JOINT ORDER CANCELLING TECHNICAL SESSION

Whereas, IC 2-2.1-1-2.5 provides for the General Assembly to convene a First Regular Technical Session on the second Tuesday after the first Monday in June of each odd-numbered year, which in Calendar Year 2025 is June 10;

Whereas, the stated statutory purpose of the First Regular Technical Session is to consider and act upon:

- (1) Bills enacted during the First Regular Session vetoed by the Governor;*
- (2) Bills to correct conflicts among bills enacted during the First Regular Session; and*
- (3) Bills to correct technical errors in bills enacted during the First Regular Session;*

Whereas, IC 2-2.1-1-2.5 provides that the First Regular Technical Session is not required to convene if the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate jointly issue an order finding that the purposes for which a First Regular Technical Session may meet do not justify the cost and inconvenience of meeting in a First Regular Technical Session;

Whereas, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate have reviewed the need for a First Regular Technical Session in Calendar Year 2025 in light of the cost and inconvenience of the meeting; and


Whereas, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate have determined that the cost and inconvenience of meeting does not justify convening a First Regular Technical Session in Calendar Year 2025;

Therefore,

SECTION 1. The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President Pro Tempore issue this Joint Order cancelling the First Regular Technical Session for Calendar Year 2025.
