Eugenie M. Anderson Will Deliver St. Catherine Graduation Address

Eugenie M. Anderson, America's first woman ambassador, will deliver the address at The College of St. Catherine commencement exercises on Sunday.

The 56th commencement exercises will be conducted in the St. Paul Auditorium theatre beginning at 3 p.m. Degrees will

be conferred upon 239 graduates.

Baccalaureate services will be held at 10 a.m. at the college in Our Lady of Victory Chapel.

Principal celebrant of the concelebrated mass will be The Most Reverend Gerald O'Keefe, Bishop of Davenport, Iowa. He will also deliver the homily.

Mrs. Anderson, who at this time is serving as the U.S. Representative to the U.N. Trusteeship Council, will receive an honorary doctor of letters degree during the commencement exercises.

She will become the second person ever to receive an honorary degree from St. Catherine's. The late Mrs. Mary Rahilly McCahill, a former trustee of the college, received the first honorary degree in 1922.

Barbara Ward Will Speak at Mac Commencement

Barbara Ward, distinguished British economist and writer, will be the featured speaker at the 79th annual Commencement at Macalester College Monday, May 27, at 10 p.m. in the Field House.

Miss Ward also will receive an honorary doctor of laws degree from Macalester.

A total of 365 seniors are candidates for the bachelor of arts degree, 113 with honors. The College also will grant two master of education degrees.

Three other honorary degrees will be awarded.

The recipients are: Gary H. Higgins, Livermore, Calif., nuclear chemist who was U.S. delegate to the third U.N. conference on peaceful uses of atomic energy; the Rev. Dr. Donald M. Meisel, Princeton, N.J., pastor active in civil rights; and the Rev. J. Maxwell Adams, who retired last Dec. 31 after 20 years as chaplain at Macalester.

Higgins will receive the doctor of science degrees and Drs. Meisel and Adams will receive doctor of divinity degrees.

Dr. Adams will give the address at the 4 p.m. Baccalaureate service Sunday, May 26.

Miss Ward, who is Schweitzer Professor of Economics at Columbia University, formerly was foreign affairs editor of The Economist, London, and is regarded as one of the most influential writers here and in Great Britain.

Educated at the Sorbonne and at Oxford, Miss Ward is the author of several works including "The Rich Nations and The Poor Nations." She has lectured at Harvard and Cambridge University, England, and in 1967 was named to the Vatican's Commission on Justice and Peace.

Receive Training Mental Retardees

Twelve mentally retarded persons living in the metropolitan area began training as industrial kitchen helpers at the St. Paul Area Technical-Vocational Institute, Governor Harold LeVander said.

Jobs are waiting for them and for 24 more mentally retarded individuals whose training will start in June and July.

Vocational training will be under the Manpower Development and Training Act (MDTA), with personnel from several State departments and other agencies working closely together to prepare them for employment. "This team approach will equip the mentally retarded with the social 'skills' and knowledge they need to keep the jobs for which they are being trained and to look after themselves."

The waiting jobs result from the participation of a St. Paul-based firm, Economics Laboratory, Inc. in a 1967 pilot MDTA training project conducted for the mentally retarded in four State institutions.

Economics Laboratory provides food service operators with ware-washing equipment in hotel and restaurant kitchens of ware-washers, people who clean the dishes, pots, pans, other kitchen utensils and the work area.

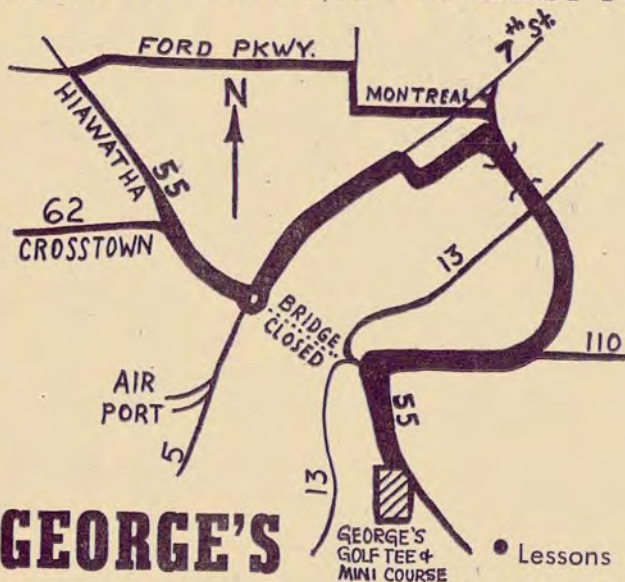
With the aid of equipment, materials and consultants furnished by Economics Laboratory, the pilot project included a course in ware-washing. By October 15, 1967, 15 mentally retarded trainees were employed as ware-washers, and are still working at their original jobs.

Prospective trainees are selected by the Minnesota State Employment Service in cooperation with the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation and the Greater St. Paul Rehabilitation Center. The first class is participating in a three-week preliminary program at the Rehabilitation Center. Following completion of the training, the State Employment Service and the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation are responsible for placing the trainees in suitable jobs.

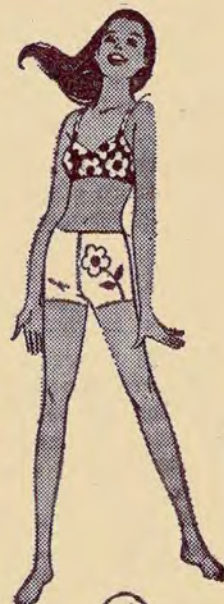

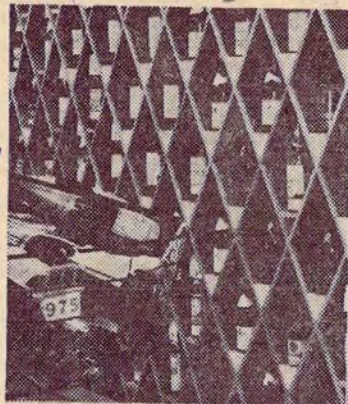
