Morris County: A Rich History

Centrally located in the Highlands region in northern New Jersey, Morris County blends natural landscapes, a history spanning the Colonial era though the technolological breakthroughs of the 20th and 21st Centuries, with charming communities and impressive corporate campuses.

Situated about 30 miles from New York City, Forbes Magazine described Morris County as "... a suburb of the New York area which reaps the benefits of the big city's financial industry." Forbes also rated Morris as one of the top 10 wealthiest counties in the country. Between 2015 and 2019, Money Magazine has selected several communities in Morris County as being among "The Best Places to Live."

U.S. News and World Report in 2019 named Morris County as one of the top 30 counties in the nation. And Morris County was ranked as the healthiest county in N.J. in 2019 by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

Morris County was incorporated on March 15, 1738/1739, from portions of Hunterdon County. The inconsistency in the year relates to the Old Style (OS) and New Style (NS) calendars being used during the colonial period. Morris County was named in honor of the first Governor of the Province of New Jersey, Lewis Morris (1671-1746).

Within its 469 square miles of land area, the county contains 39 municipalities with a 2014 population from the U.S. Census Bureau estimated to be 499,727, making it New Jersey's 10th most populous county. At its most distant points, the county stretches 30 miles from east to west and 30 miles from north to south.

Roads, bus and rail service link the 39 municipalities in the county to the metropolitan region. Two public airports, the Morristown Municipal Airport and the Lincoln Park Airport, are located in Morris County.

There are also an additional 12 FAA certified private corporate heliports and airports, one military heliport at Picatinny Arsenal and one medical helipad at Morristown Medical Center in Morristown. Three major airports, Newark Liberty International, John F. Kennedy and LaGuardia International Airport, are accessible by highway, train, and bus lines.

The area's civilian work force exceeds 263,000 as of 2014. The U.S. Census American Community Survey for 2020 shows total adult population in Morris County with a bachelor's degree or higher is 56.5 percent. Over 50 Fortune 500 companies have

their headquarters or major operations in Morris County.

Morris County is rich in history and home to more than 150 historic sites listed on New Jersey's Register of Historic Places, with most also being included on the National Register of Historic Places. Four of these sites – Morristown National Historical Park, Historic Speedwell, Stickley Museum at Craftsman Farms, and Villa Fontana, home of Thomas Nast – have been designated as National Historic Landmarks by the Secretary of the Interior.

Strategic Location

During the Revolutionary War, Morristown's strategic location between New York City and Philadelphia prompted General George Washington and the Continental Army to make their winter encampments in Morristown in 1776-1777 and 1779-1780. Washington used Colonel Jacob Ford Jr.'s mansion as his headquarters during this time. The mansion is the centerpiece of the Morristown National Historical Park, the first national historical park in the country.

It also was in Morris County, at what is now Historic Speedwell in Morristown, where Alfred Vail and Samuel F.B. Morse perfected and first publicly demonstrated the electro-magnetic telegraph in 1838. Vail's distant cousin, Theodore Vail was educated in Morristown and served as the first president of the American Telephone & Telegraph Company (AT&T).

Noted statewide for its recreational facilities and preservation of natural landscape, the Morris County Park System (www. morrisparks.net) is the largest county park system in New Jersey based on acreage.

The park system attracts about 3.5 mil-

lion visitors annually, and holds and supervises 20,383-acres of parkland, 150 trail miles and 38 recreational, historical, horticultural and environmental facilities. These include the Patriots Path hiking trail network, which includes accomodation for the seeing impaired; active and passive recreation fields, four award-winning golf courses, picnic sites, gardens, camping, cross-country skiing, and lakes. Some notable locations in the county park system include. Fosterfields Living History Farm, the Frelinguysen and Willowood Arboretums, Mennen Sports Arena, Central Park of Morris County, Historic Speedwell Village, and Lee's County Park Marina on Lake Hopatcong.

Education

Education in Morris County commands a leading role, with outstanding public and private elementary, secondary and higher educational facilities. The Morris County School of Technology in Denville offers high school students and adult learner's vocational education and training. The School of Technology offers both shared and full-time programs for the county's high school students and continuing education programs for adults.

Fairleigh Dickinson University's Florham Campus in Madison, the College of St. Elizabeth in Morris Township and Drew University in Madison, and the two-year County College of Morris (CCM) in Randolph, provide easy access to higher education.

County College of Morris offers more than 45 Associate Degree programs and over 25 certificate programs covering nearly 80 areas of study. with affordable tuition. Popular programs include Liberal Arts and Sciences, Communications, Cyber Security, Humanities, Business, Management, Marketing and Related Support Services, and Health Professions and Related Programs.

While the seven-member Board of County Commissioners oversee and approve activities relating to the business of running the county, such as county budget, road construction and repairs, appointments to the various county commissions and agencies, and other miscellaneous county issues, the county administrator supervises day-today operations of the many departments of county government.





CHATHAM BOROUGH

Chatham, a quiet residential community 25 miles west of New York City on the eastern edge of Morris County, has a strong sense of community.

There are actually two Chathams: the borough and the township.

Chatham borough, with its 9,022 residents, has a mix of fine homes, townhouses, garden apartments and condominiums and is an easy commute to New York City and other employment centers by train or highway.

Little more than 2.8 square miles in size, it is surrounded by Florham Park to the north, Madison to the west, Chatham Township to the south and Union County to the east. The borough offers excellent shopping and restaurants along Main Street as well as at the nearby Mall at Short Hills and the Livingston Mall. The K-12 school system, which the borough shares with Chatham Township, consistently scores very high in state and national rankings.

Local cultural opportunities include many historical, art, garden and musical groups as well as the facilities and programs of neighboring Drew and Fairleigh Dickinson universities. The Great Swamp National Wildlife Preserve, Morristown National Historical Park (Jockey Hollow) and other recreation facilities are nearby, including the Historic Riverside Trail along the Passa-







FLORHAM PARK

The Borough of Florham Park, part of Chatham Township until the 19th century, occupies 7.6 square miles of southeastern Morris County. The population is 12,605. First settled by the English in the late 17th century, the area was prime farming land.

In 2008, Florham Park became home to the New Jersey Jets corporate headquarters and training facility, which occupies 20 of the former Exxon property's 485 acres. Relocating from their current facilities in Long Island, the Jets chose Florham Park after searching for land easily accessible to the Meadowlands, Newark Airport and New York City.

Florham Park hosts a summer concert series on The Great Lawn on Ridgedale Avenue at the Borough Complex. Beginning in June, each week hosts musical artists performing everything from Big Band, Rock and Roll, Orchestra and Doo Wop music.

In 2014, the borough participated in the send-off of the 18th annual Police Unity Tour, which raises money for the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial, Visitors Center and National Law Enforcement Museum in Washington, D.C. Bikers journeved from the borough complex to Washington, D.C. Columbia Turnpike was built in 1817 to connect Newark to Morristown. sparking an influx of residents and businesses to form a rural community producing roses, bricks, brooms and whiskey,

Multimillionaires Florence and Hamilton Twombley arrived in the late 19th century. Owners of 1,000 acres in the area, they began a campaign to separate "Afton" from Chatham Township, knowing it would result in lower taxes. Dr. Leslie Ward, owner of a huge estate he called Brooklake Park, shared the Twombley's ideas and joined in their quest for secession. In 1899 secession was approved. The Twombleys added the first syllables of their first names to a piece of the Ward estate name, and called the newly independent borough "Florham Park."

The Twombley estate now graces the

campus of Fairleigh Dickinson University.

Florham Park's original town center had been located around Columbia Turnpike and Ridgedale Avenue, where the Little Red Schoolhouse, the town's symbol, has been standing since the 19th century. Today the look of that section barely resembles what it once was. Many of the town's historic buildings were removed in the 1950s and 1960s to make way for a wider highway and shopping centers.

In June 2005 the historic Afton building was taken down. The adjacent Hopping Canfield House at first survived the demolition, but later was demolished when no acceptable site or use could be found for the structure.

Florham Park's Colonial-style Borough Hall is located on a 70-acre complex on Ridgedale Avenue, a center of town cultural and recreational activities.

Florham Park has a highly rated school system of two elementary schools and a middle school. High schoolers attend Hanover Park Regional High.

Florham Park has a mayor and council form of government. The mayor serves a four-year term, and Borough Council members serve three-year terms.

Public council meetings are held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month in Borough Hall, unless otherwise noted.



MADISON BOROUGH

Incorporated in 1889 and named for the country's fourth president, Madison is situated in four square miles of southeastern Morris County. Its first inhabitants were the Lenni Lenape tribe of Indians, who wandered the area for thousands of years before Europeans arrived 1715. The Minnisink Trail, a famous Indian pathway, runs right through the borough along what is now Kings Road. In 1837 the Morris-Essex Railroad Line was completed. One of America's first commuter railroads, it had an enormous impact on area residents.

The area became more attractive than ever for wealthy families from New York City, who built grand estates from Madison to Morristown, stretching along a strip that was known as Millionaires Row. Owners of these estates were the first Madison residents to rush out their doors mornings to catch trains into New York City.

Madison's rose industry began around the mid-19th century.

Thanks to the area's rich soil and the new railroad tying the town to larger cities, Madison enjoyed more than a century-long run as one of the country's major producers of greenhouse roses for commercial sale.

By the turn of the century, Madison had evolved into a community blended with people of varied nationalities, religions and socio-economic positions.

True to its roots, present-day Madison remains a richly diverse town with a flavor all its own. Drew University, which occupies almost 200 wooded acres in the borough, serves as a major cultural center. Housed on Drew's campus is The Shakespeare Theatre of New Jersey.

In recent years Madison has captured the attention of several filmmakers who have

The Hartley Dodge Memorial Building is the seat of the Madison Municipal Government.

Madison is home to more than 15,000 residents, many of whom still race for New York City trains in the morning.

Madison is governed by a voter-elected mayor and six-member Borough Council whose public meetings begin at 8 p.m. the second and fourth Mondays of the month.






