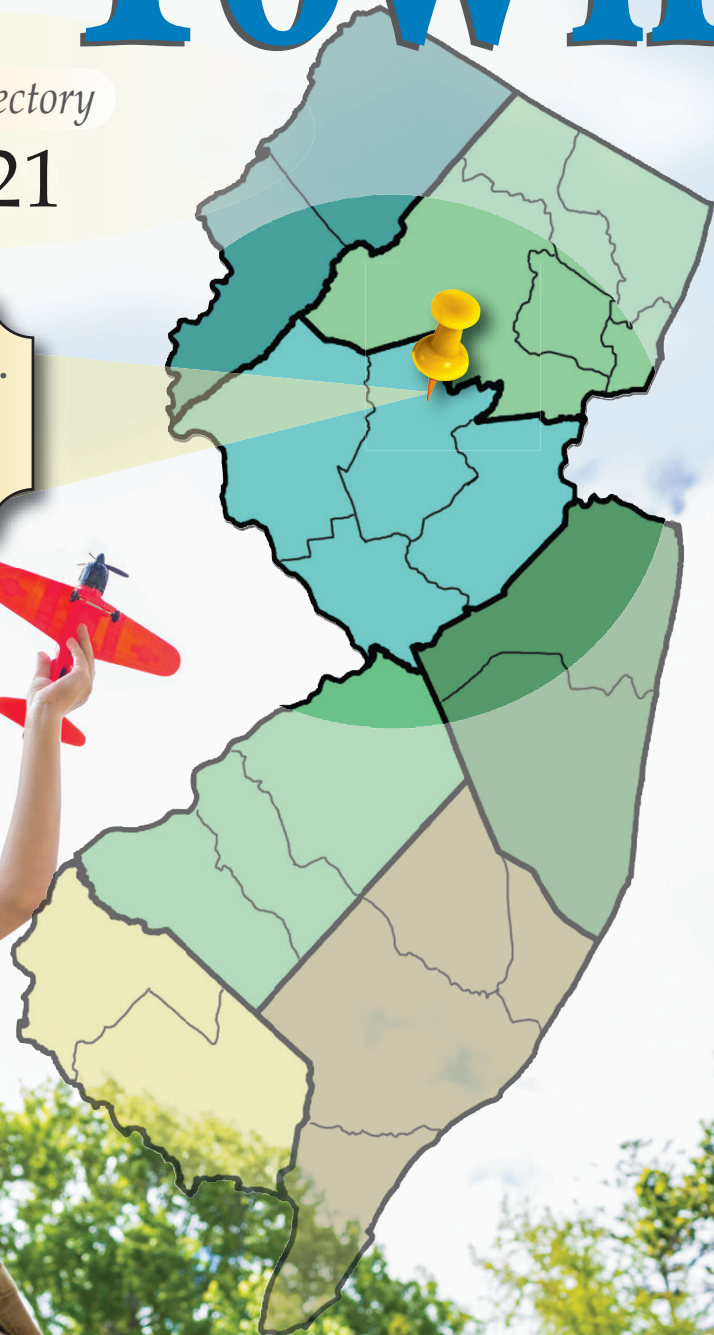

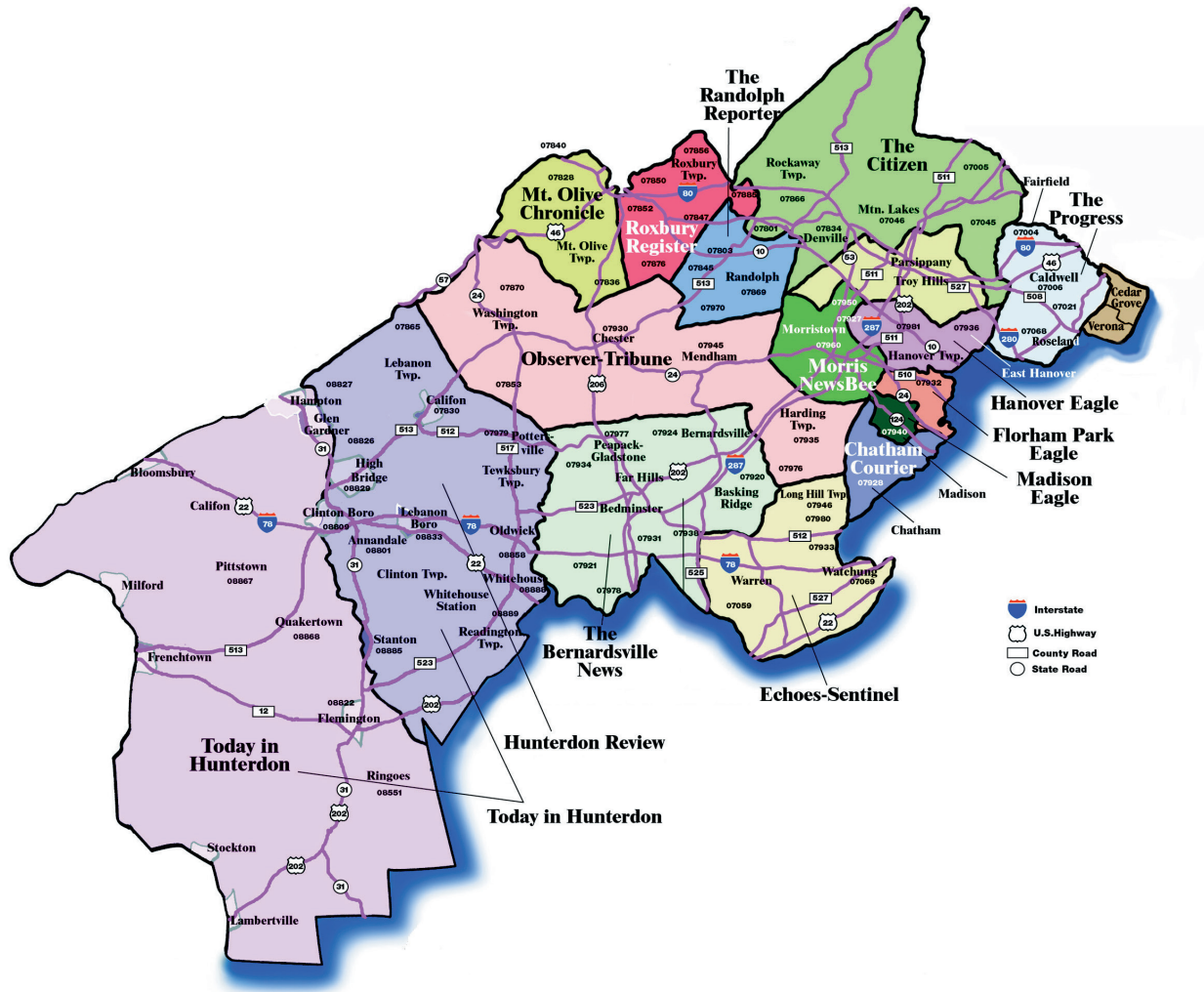

Morris County: A Rich History

Centrally located in the Highlands region in northern New Jersey, Morris County blends natural landscapes, a history spanning the Colonial era through the technological breakthroughs of the 20th and 21st Centuries, with charming communities and impressive corporate campuses.

Situated about 30 miles from New York City, Forbes Magazine described Morris County as "... a suburb of the New York area which reaps the benefits of the big city's financial industry." Forbes also rated Morris as one of the top 10 wealthiest counties in the country. Between 2015 and 2019, Money Magazine has selected several communities in Morris County as being among "The Best Places to Live."

U.S. News and World Report in 2019 named Morris County as one of the top 30 counties in the nation. And Morris County was ranked as the healthiest county in N.J. in 2019 by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

Morris County was incorporated on March 15, 1738/1739, from portions of Hunterdon County. The inconsistency in the year relates to the Old Style (OS) and New Style (NS) calendars being used during the colonial period. Morris County was named in honor of the first Governor of the Province of New Jersey, Lewis Morris (1671-1746).

Within its 469 square miles of land area, the county contains 39 municipalities with a 2014 population from the U.S. Census Bureau estimated to be 499,727, making it New Jersey's 10th most populous county. At its most distant points, the county stretches 30 miles from east to west and 30 miles from north to south.

Roads, bus and rail service link the 39 municipalities in the county to the metropolitan region. Two public airports, the Morristown Municipal Airport and the Lincoln Park Airport, are located in Morris County.

There are also an additional 12 FAA certified private corporate heliports and airports, one military heliport at Picatinny Arsenal and one medical helipad at Morristown Medical Center in Morristown. Three major airports, Newark Liberty International, John F. Kennedy and LaGuardia International Airport, are accessible by highway, train, and bus lines.

The area's civilian work force exceeds 263,000 as of 2014. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the percentage of the adult population possessing a college degree is estimated to be 51 percent.

The county is home to more than 50 For-

tune 500 companies, several with their corporate headquarters located within the county's border.

Morris County is rich in history and home to more than 150 historic sites listed on New Jersey's Register of Historic Places, with most also being included on the National Register of Historic Places. Four of these sites – Morristown National Historical Park, Historic Speedwell, Stickley Museum at Craftsman Farms, and Villa Fontana, home of Thomas Nast – have been designated as National Historic Landmarks by the Secretary of the Interior.

Strategic Location

During the Revolutionary War, Morristown's strategic location between New York City and Philadelphia prompted General George Washington and the Continental Army to make their winter encampments in Morristown in 1776-1777 and 1779-1780. Washington used Colonel Jacob Ford Jr.'s mansion as his headquarters during this time. The mansion is the centerpiece of the Morristown National Historical Park, the first national historical park in the country.

It also was in Morris County, at what is now Historic Speedwell in Morristown, where Alfred Vail and Samuel F.B. Morse perfected and first publicly demonstrated the electro-magnetic telegraph in 1838. Vail's distant cousin, Theodore Vail was educated in Morristown and served as the first president of the American Telephone & Telegraph Company (AT&T).

Noted statewide for its recreational facilities and preservation of natural landscape, the Morris County Park System (www.morrisparks.net) is the largest county park system in New Jersey based on acreage.

The park system attracts about 3.5 million visitors annually, encompass more than 18,800 acres, 150 trail miles and 38 recreational, historical, horticultural and environmental facilities. These include the Patriots Path hiking trail network, which includes accommodation for the seeing impaired; active and passive recreation fields, four award-winning golf courses, picnic sites, gardens, camping, cross-country skiing, and lakes. Some notable locations in the county park system include, Fosterfields Living History Farm, the Frelinguysen and Willowood Arboretums, Mennen Sports Arena, Central Park of Morris County, Historic Speedwell Village, and Lee's County Park Marina on Lake Hopatcong.

Education

Education in Morris County commands a leading role, with outstanding public and private elementary, secondary and higher educational facilities. The Morris County School of Technology in Denville offers high school students and adult learner's vocational education and training. The School of Technology offers both shared and full-time programs for the county's high school students and continuing education programs for adults.

Fairleigh Dickinson University's Florham Campus in Madison, the College of St. Elizabeth in Morris Township and Drew University in Madison, and the two-year County College of Morris (CCM) in Randolph, provide easy access to higher education.

County College of Morris offers more than 25 Associate Degree and certificate programs in 16 different fields with affordable tuition. Popular programs include Liberal Arts and Sciences, Communications, Cyber Security, Humanities, Business, Management, Marketing and Related Support Services, and Health Professions and Related Programs.

While the seven-member Board of Chosen Freeholders oversee and approve activities relating to the business of running the county, such as county budget, road construction and repairs, appointments to the various county commissions and agencies, and other miscellaneous county issues, the county administrator supervises day-to-day operations of the many departments of county government.

Warren Twp. and Watchung Borough are located in eastern Somerset County. The county encompasses 305 square miles, has 21 municipalities, is located at the hub of central New Jersey, and is one of only two “land-locked” counties in the state (Morris County is the other). Other municipalities that make up the county are Bedminster Twp., Bernards Twp., Bernardsville, Bound Brook, Branchburg, Bridgewater, Far Hills, Franklin, Green Brook, Hillsborough, Manville, Millstone, Montgomery, North Plainfield, Peapack-Gladstone, Raritan, Rocky Hill, Somerville and South Bound Brook.

The county contains a wide diversity of landscape, population and development that reflects the varied lifestyles of its estimated 335,432 residents occupying some 125,000 households. Somerset County values its diversity and excels at “Making Vibrant Connections” by establishing successful partnerships with residents, businesses, local governments and affiliated county agencies to promote innovative public service for the benefit of the entire community.

According to the 2000 Census, Somerset County was the fastest-growing county in New Jersey from 1990 to 2000, with a population growth rate of 23.8 percent. Seniors, 65 and over, now account for more than 14 percent of the population, although that number is expected to increase dramatically as the baby boomer generation continues to age.

The Somerset County Board of Freeholders, the Somerset County Office on Aging & Disability Services and the Visiting Nurse Association of Somerset Hills have a unique partnership project that is serving seniors in the Somerset Hills area. A modern complex off Mount Airy Road in Bernards Township is home to both the county-operated Senior Wellness Center and the VNA headquarters. As one of America’s oldest counties, Somerset is steeped in Colonial and Revolutionary War history. The county was established by charter on May 22, 1688, with land conveyances dating to 1651. Historic sites, monuments and buildings are found in virtually every town, preserved for future generations.

The county’s 14,701 acres of parkland include golf courses, picnic areas, hiking and bicycling trails, stables, a swimming pool, an Environmental Education Center, the Natirar property in the Somerset Hills and the County Fairgrounds, which hosts the Somerset County 4-H Fair each year.

In addition to parkland, another 3,253 greenway acres are preserved through county and municipal open space partnerships, as well as almost 8,900 acres of farmland.

TD Bank Ballpark in Bridgewater, which draws visitors for ballgames and its proximity to shopping and restaurants, is an example of how the county came up with a creative solution to an under-used property – the site is the redevelopment of a brownfield site (the former American Cyanamid property).

The county’s educational facilities – Raritan Valley Community College and the Somerset County Vocational and Technical Schools – are among the finest in the state. The college, a two-year school in Branchburg Township, includes a library/theater complex and a planetarium.

New Jersey is the only state where elected county officials are called freeholders (most other states elect a county commission or county council). The term “freeholder” is a

carryover term from Colonial days when only property owners, then known as freeholders, could be elected to office.

Originally one freeholder represented each municipality, but as counties grew, this became too unwieldy. Today Somerset has five freeholders elected at-large for staggered three-year terms representing the county in its entirety, and each freeholder chairs a standing committee related to human services, finance and administration, public works or public health and safety.

The position of freeholder is part-time, but there is a full-time county administrator who attends to the day-to-day operations of county government. Many boards, commissions and advisory groups also assist the freeholders in prioritizing and making decisions on various issues.

A sampling of the services offered by the Somerset County freeholders includes a convenient curbside recycling program, a leadership program for those interested in a community engagement, and a county-wide, renewable energy program that has brought solar energy to towns and school districts.

Somerset County, among the wealthiest in the nation, is one of about 100 counties (less than 2 percent), out of more than 3,000 nationwide, to hold a triple-A bond rating, which ensures it can borrow money at the best possible rates when needed for major projects.

Somerset County is consistently recognized for its quality of life. In 2018, it was ranked as the best county for families in New Jersey (Niche.com), the best county to live in the state (Niche.com) and the 3rd healthiest in New Jersey (Robert Wood Johnson Foundation).

LONG HILL TOWNSHIP

Long Hill Township, celebrated its 150th anniversary in 2016, is located in the southernmost tip of Morris County, between the Great Swamp National Wildlife Refuge and the Passaic River. The township was incorporated in 1866 as Passaic Township, and it kept that name until 1992, when voters decided to change the name to Long Hill.

Long Hill's 12.14 square miles are comprised of four distinct villages, each with a unique character. In fact, township residents are much more likely to identify themselves as being from Gillette, Meyersville, Millington or Stirling, and most take intense pride in the distinguishing characteristics of their community.

Gillette is primarily residential, with one major commercial district along Valley Road. The presence of several large national chains makes the Valley Road corridor a one-stop shopping destination for residents and visitors alike.

Meyersville is the most secluded of Long Hill's sections and closest to the Great Swamp. Residents love its private, rural character, as well as its famous restaurants, antique shops, and unique traffic pattern, at the Meyersville circle. The circle is the site of the annual Christmas Tree Lighting and fireworks the first Sunday night in December.

Millington is almost entirely residential, with a train station, post office, and firehouse clustered along the west end of Long Hill Road. Two notable historic buildings also pre-empt over this stretch of road: The Millington Train Station, which was constructed in 1901, is on the National Register of Historic Places, described as a "...one-story, rock-faced ashlar station with Richardsonian elements..."

The second notable building is the town's 19th century one-room schoolhouse. Construction and renovation on the schoolhouse is nearly completed and the township plans to use the space for community organizations and activities.

The school also served as library, and po-

lice headquarters and finally town hall until the new municipal building complex was constructed on Valley Road in Gillette in the early 2000s.

Stirling shares the Valley Road commercial district with Gillette, but is better known for its historic walking downtown along Main Avenue. The street is lined with shops, restaurants, residences and trees in abundance. Improvements to Main Avenue were completed in 2007. The Stirling Revitalization Project accentuated the downtown area's historic flair with decorative benches, new trees and attractive lighting.

The project was funded by a 2002 grant from the N.J. Department of Transportation.

Long Hill's school district includes Gillette School, for kindergarten and first grade pupils, Millington School, for grades 2 to 5, and Central Middle School in Stirling, for grades 6 to 8. High school students from Long Hill attend Watchung Hills Regional High School in Warren.

Long Hill is governed by a five-member Township Committee. Members are elected to three-year terms, in a staggered three-year election cycle. They elect one of themselves to serve as mayor for the year.

WARREN TOWNSHIP

Warren Township was incorporated in 1806.

At the time of its incorporation, Warren was nearly twice its current size in square miles and included what are now Watchung, North Plainfield and Green Brook.

Originally settled by the Lenni Lenape, and later by an influx of European farmers, the area's population slowly increased throughout the 18th century until, in 1806, the new township formed from parts of Bernards Township and Bridgewater.



The township was named after Gen. Joseph Warren, a hero of the Battle of Bunker Hill in the Revolutionary War.

Warren celebrates its history through several meticulously maintained historic sites, including the Mount Bethel Meeting House, the Codington Farm House and the Kirch-Ford House, which date from the 18th century. The Kirch-Ford House serves as a living museum, with tours held during town and historical society events.

A beehive oven and a secret room thought to have been part of the Underground Railroad or a hiding place for a Revolutionary War soldiers are two of the site's prime attractions.

Today, Warren's 19.64 square miles hold a unique blend of private, secluded residences, rural farms, and busy commerce.

Within minutes of interstates 78, 287 and Route 22, Warren is a haven for commuters, shoppers and residents who enjoy its private, rural character and the scenery of the surrounding Watchung Mountains.

ry for Warren to have quiet, bucolic residences and bustling shopping centers, the township's Master Plan enforces just that by limiting commercial development to a few highly concentrated areas along major roads.

The town center, at the crossroads of Mount Bethel Avenue and Mountain Boulevard, is the town's busiest commercial area with major shopping centers on each of the four corners.

The township re-examines the Master Plan always in an effort to continue preserving Warren's rural character while encouraging growth and development.

Children in the Warren Township school district attend one of four elementary schools from kindergarten through fifth grade.

Grades 6 to 8 attend Warren Middle

School and high school students attend Watchung Hills Regional High School on Stirling Road.

Preserving wilderness and open space is an important goal for both the residents and the township, and Warren has hundreds of acres of open space offering opportunities for hiking, walking, running, and biking on several recreational trails.

Voters elect five Township Committee members to three-year terms on a three-year cycle, with two elected in each of the first and second years, and the fifth member elected in the third year.

Members annually select a mayor and deputy mayor from among themselves. The committee meets at in the municipal building complex on Mountain Boulevard.

WATCHUNG BOROUGH

The Borough of Watchung covers 6 square miles, and has a population of nearly 6,000. Its rolling hills, secluded streets, large properties and scenic views, including some surprising views of the New York skyline (more than 20 miles away), have attracted affluent residents, and homes in Watchung include many expansive estates and large, luxurious houses. The borough is convenient to several commuting roads, including Interstate 78 and Route 22.

Watchung also has a rich history. In the summer of 1670, as the local legend goes, a group of Dutch explorers guided by a Native American princess made camp for the night in what is now the center of the borough. During the night, one of the Dutch sentries saw movement, and shot. The intruder was a scout for the Watchung (meaning “high place” or “on the hill”) tribe of the Lenni Lenape, who were making their yearly journey to the sea to fish and gather shells.

The scout’s death sparked hostilities between the tribe and the Dutch, resulting in the capture of the Dutch leader. The leader’s fate looked grim, until the chief of the Watchung tribe was moved by the princess’s words and spared the explorer’s life. Later, the Dutch were guests at the wedding ceremony of the princess and the Watchung chief. The area where the two groups camped was incorporated as Watchung Borough in 1926, after the Post Office objected to the previous name of the area, Washingtonville, on the grounds that there were an excessive number of towns in New Jersey named after Washington.

The trail that both the Watchung tribe and the Dutch explorers were following is now Somerset Street, which runs through the center of Watchung Borough and connects I-78 and Route 22.

Somerset Street begins at Triangle Park. Kept trim by public works and the Traffic and Beautification Committee, the park displays an Armored Personnel Vehicle that was authentically restored several years ago

as an Eagle Scout project. Somerset Street has been developed into a “gateway” boulevard into the borough, with grassy, tree-lined center dividers, and sidewalks. It passes the new police headquarters and court building, the new public works garage, and ends at the Watchung Circle.

Two picturesque lakes provide Watchung with a bucolic village center. Surrounding Watchung Lake is a sidewalk that hundreds of residents use daily to walk, run and bike. Along the sidewalk is a plaque memorializing one of Watchung’s famous sons, baseball legend Bobby Thomson, whom everyone in Watchung knew as an active community volunteer. At the Watchung Circle end of Watchung Lake is the Village Green, used for the annual 9/11 Memorial Ceremony, Christmas Tree lighting ceremony and fireworks, and by wedding parties throughout the year in the Village gazebo.

At the other end is Mobus Field, with a

playground, tennis courts, and playing field. It is used as the finish line for 5K races/walks and an annual triathlon. Texier House is in the Watchung Circle which is about to be developed into a repository of historical artifacts.

Watchung children attend Bayberry School from kindergarten through fourth grade, then move to Valley View Middle School for grades five to eight. High-schoolers join students from Long Hill, Warren, and Green Brook at Watchung Hills Regional High School in Warren.

The Watchung Borough Council consists of six voter-elected members, each serving a three-year term. They elect one of themselves to serve as council president for the year. Voters elect the mayor separately to a four-year term. Mayor and council meet at 7:30 p.m. the first and third Thursdays of each month, except July and August, at the Municipal Building.
