Bottle Hill Day has it all

Madison's fall festival takes place Saturday

MADISON – This year marks the 49th anniversary of Bottle Hill Day.

This event has continued to grow every year since it was first established in 1974 by Mayor Elizabeth Baumgartner to promote the business district. It is named for Madison's original establishment in 1715 as the village of "Bottle Hill."

In addition, as in years past, the Madison Area Chamber of Commerce and Madison Patrolmen's Benevolent Association (PBA) Local 92 will host its 29th annual Madison Car Show at 9 a.m. at the Madison Volunteer Ambulance Corps., 29 Prospect St.

Over the years, it has grown, evolving into a family, entertainment, and community celebration, which draws between 10,000 and 20,000 people to the heart of Madison every fall. This event is free and open to the public.

With the expansion a few years ago onto Kings Road, this rain or shine street festival now spans over six blocks. It includes sidewalk sales, four stages with live music, three Amusement Areas, food, and more than 225 vendors, including non-profits, crafters, retail businesses, etc.

There will be great food options, including the Food Court on the corner of Central

Other Activities: The Presbyterian Church of Madison will once again host a Petting Zoo & Pony Rides at the church at 18 Green Ave.



Additional event parking will be available at the Madison Junior School parking lots, which are accessible via Brittin Street (behind the school). The Kings Road Parking Lot behind the Public Safety Building will be open for public parking. Street parking, where allowed, will be available as well. Main Street remains open all day.







Madison's Rosewood Band To Be 'Featured Attraction'

MADISON – Borough-based band Rosewood will perform again at Bottle Hill Day this year, and they will take the stage from 2:40 to 3:30 p.m. at the Hartley Dodge Memorial Stage at 50 Kings Road Saturday, Oct. 5.

On lead vocals for Rosewood is Madison resident Mary McManus, and on guitar is her husband John McManus.

Rosewood, who has been playing at Bottle Hill Day for about 15 years, plays pop and rock from around the 1960s to today, Mary McManus said. The band also performs a lot of Fleetwood Mac and the Pretenders, she said.

Phil Duffy, the chair of the Bottle Hill Day Music Committee, said Rosewood is an excellent band.

"Rosewood is always the featured attraction," Duffy said.

"What we try to do is some of the bands that play often, especially guys on the committee, have tried to take a year off and give other bands a chance and that sort of thing, but a band that typically, we never like to see sit is Rosewood. Rosewood's a very popular band in town. They're in some sense, the parent of the Madison rock band community in town."



MADISON – Members of the First Baptist Church of Madison will support their food pantry by serving some of Bottle Hill Day's favorite foods at the church at 36 Cook Ave. Saturday, Oct. 5.

Food for sale includes fried whiting fish filet, barbecued ribs, pulled pork sandwiches topped with coleslaw, mac and cheese, and collard greens.

Church members will also hold a bake sale with dessert items which could include pies, cookies and brownies.

The menu has stayed the same for at least the past 10 years, according to church Trustee Eddy Sallie who handles the logistics of the food sale at Bottle Hill Day.

"Because people walk off of the main drag of Bottle Hill Day to come up to the church," Sallie said.

"The Word says that we are to go out and make disciples, and we're about interacting with the community," Sallie said.

"And that's where the food pantry comes in, and where we think there's need, we like to interact with the people to kind of supply that need wherever we can. But we like it because it's community. It involves community."
