City Ordinance.

An ordinance defining the limits of Bear River City 1st, Be it ordained by the Common Council of Bear River City that the limits of said city shall be one mile square, radiating from the space platted by the

2d, That it shall be unlawful for any person to carry concealed weapons of any kind within the orporate limits of said city.

8d, That it shall be the duty of the police officers to notify any person wearing or carrying pistels, revolvers or other deadly weapons within the corporate limits of the city; that it is contrary to the ordinance of said city, and that if any person or persons shall continue to carry such weapons after such notifica-tion, such person shall forfeit and pay a fine in a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars. 4th, That it shall be unlawful for any person to discharge any fire arms, air gun or other deadly weapons within the corporate limits.

5th, That it shall be unlawful for any person to be on the streets or in any public place in said city under the influence of intoxicating liquors.
6th, That it shall be unlawful for any person to make loud or unusual noises, or to behave in a bois-

terous or uncivil manner, or in any way disturb the peace of the citizens of said city.
7th, That it shall be unlawful for any person to make an indecent exposure of their person in any street or other public place. Sth, That any person found guilty of any of the above named offences shall forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars. 9th, That when a person is convicted and senten-zed to pay a fine for violating any of the ordinances of said city, in case of inability or refusal to pay such fines, such person shall be made to labor upon the streets or other bublic works until such fine and cost is paid. That such person shall be allowed for each and every day of eight hours service the sum of

one dollar and board, at the expense of the city. That such labor shall be done under the instruction f the City Marshal. 10th, That it shall be the duty of the City Marshal. his deputy or any regular policeman to arrest any person committing any of the above named offences and take him or her before the proper officers to be dealt with according to law.

In accordance with the provsion of the law in such cases made and provided, (this being a case of imergency) it is ordered that the above ordinances be in full force and effect from and after the date of its

But from these parts they strike straight across the South Seas to San Biego, where there is fourteen miles of deep wharfage in a habor better protected, and entered with less difficulty during storms and fogs, than San Francisco.
