Crown Point Parents and Guardians,

Crown Point Community School Corporation will be transitioning to Green as described in our Back to School plan for the 2020-2021 school year. In Green, all school buildings are open for students choosing in-person learning. Students learning remotely will be provided lessons, assignments, and assessments to accomplish the same learning goals of in-school classmates, as they have since the start of the school year.

The data and information we have received over the last several weeks is the basis for the decision to transition to full in-person learning in our schools. We will continue to offer our parents the choice of sending their children to school or participating in distance learning. Parents/guardians will have the opportunity to decide which way they would like for their children to receive instruction. This evening, a survey link will be sent to our parents so they can indicate their choice. We ask that all parents/guardians complete this survey by end of business on Friday, September 25th.

As parents/guardians consider their choice, I want to bring a few things to your attention. In a Green setting, we will not be able to adhere to social distancing guidelines and because of this there will be few opportunities for our students to have mask breaks.

Our timeline for the transition to Green:

- Elementary schools (K-5) will begin Green instruction on October 12th.
- Secondary schools (6-12) will begin Green instruction on October 28th.
- The one-hour delay schedule will end for all schools on October 9th and beginning October 12th all schools will begin at their normal times.
 - Elementary schools will follow the one-hour delay schedule on Wednesday's
- Secondary schools will provide in-person instruction on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays.
- Secondary schools will provide distance learning instruction on Wednesdays.
