

Bottle Hill Day has it all

MADISON – This year marks the 50th anniversary of Bottle Hill Day.

This event has continued to grow every year since it was first established in 1974 by Mayor Elizabeth Baumgartner to promote the business district. It is named for Madison's original establishment in 1715 as the village of "Bottle Hill."

In addition, as in years past, the Madison Area Chamber of Commerce and Madison Patrolmen's Benevolent Association (PBA) Local 92 will host its 30th annual Madison Car Show at 9 a.m. at the Madison Volunteer Ambulance Corps., 29 Prospect St.

Over the years, it has grown, evolving into a family, entertainment, and community celebration, which draws between 10,000 and 20,000 people to the heart of Madison every fall. This event is free and open to the public.

With the expansion a few years ago

onto Kings Road, this rain or shine street festival now spans over six blocks. It includes sidewalk sales, four stages with live music, three Amusement Areas, food, and more than 250 vendors, including non-profits, crafters and retail businesses.

There will be great food options, including the Food Court on the corner of Central Avenue and Cook Avenue, other food vendors throughout the festival, local restaurants, and a Food Truck Court on Kings Road.

Park & Ride Shuttle: Just Park your car in the parking lot at the Madison Community Pool and ride downtown, where the shuttle will drop you off right in the center of town. The shuttle will run from 9:15 to 5 p.m. in a continuous loop between the parking lot and the town center.

Family Activities & Rides: Provided by Seashore Amusements at Central Avenue School and Kings Road.

Other Activities: The Presbyterian Church of Madison will once again host a Petting Zoo & Pony Rides at the church at 18 Green Ave.

More than 20 electric vehicles (EVs) will be on display at Bottle Hill Day in the Train Station Parking Lot, 32 Kings Road. Attendees can see EVs from Honda, Hyundai, Volvo, Chevy, Porsche, VW, Mercedes, Karma, BMW, Audi Polestar, Lucid, Tesla, Rivian and others. This is a National Drive Electric Month event.

The Museum of Early Trades & Crafts will kick off the United States' 250th birthday in 2026 a few months early from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. at 9 Main St.

The 3rd New Jersey Regiment will cook on the front lawn and perform drills on the back lawn. Makerspace and crafts will take place in the Education Annex, 23 Main St.

There will be free admission to the museum on Bottle Hill Day.




