AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An

act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial

3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4

laws relating thereto," in interscholastic athletics 5

accountability, providing for playoffs, for transfer and for

district committees.

- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8
- hereby enacts as follows: 9
- Section 1. Article XVI-A of the act of March 10, 1949 10
- (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is 11
- amended by adding sections to read: 12
- Section 1606-A. Playoffs. -- (a) The following provisions 13
- shall apply to football, boys' basketball, boys' soccer, girls' 14
- soccer, girls' basketball, girls' volleyball, baseball and 15
- softball interscholastic athletics in this Commonwealth: 16
- (1) For the purpose of interdistrict playoffs, separate 17
- playoff systems shall be established by the association for 18
- athletics for public schools and nonpublic schools, except that 19
- the championship shall be between the public school champion and 20

- 1 nonpublic school champion that won in the separate playoff
- 2 systems. There shall be an equal number of public and nonpublic
- 3 schools in each interdistrict playoff system. If there is an
- 4 insufficient number of qualified nonpublic schools in a
- 5 particular classification equal to those in the public school
- 6 playoffs, the nonpublic school playoffs in that classification
- 7 may still be held. Interdistrict playoff brackets for nonpublic
- 8 schools shall be determined by the nonpublic school
- 9 representative on the association's board of directors.
- 10 (2) If a team forfeits two (2) or more regular season games
- 11 in one season, that team shall be ineligible for association
- 12 playoffs.
- 13 (3) The association may determine whether the separate
- 14 interdistrict playoff system is utilized in other sports if
- 15 there are at least fifty (50) public schools and fifty (50)
- 16 nonpublic schools participating in the sport.
- 17 Section 1607-A. Transfer. -- (a) A student shall be
- 18 immediately eligible to participate in interscholastic athletics
- 19 after transferring schools as long as the student meets all
- 20 other eligibility standards, including, but not limited to, age,
- 21 limit of eligibility, per-participation physical exam, grade
- 22 point average and consent and liability release at the school
- 23 which the student attends.
- 24 (b) The association may restrict in-season transfer
- 25 eligibility in a given sport when a transfer occurs after more
- 26 than one-half of the regular season contests have been played,
- 27 but shall allow in-season eligibility in instances where exigent
- 28 circumstances are present, including, but not limited to,
- 29 transfers resulting from change of residence, military-related
- 30 relocations or economic necessity.

- 1 Section 1608-A. District Committees.--(a) For the purposes
- 2 of organization, legislation and administration, the association
- 3 must be divided into athletic districts as established under the
- 4 bylaws of the association.
- 5 (b) Each athletic district shall establish a district
- 6 committee that shall exercise powers and duties as established
- 7 in the bylaws of the association.
- 8 (c) The makeup of each district committee shall be decided
- 9 by the members of that particular athletic district subject to
- 10 the requirements of the bylaws of the association, provided that
- 11 the representation of public and nonpublic schools is
- 12 proportional to the number of public and nonpublic schools in
- 13 the athletic district.
- 14 (d) Neither the association nor district committees may
- 15 sanction or permit the following:
- 16 (1) The formation of a league by members of the association
- 17 in which nonpublic school members are excluded from league
- 18 membership.
- 19 (2) Association members to refuse to schedule regular season
- 20 contests with nonpublic school members.
- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
