



“Allen Law Group to Donate 1,200 Thanksgiving Meals to Families Across Northwest Indiana”

CHESTERTON, Ind. — More than a thousand families across Northwest Indiana will have a reason to give thanks this holiday season, thanks to the generosity of the Allen Law Group.

The firm, led by injury attorney Kenneth J. Allen, is continuing its long-standing tradition of providing free Thanksgiving meals to households in need. Since 1994, the group has donated full holiday dinners that include a whole turkey, mashed potatoes, vegetables and pumpkin or fruit pie.

This year, volunteers and staff from the Food Bank of Northwest Indiana will coordinate the distribution of 1,200 meals. The first giveaway will take place Friday, Nov. 21, from 3 to 5 p.m. at Allen Law Group’s new flagship location at 501 Allen Court in Chesterton. The second event will be held Saturday, Nov. 22, from 9 to 11 a.m. at the Food Bank of Northwest Indiana, 6490 Broadway in Merrillville.

“Thanksgiving should be a joyful time for all. But sometimes families face real hardship, and that’s especially true now with the high cost of food,” Allen said. “We’ve been blessed at Allen
