

ESSEX COUNTY: CENTER FOR CULTURE, COMMERCE

Essex County Hall of Records, 465 Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd., Newark, N.J.

Essex County, within its 129.56 square miles, contains 22 municipalities. Caldwell, Essex Fells, Fairfield, North Caldwell, Roseland and West Caldwell are in its northwestern sector.

The counties that adjoin Essex are Passaic on the north, Bergen and Hudson to the east, Union on the south, with Morris spanning its western border.

As of 2020, Essex County's Census-estimated population was 854,917.

The median household income according to the 2020 census was \$63,959.

The county's 6,000-acre park system, created in 1895, is the first county park system established in the country. Frederick Law Olmstead designed Branch Brook Park in Newark, which was the first to open. It is included on the National and State Historic Registers.

Olmstead's landscape architectural firm designed most of the other parks in the system. With 5,300 cherry blossom trees, Branch Brook Park has more trees and a greater variety than Washington, D.C.

Animal lovers can visit Turtle Back Zoo, West Orange, while ice skaters can glide through the Richard J. Codey Arena at South Mountain (formerly South Mountain Arena) next door. A 12,000 square-foot education building at the zoo has provided additional classroom space and a new entrance.

The South Mountain Recreation Complex includes a 2.7-mile walkway around the Orange Reservoir, seasonal paddle boating, a playground, picnic pavilion and a restaurant.

Golfers have the choice of public county golf courses in Belleville, Newark and West Orange, or a miniature golf course and driving range in Roseland.

The Essex County Environmental Center in Roseland runs year-round

conservation programs for the general public and for school children.

Architect Cass Gilbert, who designed the U.S. Supreme Court Building in Washington, D.C., also designed the renovated Historic Essex County Courthouse on W. Market Street, Newark.

Restored also, in front of the courthouse, is a larger-than-life sculpture of a weary Abraham Lincoln resting on a bench. He has removed his top hat and it rests beside him. Gutzon Borglum created this sculpture. He also carved out Mount Rushmore.

Thomas Alva Edison filmed the first motion pictures in his Black Maria studio, which is well worth a visit at the Edison National Historic Site, West Orange.

Also fascinating is his "invention factory" complex next to it and his home in a nearby residential park.

Grover Cleveland, who was elected the 22nd president of the United States and served for two non-consecutive terms, was born in Caldwell in a house that is now a historic site on Bloomfield Avenue.

Internationally known performers regularly appear on the stage at the N.J. Performing Arts Center in Newark, while Broadway shows frequently appear at the Paper Mill Playhouse, Millburn.

And the Prudential Center in Newark, also known as "The Rock," is home to the National Hockey League's New Jersey Devils.

New exhibits continually rotate through Newark Museum and Montclair Art Museum.

Transit

The Port Authority of N.Y. and N.J. operates Newark Liberty International Airport and the Newark-Elizabeth Marine Terminal.

The county center is 12 miles from New York City and two hours from Philadelphia. Eleven major highways plus N.J. Transit trains and buses traverse Essex County.

The Port Authority of N.Y. and N.J. also provides PATH subway service from Penn Station, Newark, to midtown and lower Manhattan, while N.J. Transit's 4.3-mile Newark Subway and light rail system links Newark's northern suburbs with Penn Station, Newark, and to Amtrak trains serving the Northeastern Corridor.

About 75 percent of the county is zoned for residential development, except in large municipalities like Newark, where commerce and industry prevail.

The chance for enlightenment abounds in Essex County at Seton Hall University, Bloomfield College, Caldwell University, Essex County College, Rutgers University, Montclair State University, University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey, and N.J. Institute of Technology.

The County Executive is Joseph N. DiVincenzo Jr. who in November 2022 was re-elected to a four-year term that expires Dec. 31, 2026.

BOROUGH OF CALDWELL

The Borough of Caldwell covers a 1.2-square-mile area extending to North Caldwell on the east, West Caldwell to the north and west, and Essex Fells plus a small slice of West Caldwell on the south.

In the 18th century, what is now Caldwell had been the business and trading hub of the Horseneck Tract, on which this hub and several other communities combined to form Caldwell Township in 1798. The commercial and residential nucleus of that wide area incorporated separately as the Borough of Caldwell in 1892.

The name "Caldwell" honors the Rev. James Caldwell, the "Fighting Parson" of the Revolutionary War. A congregation of Presbyterians formed here in 1784, and their landmark First Presbyterian Church building, which dominates the center of town, dates from 1887. In 1837, a pastor of that congregation became the father of Grover Cleveland, the only U.S. president born in New Jersey. His birthplace, now a N.J. state museum, sits on Bloomfield Avenue, two blocks east of the First Presbyterian Church, next to St. Aloysius Church.

The shopping and commercial area extends along Bloomfield Avenue, which also is the site of apartment and condominium complexes.

Single-family houses predominate in the borough,

along with a number of multi-family homes. One grades K-5 elementary school and one 6-8 middle school are part of a six-building, grades K-12 public school district shared with West Caldwell. Dominican nuns founded Caldwell College here in 1939 to provide higher learning for women; today it is coed.

The Caldwell Public Library building is currently closed due to damage from flooding. The library is fully open in temporary trailers at 24 D Smull Ave. in Caldwell.

Famed landscape architect Frederick Law Olmstead designed Essex County's recently refurbished, 42-acre Grover Cleveland Park, located in a vale in the borough, adjacent to The Cedars section of Caldwell that has a variety of single-family houses strung along

ESSEX FELS

The Borough of Essex Fells, the community with the smallest population in Essex County, covers a 1.3-square-mile area extending to Verona and West Orange to the east, the Caldwells to the north and west, and Roseland on the south. The latest U.S. Census recorded a 2,248 population.

Much of the current borough's original land belonged to the Samuel Gould family farm. In 1889, Anthony S. Drexel of Philadelphia purchased 1,000 acres from the estate of William J. Gould, who had been a captain in the Revolutionary War and a general in the War of 1812, and developed it as one of the first planned suburban developments in the United States.

After joining other communities in the Horseneck Tract in 1798 to form Caldwell Township, Essex Fells separated to incorporate as a borough March 31, 1902.

Drexel's son-in-law, John F. Fell, was the main stockholder in his father-in-law's New York Suburban Land Co., which sold houses in Essex Fells by touting the community as "one of the three healthiest places in the United States," located as it is in the nearest mountain district to New York City.

The borough's appellation – tricking some, who mistakenly send letters to residents

addressed "Essex Falls" – is a composite of Fell's name, the county, and what the British call a hill or down.

Rail service to Essex Fells, which started in 1892, spurred development. The passenger line ended in 1966, followed by the demise of freight service 10 years later.

Essex Fells, virtually residential throughout with single-family homes on large lots, also includes a post office, a grades K-6 public elementary school, a country club and the Essex Fells Water Co.

Students in grades 7 to 8 attend West Essex Middle School and grades 9-12 attend West Essex High School, both in North Caldwell.

The Glen, an area behind Essex Fells School, contains native trees, shrubs, vines and flowers. The Trotter Tract, at the entrance to Oak Lane, is 83 acres of indigenous plants and wildlife.

Each autumn, the borough dams a brook running through a meadow at the corner of Forest Way and Fells Road to form a skating pond, adjacent to platform tennis courts.

A mayor and council govern Essex Fells. They meet at 7 p.m. on the third Tuesday of each month for a business session and at 7 p.m. the first Tuesday for a conference session at the municipal building, 255 Roseland Ave.

FAIRFIELD TOWNSHIP

The Township of Fairfield covers 10.45 square miles extending to North Caldwell on the east, West Caldwell to the south, and to the Passaic River, which separates it from the Morris County communities of Montville on the west and Lincoln Park and Wayne in Passaic County on the north.

The latest U.S. Census recorded a population of 7,818 residents that soars during the day because of the township's many commercial establishments, offices and light industries that line Route 46 and Interstate 80, which traverse the township.

In the 18th century, Fairfield was part of what was known as the Horseneck Tract, on which several communities joined to form Caldwell Township in 1798. In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, sections of the township separated to become individual municipalities.

What remained of Caldwell Township changed its name to Fairfield on Nov. 5, 1963.

The first European settlers were the Dutch in 1669. They named their community "Gansegat" – Dutch for "duck's pond." The English followed in 1699.

In 1720, the Dutch Reformed Church Society formed, and there is still a Dutch Reformed Church in Fairfield.

War, the town was a major crossroads for Tories and militia, and Gen. George Washington passed through on at least one occasion.

NORTH CALDWELL

The Borough of North Caldwell covers a 2.99-square-mile area extending to Cedar Grove and Verona on the east, Essex Fells and Caldwell to the south, West Caldwell and Fairfield to the west, and the Passaic County community of Little Falls on the north. The latest U.S. Census recorded a 6,625 population.

In the 18th century, North Caldwell was part of what was known as the Horse-neck Tract, on which several communities joined to form Caldwell Township in 1798.

On March 31, 1898, the area now North Caldwell split off from the township to become a separate borough.

Sitting atop the northern end of Second Mountain in the Watchung Range, North Caldwell once had an abundance of oak and hickory trees that attracted early colonial settlers. After deforestation, farmers arrived.

The mountain air also attracted tourists in the early 1800s to lodge in the many

boarding houses built here at the time. Hendrick Bush held title to a large tract of land, thus the area was known as Bushtown for many years.

Grandview Park, one of the earliest amusement parks in New Jersey, once made the borough its home. Many in the public eye also lived in North Caldwell over the years, including opera star Ernestine Schumann-Heink, former New Jersey Gov. Edward I. Edwards, artist Lawrence Wilbur, former New Jersey Secretary of State Jane Burgio, mentalist Kreskin, and Wilbur's son, Richard, who as a poet won a Pulitzer Prize for poetry in 1957 and 1989.

Two small strips of stores at the north and south ends of the borough provide its only retail activity. West Essex Middle School and West Essex High School in North Caldwell educate students in grades seven to 12 from this borough, plus those from Essex Fells, Roseland and Fair-

ROSELAND

The Borough of Roseland covers a 3.52-square-mile area extending to West Orange on the east, Essex Fells and West Caldwell to the north, Livingston to the south, and the Morris County community of East Hanover on the west across the Passaic River.

The latest U.S. Census recorded a 6,219 population

In 1968, three boys in town discovered fossilized tracks that indicated the population at one time included dinosaurs.

In the 18th century, Roseland was an area within the Horseneck Tract called South Caldwell. In 1813, it became the Centreville section of Livingston Township. But in 1873, when residents wanted their own post office and one named Centreville existed in Hunterdon County, residents took Sarah Condit Harrison's advice and called it Roselyn.

A subsequent spelling change renamed it Roseland. In quest of local school control, Roseland separated from Livingston to become a unique municipality April 10, 1908.

Shoemaking was a prime industry here from the early 1800s through the Civil War. The Roseland Historical Society maintains the Harrison House, which tanner and War of 1812 veteran Amos Williams built in the 1820s.

In quest of local school control, Roseland separated from Livingston to become a unique municipality April 10, 1908.

Farming took over when the war ended, with Henry Becker's dairy farm growing to 1,200 acres – one-third of the borough.

In 1938, a miniature live-steam railroad started carrying children and parents through much of the Becker acreage until the farm was sold for corporate and small-office development in 1972. It subsequently attracted many law firms.

A small central shopping area extends west along Eagle Rock Avenue from the junction of Roseland Avenue, while a strip mall stands along Eisenhower Parkway just south of the Eagle Rock Avenue junction.

Although single-family homes predominate in the borough, several large condominium complexes have been built, with the newest one burgeoning between Harrison and Passaic avenues.

Roseland is home to a pub-

lic library; a grades K-6 elementary school sending students in grades 7 to 12 to the West Essex Middle School and West Essex High School, both in North Caldwell; and a recreational center featuring tennis, basketball, pickleball and volleyball courts and three baseball fields.

WEST CALDWELL TOWNSHIP

West Caldwell covers a 5.05-square-mile area with the latest population recorded as 10,876.

What is now West Caldwell had been known as Franklin and Westville, which banded with other communities in the Horse-neck Tract in 1798 to form Caldwell Township.

During the early 1900s, many localities separated from the original township. Franklin and Westville left in 1904 to incorporate as West Caldwell, with Caleb Crane becoming the first mayor.

Historical homes of the Crane and Harrison families, who owned much of Westville, are still standing, including the Zenas Crane Homestead on Westville Avenue, where the Historical Society of West Caldwell meets.

Franklin, however, had been a commercial area with a store, two factories, a cider mill and distillery.

West Caldwell today continues with that residential-commercial mix. The West Essex Industrial Park, dating from the 1970s, and other sites for light industry are home to more than 15 major U.S. and international companies, including a cable TV studio.

The municipal economy achieves balance through

residential developments of primarily single-family homes that account for about 60 percent of West Caldwell's ratables.

The township also has condominiums, a nursing home and senior housing with assisted living available.

There are six parks, two community swimming pools and a public library.

A concert series is held in Crane Park each summer. In addition, West Caldwell administers a recreation program for its citizens and those of Caldwell.

The township also shares a common school district with Caldwell.
