2026 changes: Mississippi increased its gasoline tax by 3 cents per gallon, moving from 43rd to 38th highest nationally.

Indiana increased by 8.6 cents per gallon and moved to 3rd highest; Utah decreased by 6.6 cents and moved to 23rd.

California remained the highest gasoline-tax state; Illinois remained second. Washington moved to 4th highest.
