

Homemade salted pecans

- 1 pound raw pecan halves
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 1-2 teaspoons salt

Optional: hot pepper sauce to taste

Preheat oven to 300 degrees F. Melt butter and pour over pecans in a bowl. Add salt and mix thoroughly.

Spread in a single layer on baking sheet. Cook for 10 minutes. Stir and turn pecans. Bake a few more minutes, watching closely and turning as needed. Remove from oven when fragrance and color get slightly toasty. Do not overbake.

King was 'a positive force' for festival and community

The N.C. Pecan Harvest Festival Committee issued a heartfelt tribute to Suzanne McKeel King, one of the festival's founding members, after she died in March. The following comments are edited highlights from that message.

"Suzanne dedicated her time, energy, resources and unwavering commitment to her family, friends, acquaintances, businesses, organizations, Whiteville and Columbus County. The festival owes much of its success to Suzanne's involvement.

"Even after she asked to take a back seat in the planning process three years ago, she continued to work in the background to ensure that events were executed with traditional pride and beauty.

"Suzanne was instrumental in shifting some of the festival's focus as times changed, and her contributions helped the festival bid farewell to the Queen, Luncheon, Pecan Belles and Home Tour in 2022. Even in 2023, when Charlie Duncan became ill, Suzanne helped execute the parade flawlessly with Charlie's notes, a few phone calls and a bullhorn, plus the help of her husband Billy and Allen Buffkin.

"After the parade, Suzanne and Billy sold T-shirts at the festival, putting Suzanne right where she wanted to be, close to the stage and in the middle of the thousands of people enjoying the festival, which she had helped make a success year after year.

"The committee never imagined that the 2023 N.C. Pecan Harvest Festival would be the last festival we would have the privilege to share with Suzanne. But we would not have changed the festival's execution had we known. We again experienced Suzanne as a positive force and cheerleader of Whiteville and Columbus County.

"After the conclusion of the 2023 festival, the committee discussed implementing further changes to allow the festival to continue to improve and grow. Suzanne often told us that everything happens in cycles, and we must grow and change to remain relevant and highlight the beautiful town she was known to represent as Mrs. Whiteville.

"We hope you will join us in honoring Suzanne's memory and her love of community by volunteering to make Whiteville and Columbus County a better place. If we can capture a small part of her energy, positivity and amazing ability to make whoever she bumped into feel like the most important person in the world, we will leave the world better than we found it—just as she did."

 - · Race your family and friends around the "Nut Gathering Track"




Permanent installations at the museum include fossils and wildlife-focused displays, a play and story area, hands-on exploration tables with scientific equipment and more.
