



Morris County: A Rich History

Centrally located in the Highlands region in northern New Jersey, Morris County blends natural landscapes, a history spanning the Colonial era though the technolological breakthroughs of the 20th and 21st Centuries, with charming communities and impressive corporate campuses.

Situated about 30 miles from New York City, Forbes Magazine described Morris County as "... a suburb of the New York area which reaps the benefits of the big city's financial industry." Forbes also rated Morris as one of the top 10 wealthiest counties in the country. Between 2015 and 2019, Money Magazine has selected several communities in Morris County as being among 'The Best Places to Live.'

U.S. News and World Report in 2019 named Morris County as one of the top 30 counties in the nation. And Morris County was ranked as the healthiest county in N.J. in 2019 by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

Morris County was incorporated on March 15, 1738/1739, from portions of Hunterdon County. The inconsistency in the year relates to the Old Style (OS) and New Style (NS) calendars being used during the colonial period. Morris County was named in honor of the first Governor of the Province of New Jersey, Lewis Morris (1671-1746).

Within its 469 square miles of land area, the county contains 39 municipalities with a 2014 population from the U.S. Census Bureau estimated to be 499,727, making it New Jersey's 10th most populous county. At its most distant points, the county stretches 30 miles from east to west and 30 miles from north to south.

Roads, bus and rail service link the 39 municipalities in the county to the metropolitan region. Two public airports, the Morristown Municipal Airport and the Lincoln Park Airport, are located in Morris County.

There are also an additional 12 FAA certified private corporate heliports and airports, one military heliport at Picatinny Arsenal and one medical helipad at Morristown Medical Center in Morristown. Three major airports, Newark Liberty International, John F. Kennedy and LaGuardia International Airport, are accessible by highway, train, and bus lines.

The area's civilian work force exceeds 263,000 as of 2014. The U.S. Census American Community Survey for 2020 shows total adult population in Morris County with a bachelor's degree or higher is 56.5 percent.

their headquarters or major operations in Morris County.

Morris County is rich in history and home to more than 150 historic sites listed on New Jersey's Register of Historic Places, with most also being included on the National Register of Historic Places. Four of these sites – Morristown National Historical Park, Historic Speedwell, Stickley Museum at Craftsman Farms, and Villa Fontana, home of Thomas Nast – have been designated as National Historic Landmarks by the Secretary of the Interior.

Strategic Location

During the Revolutionary War, Morristown's strategic location between New York City and Philadelphia prompted General George Washington and the Continental Army to make their winter encampments in Morristown in 1776-1777 and 1779-1780. Washington used Colonel Jacob Ford Jr.'s mansion as his headquarters during this time. The mansion is the centerpiece of the Morristown National Historical Park, the first national historical park in the country.

It also was in Morris County, at what is now Historic Speedwell in Morristown, where Alfred Vail and Samuel F.B. Morse perfected and first publicly demonstrated the electro-magnetic telegraph in 1838. Vail's distant cousin, Theodore Vail was educated in Morristown and served as the first president of the American Telephone & Telegraph Company (AT&T).

Noted statewide for its recreational facilities and preservation of natural landscape, the Morris County Park System (www. morrisparks.net) is the largest county park system in New Jersey based on acreage.

The park system attracts about 3.5 mil-

lion visitors annually, and holds and supervises 20,383-acres of parkland, 150 trail miles and 38 recreational, historical, horticultural and environmental facilities. These include the Patriots Path hiking trail network, which includes accomodation for the seeing impaired; active and passive recreation fields, four award-winning golf courses, picnic sites, gardens, camping, cross-country skiing, and lakes. Some notable locations in the county park system include. Fosterfields Living History Farm, the Frelinguysen and Willowood Arboretums, Mennen Sports Arena, Central Park of Morris County, Historic Speedwell Village, and Lee's County Park Marina on Lake Hopatcong.

Education

Education in Morris County commands a leading role, with outstanding public and private elementary, secondary and higher educational facilities. The Morris County School of Technology in Denville offers high school students and adult learner's vocational education and training. The School of Technology offers both shared and full-time programs for the county's high school students and continuing education programs for adults.

Fairleigh Dickinson University's Florham Campus in Madison, the College of St. Elizabeth in Morris Township and Drew University in Madison, and the two-year County College of Morris (CCM) in Randolph, provide easy access to higher education

County College of Morris offers more than 45 Associate Degree programs and over 25 certificate programs covering nearly 80 areas of study. with affordable tuition. Popular programs include Liberal Arts and Sciences, Communications, Cyber Security, Humanities, Business, Management, Marketing and Related Support Services, and Health Professions and Related Programs.

While the seven-member Board of County Commissioners oversee and approve activities relating to the business of running the county, such as county budget, road construction and repairs, appointments to the various county commissions and agencies, and other miscellaneous county issues, the county administrator supervises day-to-day operations of the many departments of county government.

EAST HANOVER TOWNSHIP

East Hanover was incorporated in 1928 when the population of the then-larger Hanover (which originally included Morris County and parts of Sussex and Warren County) became too cumbersome to be managed as a single municipality.

Since that time, the town has grown from its original 900 residents to a population of slightly more than 11,000 people. Ironically, East Hanover still has a neighborhood called Hanover, which understandably often is confused with its namesake municipality next door.

East Hanover is physically defined by the joining of two rivers, the Whippany to the west and north and the Passaic to the east and south. The geographic configuration created by the two waterways led to the area's being called "Hanover Neck" in times past.

The residents of this 8.3-square-mile town are passionate about their community and since June 2004 have shipped three tons of non-military issue supplies and other items to active American servicemen who are friends and relatives of East Hanover residents.

Largely developed, the town has a wide mix of mom-and-pop shops, many of which are located along Ridgedale Avenue, while many major retailers can be found on Route 10, one of the major shopping thoroughfares in the area.

Two major corporations, Nabisco and Novartis, have significant presences in town. In addition, there are 2,100 other enterprises operating in industrial parks, contemporary office complexes and retail stores within East Hanover's borders.

Despite all this commercial development, East Hanover maintains its neighborly ways. The town is surrounded by a number of other communities: Parsippany, Troy Hills, Florham Park, Hanover Township (Whippany), Roseland, Livingston and Montville. Commuters are fortunate to have easy access to routes 10 and 280 from Eagle Rock Avenue.

Mount Pleasant Avenue, on the other hand, contains a historical district that has been placed in the Congressional Record, and the First Presbyterian Church and its adjoining graveyard date back to the Revolutionary War. Local government consists of a mayor and four-member council, all elected by voters. The mayor is chief executive officer of the township and presides over meetings held at 7 p.m. the first Tuesday of each month at the Township Hall on Ridgedale Avenue.

East Hanover is in the 27th state legislative district.

The East Hanover Board of Education manages three schools: the Frank J. Smith School (preK-2), Central School (grades 3-5) and the Middle School (grades 6-8). Secondary school students attend Hanover Park Regional High School.





HANOVER TOWNSHIP

The township of Hanover was named Dec. 7, 1720 as a gesture of respect to King George I of the House of Hannover, a British king who ruled over the American Colonies during the 18th century.

Originally encompassing Morris County as well as parts of Sussex and Warren counties, the area contained four communities with the familiar names of Hanover, Pequannock, Morris and Roxbury.

As its population grew during the 19th and 20th centuries, however, the township's size became too difficult to manage by a single local government and it systematically was carved into smaller municipalities.

The modern-day Hanover stretches across 10.8 square miles, is home to 13,712 residents according to the 2010 Census, and represents an ideal suburban tapestry of residential neighborhoods, parkland, commercial, and industrial properties.

While some of the village names such as Monroe and Malaparadis have disappeared over time, the Hanover of today has been recognized as one of the "most liveable" suburbs in recent surveys.

Confusing as it may seem, Hanover Township itself has no formal official mailing address, but is comprised of two ZIP code neighborhoods separated by Interstate 287 that have their own post offices and fire departments – Whippany and Cedar Knolls.

This arrangement has become so ingrained, most residents refer to their hometown by the neighborhood names of Whippany and Cedar Knolls rather than Hanover Township.

Whippany is a village in Hanover; according to the Landmark Commission it was named by native Americans who called it "Whippanong." It means "place where arrow wood grows," or more specifically, "meadows where cattail canes grow." Cedar Knolls is the name of a 1913 subdivision of summer bungalows; it has since expanded and evolved into a flourishing residential

Located just north of Morristown and adjacent to the regional Morristown Municipal Airport, Hanover Township boasts many public attractions such as the Whippany Railway Museum, Morris County Library and Patriot's Path, a 26-mile-long wilderness walkway and bike trail.

Residents have available more than 593 acres of public park land speckled about town that offer ball fields, tennis courts, a swimming pool, walking/bicycle paths, open space, and other recreational facilities.

Convenient to the metropolitan area and a network of major highways, the community borders the townships of Morris, Parsippany-Troy Hills, East Hanover, and the boroughs of Morris Plains and Florham Park.

The local form of government consists of a five-member Township Committee. Voters

elect the members to terms of three years. The group selects a mayor and deputy mayor from among themselves at the annual reorganization meeting.

The committee meets in executive session at 7 p.m. for legal and conference work sessions the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of each month and at 8 p.m. for public meetings the 2nd Thursday of each month. Check with the Township website for changes to times and meeting format that may be in place based on the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions imposed for public safety and for changes during the summer season.

School students attend Bee Meadow School, Memorial Junior School, Mountview Road School and Salem Drive School. High school students attend Whippany Park High School, part of the Hanover Park Regional High School District.

MORRIS PLAINS

Billed as the "Community of Caring," the borough of Morris Plains is just 2.6 square miles and is the home to about 5,600 people. Originally part of the larger Hanover Township, Morris Plains split off in 1926.

It has earned a reputation over the years as a solid bedroom community where families stay for generations.

The town flourished after the introduction of the Morris and Essex Railroad in the mid-1800s, bringing considerable residential and commercial development.

The railroad continues to play a prominent role in town even today as many commuters are attracted to Morris Plains for its easy access to Penn Station, New York City and Hoboken Terminal.

Local retail and commercial development along Speedwell Avenue also still emanates from the busy train station.

Morris Plains schools educate children from kindergarten through eighth grade and then send grades nine through 12 to Morristown High School as part of sending/receiving relationship with the Morris School District, which also serves the communities of Morristown and Morris Township.

Morris Plains operates under the borough form of government with a vot-





MORRIS TOWNSHIP

Known as the doughnut that surrounds the city of Morristown on all sides with more than five times the area of the city, Morris Township contains a little more than 15 square miles and 22,000 residents. Although the two municipalities officially split in 1865, it took 30 years for the township to raise enough tax revenue to start its own fire and police department during which time it continued to rely on the city for services.

Morris Township has made great efforts to minimize large development and control sprawling urbanization from Morristown by purchasing open space. The township shares two large parklands with neighboring Harding and Mendham townships – Lewis Morris County Park (a favorite swimming, boating and fishing site), and Morristown National Historical Park (commonly referred to as Jockey Hollow).

In addition, residents have a number of other recreational facilities right in their own back yard: The Morris Museum with quality permanent collections and traveling exhibitions on many aspects of art, science and history, as well as live performance in its Bickford Theater: Fosterfields Living Historical Farm which has been a working farm since 1760 now operated by the Morris County Park System complete with employees in Revolutionary era dress: Loantaka Brook Reservation, a 570-acre park with more than five miles of trails. some of which are paved for biking enthusiasts: Seaton Hackney Stables, a 23-stall facility that is the midst of an extensive renovation; Patriot's Path, 20-plus miles of continuous path open to hikers, bikers and horseback riders; and Mennan Sports Area, a major ice skating and hockey facility that also sponsors traveling acts like the Shriners Circus.

Morris Township is also home to the famous Seeing Eye facility that trains guide dogs for the blind that often can be seen do-

ing so on the streets of Morristown and surrounding residential neighborhoods. There are two private country clubs in the township, Spring Brook Country Club and Morris County Golf Club, as well as several top-rate private schools – Delbarton School for boys, the coed Morristown-Beard School, Villa Walsh Academy for girls, and the Academy of St. Elizabeth, also for girls, located on the sprawling campus of the College of St. Elizabeth in the Convent Station section of the township. Pre-dating the college, it is the oldest school of its type in the state of New Jersey.

Morris Township is an area that is rich in historical significance and best known as the place Gen. George Washington's Continental Army camped during the winters of 1777 and 1779-80 in the deep snows of Jockey Hollow, which is now part of the national park system.

The Morris School District serves

4,700 students for the communities in Morristown and Morris Township for grades kindergarten through 12 and Morris Plains for grades nine through 12.

Morris Township is governed by a voter-elected Township Committee whose five members serve three-year terms on a staggered basis. At the annual reorganization meeting, they select one of themselves to serve as mayor and another to serve as deputy mayor.

MORRISTOWN

Today, historical Morristown still is making history. Within its borders of less than three square miles is the county seat for one of the wealthiest counties in America.

The city itself boasts a diverse population, wide selection of restaurants and boutiques, rich history recognized nationally and active calendar of events. Not only recognized as a center for financial and legal professions, it is home to Morristown Memorial Hospital, a first-class medical center and the Mayo Center for the Performing Arts at the Community Theater on South Street.

Downtown is centered around the historic Green, which had served as an animal pasture and militia training ground, but now is surrounded by top-quality retailers and office space.

The Vail Mansion, one of the few remaining estates left on what was once known as


Millionaire's Row, has been converted to luxury condominiums.




