

Coeducation Will Continue at Cretin Summer School

The coeducational summer school held each year at Cretin High School will continue this year, from June 16 to July 25.

It furnished entering freshmen, as well as high school students of every year, the opportunity to get remedial work in weak areas, to make up for credits lacking, and to take advantage of courses which they are unable to follow during the regular academic year.

Special programs are available in advanced reading, personal typing, private and group instrumental music, and driver training. These courses are also available to adults.

Students entering the 9th grade in September are able to take classes in reading improvement, language arts, and introduction to algebra. Makeup classes are available in English, algebra, geometry, religion, American civilization, military, health and physical education, and foreign languages.

Registration begins on June 10; more information can be obtained by calling the Summer School office at Cretin.

Students from all public and private elementary and secondary schools in the Twin Cities are eligible to apply.





Dollhouse Replica Is Historical Society Feature

A dollhouse dating from the 1860's has been presented to the Ramsey County Historical Society by Mr. and Mrs. Walter P. Kueffner, 2097 Highland Parkway, St. Paul, and now is on display at the Society's Gibbs Farm Museum.

Originally built for the children of Mr. Kueffner's uncle, a Civil War general, the dollhouse was restored by Mr. and Mrs. Kueffner after much research into furnishing of the Civil War period, said Hayden L. Stright, 2541 Taylor Ave., White Bear Lake, president of the Society.

The dollhouse is a replica of the general's own house and consists of a parlor, sitting room and kitchen, with an attic upstairs. A family of dolls, dressed by Mrs. Kueffner, "inhabits" the house. Two of them represent the general, in his blue uniform of the Union Army, and his elegantly dressed wife whom he is bidding farewell.

The Gibbs Farm Museum is open to the public daily, except Saturday and Monday, from 2

to 5 p.m. There is no admission charge. A special feature each Sunday is the demonstration of an old-fashioned art or craft, such as candle-dipping, spinning, quilting, butter-churning or chair-caning.


The museum, which also is the headquarters of the Ramsey County Historical Society, consists of four buildings: a restored farmhouse, a one-room rural schoolhouse, and two barns. One houses an agricultural museum and the other a collection of carriages and sleighs which once belonged to James J. Hill and were presented to the Society last summer.

C of C Members Favor New Election Laws

Results of a recent opinion poll of members of the Saint Paul Area Chamber of Commerce regarding the method of electing the President of the United States revealed an overwhelming majority in favor of some kind of electoral college reform with the direct or popular method of election the top choice.

Of the 382 responding to the survey, 94 percent were for reform, less than 6 percent wanted no change and less than 1 percent had no opinion.

A total of 72 percent of those voting for reform favored the direct method, 27 percent preferred the congressional district method and 1 percent had no opinion.

The congressional district method provides that a presidential candidate would get one electoral vote from each congressional district in which he carries a plurality and two additional votes from each state in which he has a plurality, and abolish the electors office.

This opinion poll is one of several being conducted by the St. Paul Chamber to tap the feelings of its members and encourage their participation in key governmental issues.
