## Madison Rotary's Christmas Tree Sale Returns

**MADISON** – The Madison Rotary's Christmas tree sale returns once again this year, with early bird sales from noon to 5 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 29 and 30.

Arriving after Thanksgiving will be an assortment of Fraser, Balsam and Douglas Fir trees, together with wreaths, rope greenery, with tree stands and other accessories also offered. Pricing will vary by tree species and size.

As in recent years the tree lot will be at Dodge Field on Central Avenue. The lot will be fully open for business from Dec. 1 through Dec. 20, or until trees sell out. Regular hours will be: 4 to 8 p.m. Monday through Friday, 9:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday and 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday.

Rotarian and Mayor Bob Conley, who organizes the sale each year, pointed out that the sale benefits both the customers – who will get great decorations – and community organizations supported by Rotary.

"Rotary's core mission is to make our community a better place," Conley said.

"We do that in part by providing direct financial support to local organizations that serve those in need in Madison and neighboring communities. The tree sale provides Rotary with funds that are used to support dozens of local service groups, so, our customers can know that when they buy a tree from Rotary, they are helping us support the many groups that are helping those in in need."

"It's a tradition that captures the heart of our community and we are excited for everyone to experience the joy, lights and memories that make the holidays in Morristown truly unforgettable."





Back by popular demand, NJFO's festive holiday celebration features three award-winning tenors, John Kun Park, Luke Norvell, and Michael Deshield, in a symphonic spectacular of seasonal favorites, beloved arias, and timeless holiday classics. Adding to the merriment, the Central Avenue Choir of Madison joins NJFO for a community celebration that brings the magic of the season to life.

"We cannot wait to celebrate this special time of year," said Maestro Wroe. "Each of these phenomenal tenors brings remarkable artistry, charisma, and vocal power, together they create an unforgettable experience for audiences of all ages."

Tenor Michael Deshield, a recent winner of the Indiana District Metropolitan Opera Laffont Competition, brings a rich and expressive tone to the stage. 
