

Popular entertainer Greg Thompson returns as MC

"I always look forward to the Columbus County Fair, whether I am attending as a fair goer or working on stage," said Greg Thompson, master of ceremonies for the 2022 fair. "It's a great place to catch up with old friends and make new ones."

With upgrades to the main stage area, "It's going to be a new experience for everyone coming to see the great entertainment they have lined up," Thompson said.

Thompson also praises the fair's off-stage acts. "I work the same Fair Circuit as Circus Incredible and look forward to seeing Simon Arestov and Lyric Wallenda perform a very exciting show," he said.

Audiences will recognize Thompson as the roving storyteller, banjo player, clogger and Austin Powers impersonator who emceed the 2021 stage entertainment. Thompson is an agent for celebrity impersonators across the U.S., and

last year he stumped the panel of the TV show "To Tell The Truth."

But he says that, "Performing on my very own stage with Abby the Spoon Lady was a highlight in my entertainment career."

That memorable moment occurred at Thompson's Brown Street Station venue in Chadbourn. Since last year, he has produced music and comedy shows and hosted fundraisers and social events there. Besides Abby the spoon lady, "We've had

two dueling Piano shows," he said, along with "Them Sweeney Boys, who have performed at the county fair before."

Thompson once composed a song about his favorite fair food, corn dogs. "I'll be having one corn dog during the fair," he said. "That's all I allow myself to have or else I have to buy all new stage clothes all the time.

"But I'm hoping to get a collard sandwich while I'm there."

The Chadbourn native was a West Columbus High School senior already working as a radio disc jockey when the fair resumed in 1980. "The first couple of years of the fair I actually performed with my clogging team, the Strawberry Cloggers," Thompson said. He was master of ceremonies "for a couple of years" during the 1980s, he said. In subsequent years, he returned occasionally to share emceeing duties with Dale McPherson.

Fair licensed, rides inspected

The Columbus County Agriculture Fair is approved and licensed by the N.C. Department of Agriculture and is a member of the N.C. Association of Agriculture Fairs and International Association of Fairs and Expositions.

Midway rides provided by Dreamland Amusements are inspected by the N.C. Department of Labor.

The Columbus County Agriculture Fair began in 1980, 50 years after the last County Fair had been held in Columbus County. It was a project of the Columbus County Law Enforcement Officers Association. The first fair was completely dependent upon big circus tents, but as time passed nice buildings were built to house the commercial and educational booths, livestock barn and food stand. In more recent years an old building was remodeled to serve as the fair's office building.

Early on, the fair board asked the public to help give the fair a suitable motto, and a contest was held. The fair board liked "It's A Family A-Fair," so that became the motto.

Several years ago the fair called on the public again to choose a name for the fair's mascot, a gigantic fiberglass rooster who stood sentinel on the fairgrounds. "Fearless Fair-ley" was the name chosen by the fair board.






Dreamland provides rides for family fun

Dreamland Amusements has been providing exciting rides Amusements mailer designed especially for children and adults for the Columbus County Fair for many years, and their rides spend winters right here in Columbus County. The company has a 15-acre winter headquarters in downtown Delco, 15 miles west of Wilmington, where the equipment is stored until spring.

The rides then go on the road, traveling from New Hampshire to Miami, Fla., supplying rides, games and food stands for county and state fairs and also playing concert dates. The equipment has been featured in TV ads, at many private parties, corporate rentals and concert dates. The company supplies silent generators, benches and covered seating areas. At many fairs Dreamland Amusements does an extensive landscaping package. The company markets its events through cable TV, radio, coupon distribution as well as a custom Dreamland

for its demographics.

When their event has ended, the Dreamlands staff does a thorough cleanup of the grounds, leaving them as they

If you haven't met Flimsey, introduce yourself.



Demo derby Friday, Saturday nights



One of the most popular and exciting events at the County Fair is the Demolition Derby, held annually on Friday and Saturday nights, beginning at 7 p.m.

Registration will be from 4 to 6:30 p.m. at the track, and there are no entry fees. There are four classes of vehicles, 4-cylinder class (small car), 6-cylinder class (up to 3,500 lbs.), 8-cylinder class (3,501 lbs. & up) and pro class (any cylinder).

4-cylinder class, 6-cylinder class and 8-cylinder class

- 1. Any stock hard top automobile or station wagon is allowed.
- 2. Safety belts and safety helmets with goggles or shield are required.
- 3. All glass must be removed except windshield. If windshield is removed a center bar is required.

- 4. All decorative chrome must be removed, door handles may be left on.
- 5. Gas tanks are to be inside of car, six gallon tanks (plastic or metal). Tanks must be properly secured and covered.

Original tanks must have holes punched in them and flushed clear of gas, or be removed from car.

- 6. No special bumpers, trailer hitches, reinforcements or added weight are allowed on any part of the vehicle. *Bumpers shocks can be removed and the bumper welded*.
- 7. Doors should be welded or chained. If welded, must be in 4-inch welds.
- 8. Trunks should be chained shut or welded by 4-inch welds. Hoods can use 5/8-inch bolt or chained. Tailgates of wagons should be chained or welded so as

not to open during heat.

- 9. All sun visors, windshield blades and headliners must be removed.
- 10. Fenders may be cut for wheel clearance only.
- 11. Batteries should be secured inside vehicle and covered with tarp or heavy material to prevent explo-
- 12. No solid white cars accepted!! Cars may be deco-

rated in any manner as long as it is in good taste.

"only" Driver's door should be painted "white" for derby number to be applied at registration. Numbers issued on first come first serve basis.

- 13. Tires filled with air "only."
- 14. Radiators must remain in their original position.
- 15. Drivers, "DO NOT"

leave vehicle unless instructed to do so by derby flagman!

Leaving vehicle is disqualification. "Stay with car until it has been removed from the track."

16. Any car catching fire that stops the event is automatically disqualified for that heat.

Demo Derby Pro Class Rules

- 1. Any stock hard top automobile or station wagon is allowed.
- 2. Safety belts and safety helmets with goggles or shield are required.
- 3. All glass must be removed except windshield. If windshield is removed a center bar is required.
- 4. All decorative chrome, must be removed, door handles may be left on.
- 5. Gas tanks are to be inside of car, six gallon tanks (plastic or metal). Tanks must be properly secured and covered.

Original tanks must have holes punched in them and flushed clear of gas, or be removed from car.

- 6. No trailer hitches, **bumpers can be removed and the bumper welded**.
- 7. Doors should be welded or chained, if welded must be in 4" welds.
- 8. Trunks should be chained shut or welded by 4" welds. Hoods can use 5/8 inch bolt or chained.

Tailgates of wagons should be chained or welded

so as not to open during heat.

- 9. All sun visors, windshield blades, and headliners must be removed.
- 10. Fenders may be cut for wheel clearance only. Height of vehicle must not be over (24 inches) from bottom of bumper to ground.
- 11. Batteries should be secured inside vehicle and covered with tarp or heavy material to prevent explosion.
- 12. No solid white cars accepted!! Cars may be decorated in any manner as long as it is in good taste.

Drivers door "only" should be painted "white" for derby number to be applied at registration.

Numbers on first come first serve basis.

- 13. Any size tires, four point role cage / bars are acceptable. No hump plates or kickers!!
- 14. Radiators must remain in their original position.

15. Drivers "DO NOT" leave vehicle unless instructed to do so by derby flagman!!

Leaving vehicle is disqualification "stay with car until it has been removed from the track".

- 16. Any car catching fire that stops the event is automatically disqualified for that heat.
- 17. All cars must immediately stop at the sound of horn / light / or flagman.
- 18. All hoods & trunks must have a 12" in diameter hole cut for safety.
- 19. No larger than ¾ treaded bolts for chassis & body

The bargain is only \$40 for a carload, including armbands and unlimited rides.


Upon entering fairgrounds parking, each driver will receive a number representing the number of people in their vehicle.

How to enter exhibits at the Columbus County Agriculture Fair

Exhibitor's Rules and Agreement

- 1. Exhibitors' entries will be accepted for registration at the Exhibit Building on Friday before the fair from noon-4 p.m. and on Saturday from 10–4 p.m. No other entries will be accepted after 4 p.m. Saturday. Cakes will be accepted Monday at 9 a.m. Judging will take place Monday.
- 2. All articles must have been prepared, made or grown by the exhibitor within the last 12 months.
- 3. All entries must be registered with the clerks in charge of registration at the Exhibit Building. All exhibits on display must remain in the Exhibit Building throughout the fair week. Articles may be reclaimed by the owner (ticket holder) following the fair on Monday from 9 a.m.–5 p.m. Any article removed from the Exhibit Building before Monday will forfeit any cash prize awarded to said article.
- 4. Exhibits will not be accepted by mail or public transportation.
- 5. Exhibitors must see to the proper delivery of any article or livestock on the

grounds and the proper care to the latter, as no charge for transportation of drayage will be paid by the fair.

- 6. All entries will be numbered and recorded in the book of entry of the proper department. Entry tags will be issued, bearing entry number and exhibit number - tag to be attached to the exhibit and the stub retained by the exhibitor and presented on Monday when the exhibit is called for. These claim checks are your proof that you have entered all your exhibits as required. There will be categories in which there may be a youth and adult entry. The designation "Y" will be added to the letter category for youth.
- 7. Any and all articles judged by the registrar to be obnoxious or repulsive in character will be forbidden entry, or, if entered without being fully known, shall be removed at once.
- 8. The right is reserved to place an exhibit in its proper class if it has been incorrectly entered.
- 9. All entries should be for the first premium of the premium number, under which

they are entered. Failing to take the first, entries shall compete for the second, if second is offered, but shall not be awarded more than one premium under the same number

- 10. No article or animal will be entitled to space until the proper entry has been made. Space is limited. (All entries will be accepted in order of receipt until all available space is filled. In any case all entries must be received by the date specified under each department and when all space is filled, the management reserves the right to refuse entries, even if received before the specified date.
- 11. The management reserves the right to withhold premiums in any case in which it shall appear to them that the regulations have not been complied with, or that fraud has been practiced. Anyone wanting to enter a complaint should do so in writing, not later than noon Tuesday, the opening day of the fair.
- 12. Should any person misrepresent his/her exhibit and a premium be awarded upon

it, such premium will be withheld by the management.

13. Payment of premiums awarded: Premiums will be paid by check at the end if the fair week. All checks are void after Nov. 15 Winners assume the responsibility of claiming their checks at the exhibit building between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday after the fair when they pick up their exhibits.

Competition is open to all residents of Columbus, Bladen and Brunswick counties and by special permission to other residents of North and South Carolina. All articles shall have been grown, made or prepared by the exhibitor unless otherwise specified in the rules.

All articles which are the product of the soil must be entered in the name of the producer. Those showing handiwork or skill must be entered in the name of the one whose skill they represent. Such may be individuals, firms or factories. Failure to comply with this rule will bar violators from competing for any premiums whatsoever and render them and their exhib-

its liable for expulsion from the grounds.

When an individual exhibit made from a farm wins first premium, an exhibit of the same kind from the same farm cannot win the second or third premium. Example: a farm is awarded first prize for corn. That same farm cannot win second or third prizes for corn (even if in a different name).

Exhibitors may make only one entry in each class: No exceptions.


No person will be allowed to see the entries or to have access to the entry book until after the awards have been made.

Notice - The fair assumes no responsibility in cases of loss or damage to stock or other exhibits from any cause, and upon this condition only are all entries received.

A sweepstakes prize of \$100 will be awarded to the winner of the most blue ribbons, \$75 for second place, \$50 for third place and \$25 for fourth place.
