The Mount Olive Police Department will be participating in the 2025 Police Unity Tour and has requested that the participating police officers be considered on duty during riding hours and afforded the full protections of the collective bargaining agreement.

Approving a non-fair and open vendor service contract pursuant to New Jersey local unit pay-to-play law (MB Harbor LLC)

The Township has a need to purchase parts and repair services for the Carlton Hills Water System. MB Harbor LLC has submitted a proposal and it is recommended to award a contract in accordance with the Pay-to-Play law not to exceed \$19,349.

Approving a non-fair and open vendor service contract pursuant to New Jersey local unit pay-to-play law (M&B Septic Services dba Noah's Ark Port-A-Jon)

The Township has a need to purchase rental of port-a-potties and cleaning services. M&B Septic Services DBA Noah's Ark Port-A-Jon has submitted a proposal and it is recommended to award a contract in accordance with the Pay-to-Play law not to exceed \$32,200.

27-2025

Approving a non-fair and open vendor service contract pursuant to New Jersey local unit pay-to-play law (GovPilot)

The Township has a need to purchase user licenses and hosting services for code enforcement software. GovPilot has submitted a proposal and it is recommended to award a contract in accordance with the Pay-to-Play law not to exceed \$20,000.

28-2025

Approving a non-fair and open vendor service contract pursuant to New Jersey local unit pay-to-play law (FCR Morris, LLC)

The Township has a need to purchase recycling commodity services. FCR

Morris, LLC has submitted a proposal and it is recommended to award a contract in accordance with the Pay-to-Play law not to exceed \$120,000.

29-2025 Authorizing the award of a non-fair and open professional services

agreement to Jonathan F. Cohen, Esq. to provide Hearing Officer services (January 1, 2025 - December 31, 2025)

The Township has a need for a hearing officer to assist with pending disciplinary matters. Jonathan F. Cohen, Esq. of the firm Plosia Cohen LLC has submitted a proposal and it is recommended to award a professional service contract not to exceed \$17,500.

30-2025 Authorizing the award of a non-fair and open professional services agreement to RJH Law Enforcement Consultants to provide Hearing Officer services (January 1, 2025 - December 31, 2025)

> The Township has a need for a hearing officer to assist with pending disciplinary matters. RJH Law Enforcement Consultants has submitted a proposal and it is recommended to award a professional service contract not to exceed \$17,500.

31-2025 Authorizing the award of a non-fair and open professional services agreement to RJH Law Enforcement Consultants to provide Hearing Officer services (January 1, 2024 - December 31, 2024) *REVISED -**Increasing contract amount**

> The Township previously awarded a professional service contract to RJH Law Enforcement Consultants of hearing officer services related to pending disciplinary charges. The contract needs to be increased by \$5,325 to fulfill the outstanding contract balance bringing the total contract amount to \$22,825.

32-2025 Authorizing the purchase of a KMI Asphalt Hotbox Reclaimer off the Sourcewell Co-op (Trius)

> The Township is permitted to join national cooperative purchasing agreements, is a member of Sourcewell Co-Op and solicited a proposal from KM International (Trius) for the purchase of a KMI Asphalt Hotbox Reclaimer in the amount of \$53,230. There are no alternative purchasing approaches and/or rejections made by any NJ vendor and it is recommended to authorize the contract.

33-2025 Authorizing the purchase of goods or services via New Jersey State Contracts and purchasing agreements

> The Township is permitted by resolution and without advertising for bids to purchase any goods and services under the State of NJ Cooperative Purchasing Program for any State contracts. It is recommended to participate in the following contracts: BCCPS, ESCNH, HCESC, MCCPC, NJWCPS and SOCCP.

34-2025 Rejecting the proposal received for RFP #08-2024 Township Planner The Township publicly advertised for RFPs for a Township Planner and

received one proposal from Topology NJ, LLC. It is recommended to reject the bid due to the Township abandoning the project and move forward in a different direction.

35-2025 Authorizing purchases with Verizon as a proprietary vendor for 2025

The Township uses telecommunications software and hardware installed and maintained by Verizon which cannot be readily serviced by another vendor and it is recommended to identify Verizon as a propriety vendor in order to comply with the requirements of the Local Public Contracts Law.

36-2025 Authorizing purchases with Cablevision/Lightpath as a proprietary vendor for 2025

The Township uses telecommunications software and hardware installed and maintained by Cablevision/Lightpath which cannot be readily serviced by another vendor and it is recommended to identify Cablevision/Lightpath as a propriety vendor in order to comply with the requirements of the Local Public Contracts Law.

Authorizing the correction of an assignment of tax sale certificates number 18-00012 and 18-00015

The Township previously authorized a tax sale certificate to AHMC, LLC which needs to be corrected and assigned to Augment Holdings, LLC to reflect the proper name of the business.

39-2025 Authorizing the Township Council to hold Executive Session The Township wishes to adjourn into closed executive session to discuss matters regarding potential litigation within the attorney-client privilege.

Ord. 1-2025 An Ordinance amending Ordinance #36-2024 of the Township of Mount Olive entitled Salaries of Certain Non-Union Personnel

The Recreation Department has a need to re-structure and create a new Assistant Recreation Supervisor title with a salary range of \$50,000 - \$75,000.

Ord. 2-2025 An Ordinance of the Township of Mount Olive, County of Morris, State of New Jersey amending chapter 68 "General Provisions" Article I, "Police Department", Section 2 "Composition" of the code of the Township of Mount Olive

State statute has established the police licensing program for all NJ Law Enforcement Officers which requires all officers to hold a valid, active licensed issued by the Police Training Commission in order to be employed as a police officer in the State of New Jersey. The Police Department recommends codifying the change and incorporating the language into the Township code.

Ord. 3-2025

An Ordinance of the Township of Mount Olive, County of Morris and State of New Jersey, amending chapter 550, "Land Use", Article V, Section 550-75 "Tree Removal, Replanting and Forestry Management **Plans**

The Township has established a Tree Bank fund which provides for the care and replacement of trees within the Township which is funded by developers. It is recommended to amend the code to include language to allow for the funds to be used for the removal of dead, diseased or decaying trees up to 10% annually of the total tree bank fund.

WHEREAS, the Township's historic architect has prepared contractor prequalification regulations in connection with the roof restoration and structural upgrades at the Seward House Barn to control the experience, skill and abilities of proposed contractors to complete the project to the requirements of the program; and

WHEREAS, legal advertisements were placed in accordance with requirements with public inspection of the required documents available and the Township Council has conducted the necessary public hearing;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Council of the Township of Mt. Olive that it does hereby authorize the prequalification regulations attached hereto which are hereby adopted for utilization in connections with the bid for the roof restoration and structural upgrades at the Seward House Barn; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the implementation of the contractor pre-qualification regulations is subject to review and approval of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services and the Township Clerk is hereby authorized to file with the Director if the Division of Local Government Services a true copy of this Resolution, a true copy of the hearings, and affidavit of publication in two newspaper legal advertisements and a completed certified standard certification form.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWNSHIP OF MOUNT OLIVE IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS THROUGH THE MOUNT OLIVE TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE DEFENSE LOGISTICS AGENCY, LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT OFFICE, 1033 PROGRAM TO ENABLE THE MOUNT OLIVE TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT TO REQUEST AND ACQUIRE EXCESS DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE EQUIPMENT

WHEREAS, the United States Congress authorized the Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) 1033 Program to make use of excess Department of Defense personal property by making that personal property available to municipal, county and State law enforcement agencies (LEAs); and

WHEREAS, DLA rules mandate that all equipment acquired through the 1033 Program remain under the control of the requesting LEA; and

WHEREAS, participation in the 1033 Program allows municipal and county LEAs to obtain property they might not otherwise be able to afford in order to enhance community preparedness, response, and resiliency; and

WHEREAS, although property is provided through the 1033 Program at no cost to municipal and county LEAs, these entities are responsible for the costs associated with delivery, maintenance, fueling, and upkeep of the property, and for specialized training on the operation of any acquired property; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-30.2 requires that the governing body of the municipality or county approve, by a majority of the full membership, both enrollment in, and the acquisition of any property through, the 1033 Program; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Township of Mount Olive in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey that the Mount Olive Township Police Department is hereby authorized to enroll in the 1033 Program for no more than a one-year period, with authorization to participate terminating on December 31 of the current calendar year from January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025; and

ORDINANCE # 2 - 2025

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MOUNT OLIVE, COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 68 "GENERAL PROVISIONS" ARTICLE I, "POLICE DEPARTMENT", SECTION 2 "COMPOSITION" OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MOUNT OLIVE, NEW JERSEY.

WHEREAS, Chapter 68 - Police Department - Section 2 - Composition, §68-2, of the Mount Olive Township Code establishes the Police Department and outlines the composition of the police department and appointment of such officers; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 42:17b-66 et. seq., established the police licensing program for all New Jersey law enforcement officers and further requires that all law enforcement officers hold a valid, active license issued by the Police Training Commission in order to be employed as a police officer in the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council deems it necessary to amend the Township Code to ensure compliance with these requirements by amending section §68-2 to include section C., entitled "Sworn Law Enforcement Licenses".

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Mount Olive, in the County of Morris, State of New Jersey, as follows:

§68-2. C. Sworn Law Enforcement Licenses

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 52:17B-67.1, all current and future law enforcement officers employed by the Township of Mount Olive Police Department shall hold a valid, active license issued by the Police Training Commission (PTC) in order to be employed as a police officer in the State of New Jersey.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED all Ordinances of the Township of Mount Olive which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

BE IF FURTHER ORDAINED this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 3-2025

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MOUNT OLIVE, COUNTY OF MORRIS AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 550 "LAND USE," ARTICLE V, SECTION 550-75 "TREE REMOVAL, REPLANTING AND FORESTRY MANAGEMENT PLANS."

WHEREAS, Section 550-75 of the Code of the Township of Mount Olive provides for the care, replacement, and removal of trees within the Township, and the creation of a tree bank fund to be utilized for the reforestation, planting, and care of such trees; and

WHEREAS, Section 550-75(F) of the Code permits the Township Council to direct the removal of dead, decaying, or diseased trees within the Township that endangers life or property;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council find it in the best interest of the Township and its citizenry to amend Section 550-75 of the Code of the Township of Mount Olive to permit the use of tree bank funds to provide for the maintenance, replacement, and removal of trees by the Township; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Mount Olive, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. Chapter 550, "Land Use," Section 550-75 "Tree Removal, Replanting And Forestry Management Plans," Subsection J "Tree banking" of the Code of the Township of Mount Olive is hereby amended, to include:

- (4) All tree banking funds shall be deposited in a separate, interest-bearing Community Tree Bank Trust Fund. Said funds shall be used to implement the reforestation and planting objectives set forth in Subsection J(3) of this section, as well as for the ongoing maintenance of Township public trees, to include, but not limited to, removal of dead, diseased or decaying trees, pruning, watering, and disease/pest infestation prevention and treatment. However, such funds expended for the ongoing maintenance and/or removal of dead or diseased trees within a given year shall not exceed 10% of the total expenditures of the Community Tree Bank Trust Fund. In the event the Township Council wishes to exceed the 10% expenditure limitation, such expenditure must first be approved by supermajority of the Council.
- **SECTION 2.** Any article, section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or other provision of the Mount Olive Township Code inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **SECTION 3.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance may be renumbered for purposes of codification.
