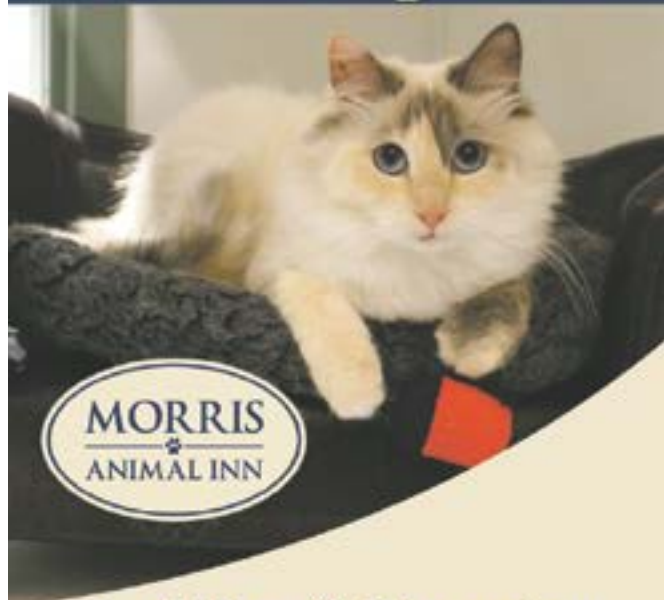

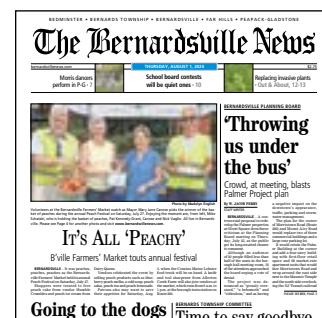

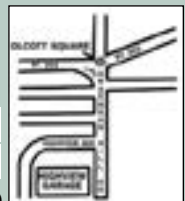

ABOUT THIS GUIDE



The Essex-Hunterdon-Morris-Somerset area served by **The New Jersey Hills Media Group** is a diversified area inhabited by high-level corporate executives, middle management, and trade and service employees in all fields. Schools are ranked with some of the best in the state and cultural offerings are plentiful.

The coverage area shares borders with Warren, Sussex, Passaic, Middlesex and Union counties.

The map at the top of this page shows the entire area covered by the New Jersey Hills Media Group, the name of each newspaper and the area it covers.

Browse through **Our Town**, keep it on the kitchen counter, the table next to the recliner, the magazine rack in the family room. Refer to it often.

BEDMINSTER TOWNSHIP

Bedminster, located in northern Somerset County, was named for Bedminster, England. It has a population of 8,302 and measures 26.70 square miles. The township is known for its farms, stables and private estates. Open space, parkland, services and easy access to business make it an ideal place to live with its proud sense of heritage, community and volunteerism.

The township was incorporated in 1749. During the end of the 19th century, Bedminster was attracting wealthy families from New York City. They built expansive estates as they arrived. The area remained relatively untouched until the late 1960s when Interstate 78 opened along its southern edge and Interstate 287 crossed its eastern border making the area more accessible to outsiders. In the mid-1980s, The Hills housing development was built on Schley Mountain with town houses, condos and small lot houses. Located east of I-287, it tripled the township's population. More than 65 percent of Bedminster's residents now live in The Hills.

Bedminster borders Far Hills and has four village areas: historic Pluckemin, downtown Bedminster in the east, Lamington in the west and Pottersville in the northwest corner. Bedminster's main thoroughfare, Route 202, ambles through the quiet village that retains its 19th century charm. Its country roads, horse farms, churches,

Colonial and Victorian homes give Bedminster its unique character. Historic Pluckemin offers beautiful homes, restaurants and shops. Lamington is equally charming with its country homes, farms, barns, huge population of horses and the old-fashioned Lamington Country Store. Pottersville is a blend of winsome stores, historic churches and home to an annual antiques show in July.

Located in the northeastern corner of Bedminster is the U.S. Equestrian Team Foundation. It is the center for training the U.S. Olympic Team and host to a number of equestrian events. Admission to the facility is free and open to the public.

The township also completed its Hike and Bike Trail in 2002. The trail is an eight-foot wide, 2.6-mile paved path, with three pedestrian bridges that safely cross I-287 and Route 202-206. It runs through woods and along the river, connecting The Hills with township parks and municipal services in Bedminster Village. River Road Park is the township's premier area of 300-plus acres of preserved land and open space. Located west of Route 206 and linked by the Hike and Bike pedestrian bridge over Route 202-206, the park offers passive recreation, trails and the Stahl Natural Area, a nature preserve. There are fields for soccer and baseball, along with the North Branch of the Raritan River, part of the park,

used for fishing in the spring and summer.

Another gem is Clarence Dillon Public Library at 2336 Lamington Road. Offering an array of programs and activities, it also houses an extensive collection of historical documents, books, movies, music, computers and Internet access. Children in preschool through grade eight attend the Bedminster Township Public School; grades nine through 12 attend Bernards High School, part of the Somerset Hills Regional School District serving Bernardsville, Far Hills and Peapack-Gladstone.

Bedminster's township of-

fices, police station and public works garage are located on Miller Lane off Somerville Road (Route 202) and make up the municipal complex. The Far Hills-Bedminster Fire Department has moved into a new, larger firehouse at the complex. There are playing fields at Miller Lane and the Hike and Bike Trail runs through Miller Lane Park on the way to and from the Bedminster School.

A five-member Township Committee, elected by voters to three-year terms, governs the township. Members annually select one of themselves to serve as mayor.

Bernardsville, Bernards Township, Far Hills, Bedminster Township, and Peapack-Gladstone are located in northeastern Somerset County. The county encompasses 305 square miles, has 21 municipalities, is located at the hub of central New Jersey, and is one of only two “land-locked” counties in the state (Morris County is the other). Other municipalities that make up the county are Bound Brook, Branchburg, Bridgewater, Franklin, Green Brook, Hillsborough, Manville, Millstone, Montgomery, North Plainfield, Raritan, Rocky Hill, Somerville, South Bound Brook, Warren Township and Watchung.

The county contains a wide diversity of landscape, population and development that reflects the varied lifestyles of its estimated 335,432 residents occupying some 125,000 households. Somerset County values its diversity and excels at “Making Vibrant Connections” by establishing successful partnerships with residents, businesses, local governments and affiliated county agencies to promote innovative public service for the benefit of the entire community.

The Somerset County Board of County Commissioners, the Somerset County Office on Aging & Disability Services and the Visiting Nurse Association of Somerset Hills have a unique partnership project that is serving seniors in the Somerset Hills area. A modern complex off Mount Airy Road in Bernards Township is home to both the county-operated Senior Wellness Center and the VNA headquarters. For information about the county’s senior programs, call toll-free 1-888-747-1122.

The 17th Annual Somerset County Weekend Journey Through The Past will be held this year on October 8 and 9, offering free tours of historic sites around the county during the second weekend in October. This autumn weekend features interpreted tours led by costumed docents; special collections and exhibitions; period re-enactments and much more. It’s also a chance to visit some historic sites not generally open to the public. A list of this year’s participating sites and oth-

er Weekend Journey information will be posted on the event website at www.SCHistoryWeekend.com.

As one of America’s oldest counties, Somerset is steeped in Colonial and Revolutionary War history. The county was established by charter on May 22, 1688, with land conveyances dating to 1651. Historic sites, monuments and buildings are found in virtually every town, preserved for future generations.

The county’s 14,701 acres of parkland include golf courses, picnic areas, hiking and bicycling trails, stables, a swimming pool, an Environmental Education Center, the Natirar property in the Somerset Hills and the County Fairgrounds, which hosts the Somerset County 4-H Fair each year.

In addition to parkland, another 3,253 greenway acres are preserved through county and municipal open space partnerships, as well as almost 8,900 acres of farmland.

TD Bank Ballpark in Bridgewater, which draws visitors for ballgames and its proximity to shopping and restaurants, is an example of how the county came up with a creative solution to an under-used property – the site is the redevelopment of a brownfield site (the former American Cyanamid property).

The county’s educational facilities – Rari-

tan Valley Community College and the Somerset County Vocational and Technical Schools – are among the finest in the state. The college, a two-year school in Branchburg Township, includes a library/theater complex and a planetarium.

Until 2020, New Jersey was the only state where elected county officials were called freeholders (most other states elect a county commission or county council). The term “freeholder” was a carryover term from Colonial days when only property owners, then known as freeholders, could be elected to office.

Originally one freeholder represented each municipality, but as counties grew, this became too unwieldy. Today Somerset has five commissioners elected at-large for staggered three-year terms representing the county in its entirety, and each commissioner chairs a standing committee related to human services, finance and administration, public works or public health and safety.

The position of county commissioner is part-time, but there is a full-time county administrator who attends to the day-to-day operations of county government. Many boards, commissions and advisory groups also assist the commissioners in prioritizing and making decisions on various issues.

A sampling of the services offered by the Somerset County Commissioners includes a convenient curbside recycling program, a leadership program for those interested in a community engagement, and a countywide, renewable energy program that has brought solar energy to towns and school districts.

Somerset County, among the wealthiest in the nation, is one of about 100 counties (less than 2 percent), out of more than 3,000 nationwide, to hold a triple-A bond rating, which ensures it can borrow money at the best possible rates when needed for major projects.

Somerset County is consistently recognized for its quality of life. In 2018, it was ranked as the best county for families in New Jersey (Niche.com), the best county to live in the state (Niche.com) and the 3rd healthiest in New Jersey (Robert Wood Johnson Foundation).

BERNARDS TOWNSHIP

Bernards Township was named for Sir Francis Bernard, a British Colonial governor who was educated at Oxford and was called to the bar in 1737. As Colonial governor of New Jersey, (1758-60), he did much to promote Colonial solidarity and to build defenses in the French and Indian War. An amateur architect, he was the designer of Harvard Hall at Harvard University.

The township is in Somerset County, about six miles south of Morristown, five miles north of Somerville and about 25 miles west of Newark. Covering an area of 24.5 square miles, the township includes the communities of Basking Ridge, Liberty Corner, Lyons and West Millington. The Borough of Bernardsville and Township of Harding bound it on the north. The Passaic River forms the township's eastern boundary with Long Hill Township, Morris County.

The Dead River, Warren Township and Bridgewater Township form the southern boundary and Far Hills and Bedminster Township to the west.

The Borough of Far Hills was part of the township until 1921, and the borough of Bernardsville was part until 1924.

Somerset County Park Commission's Environmental Center is located within Lord Stirling Park in the Basking Ridge section of Bernards Township. The multi-faceted build-

ing at the center offers the Great Swamp Exhibit, a swamp vivarium and an environmentally based library. A multitude of programs for all ages are presented throughout the year. Within walking distance of the center are 8.5 miles of trail system surrounded by a variety of habitats, forest, ponds, plants, wildlife and streams.

Bernards Township Library on S. Maple Avenue began sometime between 1751 and 1787 when the Presbyterian Church in Basking Ridge owned and loaned most of the books available to the community. It is said Samuel Kennedy, fourth minister at the church, lent his own books out to parishioners. His collection developed into a Sunday school library and eventually a general library evolved. Today the library offers programs for seniors, adults, teens and children.

The Bernards public school system includes Ridge High School, William Annin Middle

School and four grade K-5 elementary schools - Oak Street, Cedar Hill, Liberty Corner and Mount Prospect. Total grade K-12 enrollment now stands at about 5,730. The district completed a \$54.14 million construction project that enlarged Ridge High School, William Annin and Mount Prospect. Ridge High has a 1,000 seat auditorium, wings with nearly 20 classrooms, and a 1,400 seat gymnasium.

The United States Department of Education recognized Ridge High as a "National Blue Ribbon School." In addition to its rigorous academic offerings, the high school provides participation in 30 varsity athletic teams, many with junior varsity and freshman squads.

A voter-elected five-member Township Committee governs Bernards Township. Members annually select one of their own to be mayor.

BERNARDSVILLE

Bernardsville is located in the northernmost part of Somerset County about 12 miles south of Morristown. It sits in some of the last vestiges of the Great Eastern Forest. During the 1700s many Scottish, Irish, English and German settlers arrived in the area. Wealthy Manhattanites began building posh estates in Bernardsville after the railroad reached the town in 1872. Well-known residents have included First Lady Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, the actress Meryl Streep, Congresswoman Millicent Fenwick and bandleader Tommy Dorsey. Its 12.85 miles supports a population of about 7,808.

Known for its equestrian farms, historical mansions and recreational facilities, it was originally the Vealtown section of Bernards Township. It became a separate borough in 1924. Its name was changed to Bernardsville in 1840 and, like Bernards Township, was named in honor of the Colonial governor, Sir Francis Bernard.

The railroad line was built through Bernardsville in 1872 and played an important role in the borough's development. Borough Hall, a circa 1800 building, formerly was known as Bunn's Mill. It was operated as a gristmill, sawmill, cider mill and distillery in the mid-1800s.

Known for its equestrian farms, historical mansions and recreational facilities, Bernardsville was originally the Vealtown section of Bernards Township. Its name was changed to Bernardsville in honor of the Colonial governor, Sir Francis Bernard.

About an hour's drive from Manhattan, Bernardsville is also within 30 miles of Newark Liberty International Airport and has easy access to Interstate 287.

Children in kindergarten to grades 12 attend the Somerset Hills Regional School District serving those from Bernardsville, Far Hills and Peapack-Gladstone. The three schools, all located in Bernardsville, are Bedwell Elementary School, Ber-

The beauty of Bernardsville can be appreciated at Scherman-Hoffman Wildlife Sanctuary on Hardscrabble Road. Parts of the preserve extends into Bernards Township and Harding Township. It had its beginnings in 1965 with the donation of 125 acres by Mr. and Mrs. Harry Scherman and later in 1973

with donated parcels from Mr. G. Frederick Hoffman. The Hoffman estate house and caretaker's house were added to the sanctuary in 1981 and completed what is now 276 acres of woodland, field and floodplain habitat supporting some 200 species of wildlife.

FAR HILLS

Far Hills is small in area, but makes up for its size with its beautiful village, places of interest and the charitable events of its community-minded residents.

Encompassing nearly five square miles, the Borough of Far Hills was incorporated in 1921 and is located in the northern part of Somerset County. The borough is home to 924 residents, according to the 2020 Census.

Far Hills started to develop in the late 1880s. Anticipating a demand for country properties, Evander and Grant Schley purchased thousands of acres of farmland. Grant's wife, Elizabeth, came out by horse drawn carriage and was said to have commented on the beautiful vista of "far hills" - thus the name Far Hills was given to the area.

On land set aside for community use, Grant paid for building a village school, church, firehouse, social club and recreational area. He also built stables, barns and a grandstand at a new fairground and was responsible for organizing the Far Hills Athletic Club, the Somerset Hills Agricultural Association and Somerset Hills Bridle Path Association.

Grant was influential also in convincing the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad to build a train station in Far Hills, making the town more accessible to New York City.

Today, Far Hills offers shopping at many local businesses,

a fitness walking track at the J. Malcolm Belcher Fairgrounds and Somerset County's Leonard J. Buck Garden.

The town is well known for the annual Far Hills Race Meeting featuring world-class steeplechase races. Held each fall as a benefit for local charities at Moorland Farm on Route 202, the one-day social event attracts about 40,000 fans each year. The Essex Horse Trials are held at Moorland Farm each year.

The borough hosts the biannual Atlantic Visiting Nurse Rummage Sale, which is held at the Far Hills Fairgrounds.

The Far Hills Train station offers easy access to New York City as well as other points of interest.

The Far Hills-Bedminster Fire Department and First Aid Squad serve the residents of both Far Hills and Bedminster. Far Hills is a member of the Somerset Hills Regional School District with children attending public schools in neighboring Bernardsville.

Far Hills celebrated its 100th anniversary on May 15, 2021, culminating with the burial of a time-capsule on the grounds of the municipal building which is scheduled to be opened in 50 years.

The governing body of Far Hills consists of a voter-elected Mayor and a Borough Council with six elected members.

The Far Hills Municipal Building and Police Department are both located at 6 Prospect St.

PEAPACK-GLADSTONE

Peapack-Gladstone, a little town with two villages, often is referred to as the twin borough. Its 5.9 square miles has a population of about 2,500. It is located on the northern end of Somerset County in the Somerset Hills on the North Branch of the Raritan River.

Legend says the name Peapack came from a dialect used by the Lenni Lenape Indians. A village called "Peppcock," meaning, pond, is mentioned in a deed for a large tract of land sold by the Lenapes to the settlers. Another reference says the name was derived from an Indian term for "water roots." The village of Gladstone got its name from William Gladstone, an English prime minister.

The villages of Peapack and Gladstone merged to form the borough in 1912 when residents voted to separate from Bedminster Township. Peapack celebrated its 100th anniversary in 2012. The center of the borough is Liberty Park. A pond, war memorial monuments and tot playground are features of the park, located across Main Street from the municipal building.

Peapack is the southern village with a small shopping area, a train station, post office and small cottages situated around Main Street. Gladstone, a mirror

image, is the northern village. It too has a small shopping area, train and post office, but with larger Victorian homes clustered around Main Street.

Peapack-Gladstone consists also of historic and estate homes, expensive developments and horse properties. It is about 10 miles north of the intersection of interstates 287 and 78.

Children in kindergarten through grade 12 attend Somerset Hills Regional School District schools in Bernardsville.

The borough provides helpful services for its residents, including a transportation bus for senior citizens 55 years and older. The bus operates Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday for grocery shopping, doctor visits, trips to the mall and other activities. The charge is \$1 per trip. Also of interest is the General Assistance Program offering cash assistance for needy adult residents who are not eligible for any other federal or state assistance program.

Located in Peapack-Gladstone, the Natirar Estate estate formerly owned by the King of Morocco was purchased by the Somerset County Improvement Authority. About 403 acres of the estate is maintained as open space, offering such activities hiking, horseback

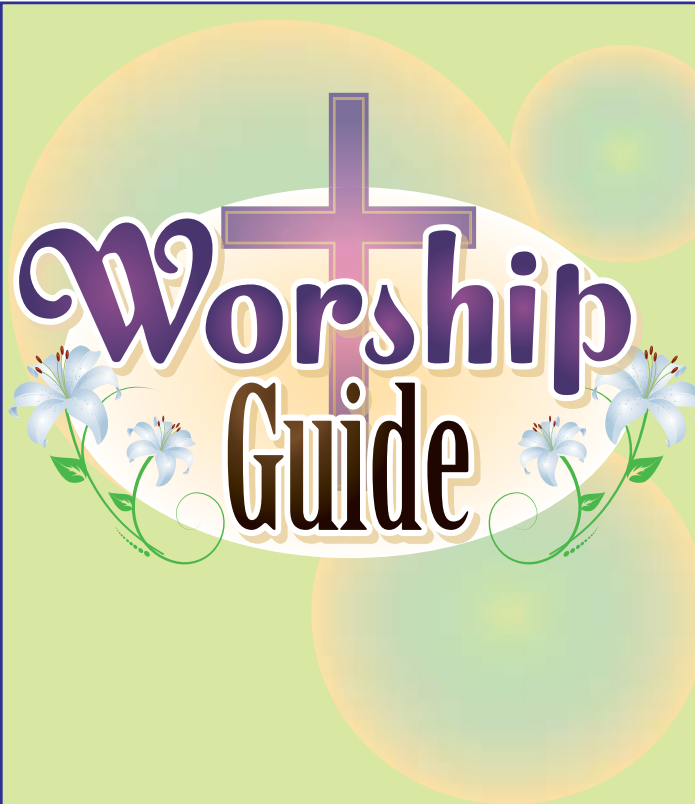
