

MORRIS COUNTY: A RICH HISTORY

Centrally located in the Highlands region in northern New Jersey, Morris County blends natural landscapes, a history spanning the Colonial era though the technological breakthroughs of the 20th and 21st Centuries, with charming communities and impressive corporate campuses.

Situated about 30 miles from New York City, Forbes Magazine described Morris County as "... a suburb of the New York area which reaps the benefits of the big city's financial industry." Forbes also rated Morris as one of the top 10 wealthiest counties in the country. Between 2015 and 2019, Money Magazine selected several communities in Morris County as being among "The Best Places to Live."

Morris County was incorporated on March 15, 1738/1739, from portions of Hunterdon County. The inconsistency in the year relates to the Old Style (OS) and New Style (NS) calendars being used during the colonial period. Morris County was named in honor of the first Governor of the Province of New Jersey Lewis Morris (1671-1746).

Within its 469 square miles of land area, the county contains 39 municipalities with a 2024 population from the U.S. Census Bureau estimated to be around 523,053, making it New Jersey's 9th most populous county of the state's 21 counties. At its most distant points, the county stretches 30 miles from east to west and 30 miles from north to south.

Roads, bus and rail service link the 39 municipalities in the county to the metropolitan region. Two public airports, the Morristown Municipal Airport and the Lincoln Park Airport, are located in Morris County.

There are also an additional 12 FAA certified private corporate heliports and airports, one military heliport at Picatinny Arsenal and one medical helipad at Morristown Medical Center in Morristown. Three major airports, Newark Liberty International, John F. Kennedy and LaGuardia International Airport, are accessible by highway, train, and bus lines.

The area's civilian work force exceeds 279,183 as of May 2025. The U.S. Census American Community Survey for 2023 shows total

adult population in Morris County with a bachelor's degree or higher is 57.2 percent. More than 50 Fortune 500 companies have their headquarters or major operations in Morris County.

Morris County is rich in history and home to more than 200 historic sites listed on New Jersey's Register of Historic Places. Four of these sites – Morristown National Historical Park, Historic Speedwell, Stickley Museum at Craftsman Farms, and Villa Fontana, home of Thomas Nast – have been designated as National Historic Landmarks by the Secretary of the Interior.

Strategic Location

During the Revolutionary War, Morristown's strategic location between New York City and Philadelphia prompted General George Washington and the Continental Army to make their winter encampments in Morristown in 1776-1777 and 1779-1780. Washington used Colonel Jacob Ford Jr.'s mansion as his headquarters during this time. The mansion is the centerpiece of the Morristown National Historical Park, the first national historical park in the country.

It also was in Morris County, at what is now Historic Speedwell in Morristown, where Alfred Vail and Samuel F.B. Morse perfected and first publicly demonstrated the electro-magnetic telegraph in 1838. Vail's distant cousin, Theodore Vail was educated in Morristown and served as the first president of the American Telephone & Telegraph Company (AT&T).

Noted statewide for its recreational facilities and preservation of natural landscape, the Morris County Park System (www.morris-parks.net) is the largest county park system in

New Jersey based on acreage.

Morris County has the largest county park system in New Jersey, attracting more than 5.4 million visitors annually and supervising 20,611 acres of parkland, over 260 miles of trails and 39 recreational, historical, horticultural and environmental facilities. These include the Patriots Path hiking trail network, active and passive recreation fields, four award-winning golf courses, picnic sites, gardens, camping, cross-country skiing, and lakes. Some notable locations in the county park system include, Fosterfields Living History Farm, the Frelinghuysen and Willowood Arboretums, Mennen Sports Arena, Central Park of Morris County, Historic Speedwell Village, and Lee's County Park Marina on Lake Hopatcong.

Education

Education in Morris County commands a leading role, with outstanding public and private elementary, secondary and higher educational facilities. The Morris County Vocational School District offers high school students and adult learner's vocational education and training through the Morris County School of Technology. The School of Technology offers both shared and full-time programs for the county's high school students and continuing education programs for adults.

Fairleigh Dickinson University's Florham Campus in Madison, the College of St. Elizabeth in Morris Township and Drew University in Madison, and the two-year County College of Morris (CCM) in Randolph, provide easy access to higher education.

While the seven-member Board of County Commissioners oversees and approves activities relating to the business of running the county, the county administrator supervises day-to-day operations of the many departments of county government.

The county administration building is located at 10 Court St. in Morristown. The phone number is (973) 285-6010 or visit morriscountynj.gov. Most regular public meetings are conducted at 7 p.m. on the second Wednesday of the month, excluding holidays.

MINE HILL TOWNSHIP

Mine Hill, a three-square-mile community of 4,100 people, has been in the forefront of the "shared-services" movement popular with smaller municipalities as a way to cut costs. Several years ago, the local police department was merged with Wharton and deemed so successful, additional services then were evaluated.

At the same time, the township's tiny K-6 school district sends children to Dover Middle and Dover High schools. The district's sole school, the Canfield Avenue School, is a state Lighthouse District and National School of Excellence.

Mine Hill is a quiet residential community in the northwest corner of Morris County and is easily accessible via the MidTown Direct line of N.J. Transit's train station in Dover, Interstate 80, routes 46 and 10.

True to its name, the area was once a thriving mining center beginning in the early 1700s until the late 1960s. One of its key landmarks is the Bridget Smith House, formerly owned by a mining family in the late 1800s and today is on the state and national Registers of Historic Places.

In July 2007, an agreement was signed to preserve 200 acres of the long-closed Dickerson Mine, owned and operated in the past by Mahlon Dickerson (New Jersey's 12th

governor and Secretary of the Navy in the 1830s).

When the township purchased the historic property for \$12.4 million, it spared the tract from becoming home to a 700 unit plus housing development.

Mine Hill shares Hedden County Park, a park that offers a large trail system and other recreational opportunities for local residents, with Dover and Randolph.

The township is governed by a voter-elected Township Council of five members, and a mayor each serving four-year terms.

The council meets at 7 p.m. the first and third Thursdays of each month at the municipal building.

MOUNT ARLINGTON BOROUGH

Located on the southeast shore of Lake Hopatcong, New Jersey's largest natural lake and a major recreational resource, the Borough of Mount Arlington is home to about 5,900 people and, with just 2.9 square miles, is one of the smallest communities in Morris County.

Now a suburban residential community, it was once a thriving resort town that attracted wealthy families trying to escape the heat in New York City, Philadelphia and Newark during the sweltering summers. There were once large, extravagant hotels located on the shores of Lake Hopatcong, and Mount Arlington was considered a tourist destination.

Homes today range from summer cottages and year-round housing to restored Victorian mansions.

Mount Arlington's historical district is registered with both the state and national Registers of Historical Places; 15 buildings in town have been designated official landmarks.

The unusual shape of the town occurred when Mount Arlington split from Roxbury in 1890.

Neighborhoods were so divided over the issue that the resulting border line literally divided some areas between which sides of the street voted in which favor.

For example, on Howard

Mount Arlington Borough was once a thriving resort town that attracted wealthy families trying to escape the heat in New York City, Philadelphia and Newark.

Boulevard today, the Cracker Barrel restaurant lies in Roxbury, while adjacent businesses are in Mount Arlington.

Bertrand Island, although now an isthmus after a road was built to connect it to the main land, was home to a famous amusement park from 1928 to 1983 by the same name that was also the place of origin for Bette Cooper 1937's Miss America and the site of some scenes from Woody Allen's 1985 film, "The Purple Rose of Cairo." Shaped like a spoon, it was converted to single-family and condominium waterfront housing years ago.

Lake Hopatcong Yacht Club, also on Bertrand Island, was founded in 1905 and still contains the Adirondack style clubhouse built in 1910 that is on the National and New Jer-

MOUNT OLIVE TOWNSHIP

Mount Olive, in the north-western corner of Morris County, measures 32 square miles and has a population of about 28,000.

The township is divided into two sections, Budd Lake and Flanders.

The showcase of the town is Budd Lake, the largest natural lake in New Jersey. On any given summer day, the lake can be found filled with sailboats, personal watercraft and water skiers.

The major recreational center is the 267-acre Turkey Brook Park off Flanders Road. The park opened in 2003 and includes six natural grass soccer fields, one artificial turf soccer field with lights, one lit game football field and one lit football practice field. It also includes four baseball fields, one lacrosse field, and tennis and volleyball courts.

Visitors also can bring their pets to the 1.5 acre dog park at Turkey Brook Park.

The park also includes the All Veteran's Memorial, a September 11th Memorial, and a Memorial Garden for Children of Mount Olive who have perished.

The Mount Playmore playground opened in 2014, offering 11,000 square feet of swings, slides, see-saws and more.

The park's landmark is the historic Seward Mansion at the entrance to the park.

Mount Olive is the second

largest municipality in the county and was named after a local landowner, Benjamin Olive, when it separated from Roxbury Township in 1871. The two main mailing addresses in town, the unincorporated areas of Budd Lake and Flanders, were also named after early residents. The first after Col. John Budd who moved to the area with his wife after the American Revolution, and the latter after a group of early settlers who vacationed in Flanders, Long Island.

For many years, Mount Olive was primarily a farming community with a summer resort area around Budd Lake. Abundant water power allowed the development of grist and saw mills, distilleries, tanneries and creameries. A number of forges and iron works flourished until the early 1900s; one foundry built in 1845 is still in operation.




ROXBURY TOWNSHIP

Roxbury Township is made up of six communities including Kenvil, Landing, Ledge-wood, Berkshire Valley, Port Morris and Succasunna and covers an area of about 22 square miles that is divided equally between the Schooley's Mountain range and the Succasunna Plains. It is located at the crossroads of routes 46, 10 and Interstate 80, just 50 miles west of New York City, and is home to nearly 26,000 people.

Within its boundaries is the Horseshoe Lake Recreational Area that includes a swimming area, picnic areas and pavilion, band shell, a playground, sports fields for soccer and baseball, basketball and volleyball courts, a walking path and bikeway. The Roxbury Rotary Club constructed a lighted gazebo on the island.

The facility is used annually for carnivals, fairs, craft shows and sporting competitions of all types, and is considered one of the premiere recreational facilities within Morris County. A performing arts center, known as RoxPAC, was opened on the Horseshoe Lake grounds, and offers concerts, poetry readings, plays and other artful endeavors.

Preservation of open space has contributed in large part to the pastoral appearance of the community with more than 25 percent of the community designated for public and quasi-public use and an addi-

tional 21 percent farm and vacant land.

Fifteen parks are maintained by the Parks and Recreation Department. Over the past decade, in fact, the township has aggressively pursued open space purchases and, to date, has preserved more than 1,000 acres.

On the flip side, Roxbury is the home to many active business and commercial areas along routes 10 and 46, including the Ledgewood Commons, and the Roxbury Mall, as well as the Howard Boulevard business corridor. The area's growth has been spurred by easy access to nearby I-80.

The township was founded in 1740 and was originally a center for iron mining and forging that supplied Gen. George Washington and the Continental Army. Later, local explosives plants that supplied the mines and railroad building employed generations of residents.

By 1890, Roxbury was considered the gateway to the

busy resorts of Lake Hopatcong to the north, one of the region's most popular summer destinations for more than 60 years.

The township is governed by a seven-member voter-elected Township Council which annually elects one of its own as mayor. Voters elect

three at-large and four ward council members to four-year terms.

The school district is a large grades K-12 entity serving 4,600 students in seven buildings and is governed by a nine-member Board of Education.
