playgrounds provides supervised outdoor activities 30 weeks out of the year. For the 20-week indoor program, kitchen and gym facilities of Homeroft School across the street are used. The \$27,000 shelter building was built with funds from the city bond issue passed in 1953.

Macalester Enters Double Degree Program with M.I.T., Turck Announces

Macalester college has entered into a double degree program in engineering with Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Dr. Charles J. Turck, Macalester president, announced.

Starting with the second semester, Macalester will offer a program giving the A.B. degree on a three-year, two-year combined program with MIT.

In this program the student must complete the Macalester requirements for the A. B. degree in three years, then transfer to MIT and complete his engineering work in two years.

Upon completion of the joint five year program the student will receive both the A. B. from Macalester and the engineering degree from MIT. Only top ranking students will be able to qualify for both degrees in five years.

Also starting with the second semester, Macalester will offer two new courses. "Sociology of Art" will be given in the sociology department. It will emphasize the relation between art and society. The social roles of artist, audience, critic, seller, patron, etc., will be discussed and analyzed. Literature will have priority among the art forms.

A new course in economics will be "General Business Conditions." It will survey the American economy and its potentialities for economic growth. The work will be based upon the newly-developed National Income Accounts which provide a simple, "measured universe." The course will end with a careful appraisal of the policies required for stable economic growth. Classroom work will be of the laboratory character designed to train the student to make his own analysis of general business conditions as they exist in the United States.

Christian Marriage Course Starts on TV February 2

A new television series on Christian Marriage will be offered over KTCA-TV, channel 2, beginning February 4. Thirty half-hour programs will be given on Tuesdays and Fridays beginning at 8 p. m.

The Rev. Walter LeBeau, well-known marriage counselor and professor of religion at the College of St. Thomas, will conduct the course. Topics he will discuss include: "The Rights and Duties of the Married Couple;" "Wedded Love;" "Mixed Marriages;" "God's Design in Sex;" "Birth Control;" "The Wedding Day;" and "Getting Along Together."

These TV lectures are specifically designed to prepare adults for marriage and to give married couples a deeper understanding of their life together.

Monthly discussions will also be held at St. Thomas College where viewers will be provided with an opportunity for individual and personal questions and counseling. Students at St. Thomas will be able to take this course for regular academic credit. Viewers also desiring full semester credit should write to the College for details. Viewers not desiring academic credit, but wishing to receive an outline of the 30 programs, supplementary reading material, admission to the monthly group discussions, and a certificate of completion, may do so by paying a \$5 registration fee.

Father LeBeau is the chairman of the religion department at the College. He recently returned from Japan and Korea where he conducted two three-day retreats for Catholic chaplains. Father LeBeau annually conducts marriage lectures at the Minneapolis and St. Paul Catholic Youth Centers, as well as serving as marriage counselor to nurses' college men and women, and other young people's groups. His articles have appeared in the Catholic Digest, the Commonweal, Worship, and a number of educational journals. He has been a member of the St. Thomas faculty since 1934 with the exception of a three year tour of duty as a chaplain in the Navy where he served in Virginia and in the Marshall Islands.

This series is the first credit course to be offered by St. Thomas on the new educational television station.

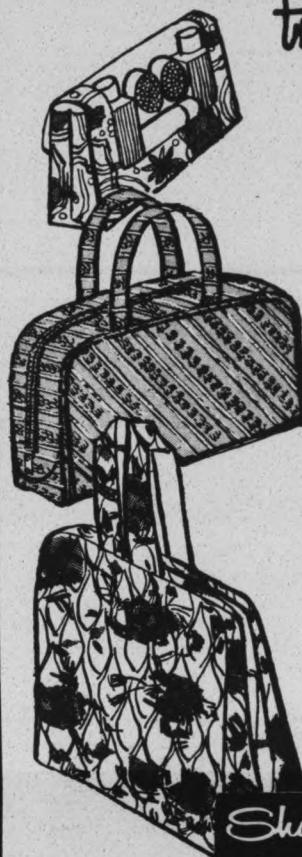

Winter Adult Education Program Offers Classes for Men, Women

Winter session of the Saint Paul Public Schools adult education program will open the week of February 3. Anticipated enrollment will be almost 4000 adults. The increased popularity of the adult education program means that you must make your plans early and register the week of January 27 at your community school evening center. A \$5 fee covers twenty hours of classroom instruction with ten weekly meetings.

Some 250 classes in more than 50 subject areas will be offered in ten public high school evening centers: Central, Cleveland, Como Park, Harding, Hazel Park, Highland Park, Humboldt, Monroe, Washington and Wilson. Course offerings include classes emphasizing personal growth and improved use of leisure time such as driver education, public speaking, short story writing, Spanish, modern dance and camping for the family.

Another popular area of study are those courses that relate to improving our homes and family life such as gardening, lampshades, woodworking, family finance and home catering. For those hundreds of adults interested in taking courses related to fashion and clothing construction, there are classes for the beginner as well as for the experienced dressmaker. Rug braiding

will be offered for the first time at Wilson on Thursday evening.

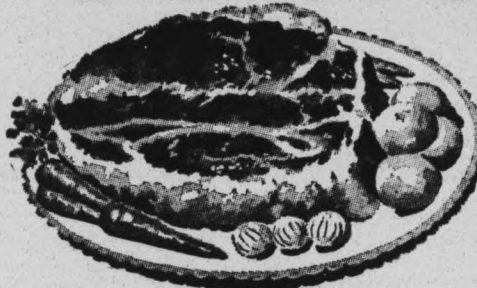

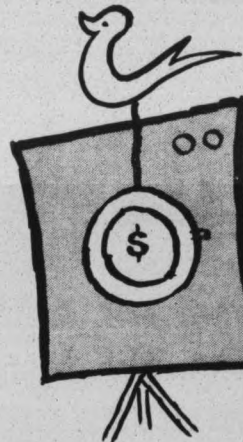
