James has painted and illustrated some of the most recognized faces in the world using his self-taught watercolor expression from Presidents, Nobel Peace Prize Winners, CEO's and political icons. His works which include landscapes, portraits, seascapes, still lifes and animals have been showcased in museums, galleries, and private collections across the globe, and his story has been told on national television and in the pages of magazines, books and newspapers James' work has won numerous awards and can be seen nationally in books and magazines and on trading cards. James work has been featured in national products including trading cards for Topps, Upper Deck and Kelloggs. James' work and story has been carried on international and national television shows, and in magazines and newspapers. Fresh Perspective: How to Bring Spring Indoors

fter a long winter spent inside, spring beckons. Wide open windows allow fresh air to circulate throughout the house. And the view from those windows showcases an explosion of color, as trees and bushes bloom, winter's grass deepens to delightful shades of green, and yellow daffodils and purple crocuses push up from the earth.

Use Natural Resources





having fun." Albert Einstein's quote embodies the Women's Association for Morristown Medical Center's (WAMMC) 20th Mansion in May Designer Showhouse and Gardens (MIM). Colors, textures, patterns, and unique features engage the senses at this year's MIM estate, Three Fields in Mendham. Barbara Ruane, MIM Co-Chair describes the 9,000 square foot designer showhouse as "a collection of interesting, innovative, eclectic rooms with a distinct look befitting a family home." She says, "It will have a state-of-the-art technology-driven family room, a gentleman's bar complete with a kegerator, and landscaping site plan created by the 2022 winner of the Silver and Gold Trophies at the Philadelphia Flower Show."

reativity is intelligence

Ruane says designers were encouraged to take inspiration from the 94-year-old French manor-style house and pastoral grounds."We encourage designers to use their own creativity rather than adhere to a theme. Each designer can take inspiration from the architecture, the age of the house and the setting while creating a room that is appealing to present day visitors." French doors open to a thick stone walkway, formal gardens, ponds, and a pool. Mary Courtemanche, MIM Co-Chair points out that Three Fields "is located on 36 acres, including 'three fields' that in the past were significant orchards."

Three Fields' long history with Mendham started when it was constructed in 1929. Andrew Fletcher and his wife, the former Elizabeth Dorothea Camp, purchased the home in 1949 and raised their children there. Serving as a Mendham Borough councilman from 1957-1964 and as mayor from 1961-1964 earned Drew Fletcher the nickname "Mr. Mendham."

According to research by author and historian W. Barry Thomson, Fletcher was so passionate about the town's library, he served on its board of trustees and "donated funds to build and maintain a new library wing that was later named in his honor." The connection between Three Fields and the town's library has special

significance to designer Arlene Reilly of Bernards Decorating, Inc. She recalls, "My mother started frequenting the Mendham Library with me from the time I was in a stroller. The library was a part of my life for many years and it is where my siblings and I...developed our love of reading."

The importance of Three Fields to Mendham was sealed when the Fletchers donated the property to the town. Courtemanche explains, "The town then used the proceeds from its sale to fund projects over the next 70 plus years. Now, in 2023, Three Fields is again giving back to the community as the site of this major fundraiser by the Women's Association for Morristown Medical Center. This is why we refer to it as the house that keeps on giving."

Morristown Medical Center's Institute of Bioskills Training and Innovation is this year's beneficiary for the WAMMC's signature fundraiser – monies will go towards expansion and modernization of the facility and program. Ruane says, "At Three Fields, our 20th Mansion in May, visitors will be able to enjoy creative interior spaces, stroll through lovely gardens and outdoor sculptures, and view the works of significant local artists. There are also shopping opportunities in several diverse boutiques and, to complete the day, lunch in our Café while taking in the spectacular view."

The showhouse exterior spaces (including the front, back, gardens, ponds, and pool) are divided into 17 sections. Inside, 31 numbered spaces include the kitchen, rooms, hallways, and stairwells. Imagine cooking in the expanded kitchen *Francois Au Fond-French at Heart*, relaxing by the fireplace in *The Keeping Room*, or dining amongst a beautiful color combination in *Yellow Bird*. A floral canopy in *Sous Les Fleurs*, the sound of birdsong in *The Secret Garden Path*, and coffee to start the day in the Parisian-apartment-style master bedroom

Paradis des Voyageurs - A Traveler's Haven are just some of the notable features. Four designers share their inspiration, aesthetics, and the details which they hope will delight visitors.

"Password Please" speakeasy designed by Debbie Kerr, Certified Kitchen Design and Kitchen Division Manager of Jaeger Kitchens and Bath in Stirling

Debbie Kerr toyed with the idea of doing a bar at Tyvan Hill, the 2020 Mansion in May, but then was chosen to design its kitchen. "In the meantime, I went to a speakeasy in Nashville and loved how sophisticated and intimate it was," she says. "We merged our idea for the bar with that theme," and this year designed a speakeasy Kerr cleverly named Password Please.

A ceiling divided into three sections presented a challenge to Space #3. Kerr's associate Kitchen Designer Pam Fuertes says they created consistency

by installing a dropped grid tin ceiling. The result is a visually pleasing space saturated in color and filled with texture. Kerr "wanted a deep, rich color which would feel sultry and decadent. Flocked damask wallpaper was going to be a key feature and we found a beautiful purple pattern that influenced the rest of our design choices." Kerr comments, "It's a very tactile room, with flocked wallpaper, a penny tile back splash, and a hammered stainless-steel







sink and bar top. Explore the textures."

"A Walk in the Clouds" hallway designed by Arlene Reilly, Owner and Interior Designer of Bernards Decorating, Inc. in Bernardsville

The second-floor hallway, aptly named A Walk in the Clouds, was inspired by Arlene Reilly's initial impression of the bird's eye view from the windows. Reilly wrapped the walls and ceiling

with a F. Schumacher & Co pattern that debuted in the 1970s. "This wide-width, screen-printed cloud pattern has a unique depth which evokes an ethereal, mural-like effect," says Reilly who calls the "sumptuous 'Cloud Toile'" the diva in the room.

Reilly considers Space #19's window alcoves special architectural elements that break up the hall, accentuate the space, and offer a place to add color,

texture, and pattern. She says, "The roman shade fabric from Cowtan & Tout speaks to the treetops just beyond the meadow. Soft and dreamy pillows with this sky-blue and green color scheme embrace the colors of the sky, clouds, and treetops." Reilly, along with her design assistant Tina White, added whimsy in the form of lighting fixtures. "The Talia ceiling fixture in the anteroom, with its varied sized glass balls, evokes visions of clouds."



"La Retraite' de Madame (A Lady's Retreat)" office designed by Karla Trincanello, President and Interior Designer of Interior Decisions, Inc. in Florham Park

Karla Trincanello designed Space #26 as a lady's retreat and named it *La Retraite' de Madame* in honor of the French Country Chateau style of the house. Trincanello visualized the "bright and airy space" as "a home office for the Lady of the home as her private space to do business as well as work on charitable causes." She says the office is intended to be a place where the lady of the home's husband or children feel comfortable to walk in for talk, and "is also meant to be a space that is perfect when...friends visit."

The 12-foot ceiling, fireplace, and large windows are Trincanello's favorite features and, although she loves the sloped walls, they "also created issues for hanging art and decorating." She explains how she turned the tall ceiling and sloped wall into a focal point by "using it effectively with a beautiful soft mint green Thibaut fretwork style wall-covering, with the extra-long drapery for [the] front window in a fabulous coral color floral fabric, also from Thibaut...along with the skirted window seat." Adding to this elegant office, Trincanello points out, "The fireplace wall has a marvelous cast stone mantel... [and] beautiful art above along with the love seat and stunning ormolu antique desk."



"Guest Room with a View" guest room designed by Diane Durocher, Lead Designer Diane Durocher Interiors in Ramsey

Diane Durocher says *Guest Room with a View's* "eclectic textural elements, with a touch of modern sensibility, welcome guests with the expected familiarity of a traditionally designed room yet updated with a fresh youthful infusion." Inspired by the year 1929, when Three Fields was built, the grandeur of the estate, the greens of the rolling hills, and the blues of the ponds and sky, Durocher calls Space #16's theme "Audubon-esque." She highlights the navy floral fabric of the canopy bed and adds, "The coordinating geometric fabrics add texture and interest." Durocher continues, "The guest suite's canopy bed is the focal point of the room. Set upon an Oushak rug and newly stained floors, the bed, which is flanked with transitional nightstands, is anchored by a chenille upholstered sofa and coordinating occasional table. The Sheridan bookcase is refreshed with a navy satin painted finish."

Traditional meet modernity with "time loved pieces that are refinished with a fresh palette," says Durocher. She draws attention to the upcycling and repurposing of the wingback chair and ottoman which are upholstered in a geometric fabric. For the guest bathroom, "The French ambience of the home resulted in the selection of Calacatta gold and black marble basketweave tile on the floor," and "organic sepia floral fabric in the shower curtain and artwork" are nods to the Audubon-esque theme.

- Mud Clay Studio in Madison and Boonton offers formal classes as well as "claydates."







Batch Cocktails to Entertain with Ease

Punxsutawney Phil predicted six more weeks of winter, but crocuses, snowdrops, and daffodils emerged anyway. Early signs of spring are the signal to start planning seasonal celebrations such as bridal showers, religious holiday get togethers, end-of-school-year festivities, and graduation parties. Whatever the occasion, advance planning makes hosting a—spring-breeze.

Menus aren't the only thing hosts need to organize ahead of time. Think drinks! "Batching cocktails" means mixing large quantities of shelf-stable ingredients and storing them before the event.

Keep in mind that just multiplying ingredients from a single-serve recipe doesn't work. When a drink is served, ice is usually involved. The ice melts and the resulting water is an ingredient that must be accounted for. How much water to add to batched cocktails depends on the type of drink and personal preferences. Weigh a single serve cocktail before and after dilution to calculate the amount of water needed. Alternatively, serve batched drinks with ice shaken, stirred, or poured over. *Cheers!*

Lavender Lemon Bourbon Slushie Cocktail

This refreshing cocktail was converted from a single serving to a batch by increasing ounces to cups.

INGREDIENTS

- 8 cups lemonade
- 2 cups bourbon
- 1 cup limoncello
- 1 ¼ cups lavender simple syrup
- 16 dashes lavender or hummingbird bitters
- Optional (if you like your cocktails tart) ½ cup lemon juice
- Garnish: lavender sprig and lemon rose



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Add lemonade, bourbon, limoncello, lavender syrup, bitters, and the optional lemon juice to a freezer-safe, sealable container. (A large shallow pan, like a cake pan, will allow the batched cocktail to freeze much faster.)
- 2. Lay flat in the freezer overnight. About 20 minutes before serving, set the pan on the counter to defrost slightly. Fluff/stir the frozen cocktail with a spoon or fork to get a slushie texture.
- 3. Scoop into chilled glasses and serve with a straw and/or spoon. Garnish with lavender sprig and lemon rose.

Yield: Approx.15-20 six to eight oz. servings.

This delicious and refreshing cocktail becomes a mocktail when the bourbon is left out.

INGREDIENTS

- 6 cups prepared unsweetened tea
 - 4 cups bottled lemonade
- 2 ¼ cups (18 oz.) bourbon (optional)
 - 2/3 cup simple syrup
 - 3 medium lemons, thinly sliced (about 24 slices)
 - 12 mint sprigs, for garnish

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Stir together tea, lemonade, bourbon, and simple syrup in a large bowl or pitcher.

 Add lemon slices.
- 2. Refrigerate until chilled, at least 2 hours or up to 24.
- 3. Serve over ice, and garnish with mint sprigs and lemon slices.

Yield: 13 cups

Tips for Batching Cocktails

- Store in a pitcher, bowl, mason jar, or empty liquor bottle that's big enough to hold the whole batch.
- Avoid spilling too much of one ingredient into the mixture by not measuring liquids over the container.
- Label which ingredients are already mixed and note which ones need to be added later.
- · Make extra ice.
- Preserve bubbles by adding fizzy ingredients like sparkling wine, beer, or soda just before serving.



- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 12 oz. unsweetened tart-cherry juice
- 24 oz. seltzer, chilled

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Mix cherries and orange slices with sugar in a large pitcher. Add orange and cherry juices, cover, and refrigerate, for at least 1 hour (up to 12 hours). Stir once while chilling.
- 2. To serve in a pitcher: fill pitcher halfway with ice, add seltzer.
- 3. To serve in glasses over ice: garnish each glass with cherries and orange slices. Pour fruit-juice mixture into glasses, top with seltzer (add rum or tequila, if desired).

Yield: 6-8 servings servings.


