Dear Mayor Cox:

Per our recent meeting and a review of an "Environmental Risk Analysis of Leica Site Memorandum" prepared by John Brunini and Gary Rikard of Butler Snow, Covington Civil and Environmental (Covington) is pleased to submit this Scope of Work and estimated budget for providing professional consulting services associated with performing an independent evaluation of the environmental risk associated with the subject site.

We propose the following Scope of Work:

- 1. Contact Thomas Wallace, MDEQ and Gary Rikard, Butler Snow to get an overall understanding of the status of environmental investigations and negotiations associated with the subject site.
- 2. Submit a Freedom of Information Request to MDEQ to obtain all files associated with the subject site.
- 3. Review representative files, focusing on the most recent data. We are assuming that not all files will be reviewed. We have budgeted 24 professional hours for this review.
- 4. Provide an opinion letter to the City of Ocean Springs describing:
  - a. The Status of the environmental investigations and negotiations with MDEQ,
  - b. Potential risk associated with redeveloping the site for commercial uses and adjacent properties based on the available records,
  - c. Potential constraints/requirements placed on redeveloping the site, and
  - d. Additional environmental investigation/remediation measures MDEQ may require.

Based on the Scope of Work outlined above, we propose an estimated budget of \$6,750. Covington will charge for actual time and expenses spent on the project and, if additional services are required, will provide an updated proposal for those additional services. The time and expenses will be in accordance with the attached rate sheet.



These services will be provided in accordance with the attached General Conditions. By accepting this proposal, you acknowledge and accept the attached General Conditions and rate sheet. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me. We look forward to working with you.

# ORDER ADOPTING ASSESSMENT SCHEDULE FOR MOTOR VEHICLE AD VALOREM TAXES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026

WHEREAS, Section 27-51-15, Miss. Code Ann., provides that motor vehicles shall be assessed uniformly according to value and such assessed value shall be determined by an assessment schedule which shall be prepared and made of minute record by the Department of Revenue and shall be certified to the president of the board of supervisors of the various counties of the state, and to the mayor or the presiding officer of the municipal boards of the various municipalities, and municipal separate school districts of the state as the official motor vehicle assessment schedule which shall be used by the proper officials of both respective jurisdictions in assessing motor vehicle ad valorem taxes for the ensuing fiscal year; and,

WHEREAS, Section 27-51-19, Miss. Code Ann., provides that the Department of Revenue shall on or before the fifteenth day of June of each year, prepare and adopt an assessment schedule of motor vehicles, as defined in Section 27-51-5, Miss. Code Ann., which such assessment schedule, in its judgment, will tend to equalize the assessed value of property of this class with property of other classes in general, and which schedule, except as otherwise provided in Title 27, Chapter 51, Miss. Code Ann., as amended, shall be used by the tax collector of each county and each municipality and municipal separate school district, in assessing, calculating and collecting ad valorem taxes in each respective jurisdiction on all motor vehicles for such tax; and,

WHEREAS, said schedule, for the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 has been prepared in the manner and way required by law, and the assessment schedule for automobiles and most motorcycles is located in the computer network as part of the VIN/VIS System, with a copy of the schedule for special equipment, trailers, ambulances, and hearses (including motorcycles not included in the VIN/VIS system) attached hereto, and the Department of Revenue, being of the opinion that said schedule complies in all respects with the provisions of the aforesaid statute and amendments and should be adopted:

IT IS, THEREFORE, HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that, the schedule for the Fiscal Year 2025-2026, for the assessment of ad valorem taxes for motor vehicles, as provided for by Title 27, Chapter 51, Miss. Code Ann., as amended, be and the same is hereby adopted for the purposes set forth in the aforesaid act and its amendments.

# DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE PROPERTY ASSESSMENT BUREAU

# RULE 9. MOTOR VEHICLE ASSESSMENTS

Pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. Section 27-51-19, the Department of Revenue is required to annually prepare and adopt an assessment schedule for motor vehicles. In preparing this schedule, the Commission shall use a computer system package of assessments identified by the VIN ("vehicle identification number"). If the VIN does not produce an assessed value or if the computer system is not in operation, the local tax collector shall use the MSRP ("manufactured suggested retail price") with applicable depreciation percentage for the year in which the vehicle was manufactured.

The local tax collector shall be responsible for obtaining a source of MSRP(s) except for new vehicles. The taxpayer shall be responsible for supplying the MSRP for a new vehicle, by submitting a copy of the window sticker with the MSRP, to the tax collector at the time the tag is purchased.

The Department of Revenue will annually furnish to each tax collector an assessment schedule for trailers, motorcycles, special equipment, etc. to be used in the assessment of this type of property. This schedule will be furnished in hard copy or the Department of Revenue may use a computer system package of assessments identified by the VIN ("vehicle identification number"). If the VIN does not produce an assessed value or if the computer system is not in operation, the local tax collector shall use the MSRP ("manufactured suggested retail price") with applicable depreciation percentage for the year in which the vehicle was manufactured. For any model not listed, assess at 30% of current value if known, or use the "cost when new" multiplied by the percentages listed in the schedule for the years listed.

The motor vehicle assessment adopted by the Department of Revenue, is the computer system package of assessments identified by the VIN (vehicle identification number). If the VIN does not produce an assessed value, the MSRP (manufacturer's suggested retail price) is entered in the system and is multiplied by the applicable percentage for the year in which the vehicle was manufactured.

The above percentages are used to calculate the assessed value for automobiles and light trucks. These percentages represent the assessment ratio of 30% less applicable depreciation. The appropriate percentage is multiplied by the MSRP of the vehicle being tagged to arrive at the assessed value. For 2016 and older models the assessed value is \$100.

The Mississippi Constitution mandates that motor vehicles be assessed at 30% of true value. The Commission estimates that the true value of a new vehicle is approximately 90% of the MSRP. The 30% assessment ratio multiplied by 90% produces an effective percentage of 27% that would be multiplied by the MSRP of new vehicles to arrive at assessed value.

The Road and Privilege Tax on all passenger vehicles is \$15.00. See Sections 27-19-5 and 27-19-9, Miss. Code Ann., for the privilege tax on motorcycles, ambulances, hearses, school and church buses, and taxicabs.

# RESOLUTION APPROVING THE ADOPTION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CITY OF OCEAN SPRINGS URBAN RENEWAL PROJECT AND PLAN

WHEREAS, under the power and authority granted by the laws of the State of Mississippi and particularly under Section 43-35-1 et seq. of the Mississippi Code Annotated (1972), the City of Ocean Springs, on January 2, 2024, did adopt a certain resolution entitled "A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING URBAN RENEWAL AREA"; and

WHEREAS, subsequent to the aforementioned resolution and as required by law, a notice of public hearing was published for three (3) consecutive weeks in the Sun Herald, a newspaper having a general circulation within the City, and was so published in said newspaper on January 31, 2024; February 7, 2024; and February 14, 2024; and

**WHEREAS**, the notice of public hearing described the City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Plan and further called for a public hearing to be held at the Ocean Springs Civic Center located at 3730 Bienville Blvd. at 5:30 P.M. on Thursday, February 22, 2024; and

**WHEREAS**, a Disposition Plan has been developed for the sale of property that may be acquired by the City, pursuant to the implementation of the Urban Renewal Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Plan conforms to the City of Ocean Springs' Comprehensive Plan as a whole as evidenced by the letter from the Ocean Springs Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Plan will afford maximum opportunity, consistent with the sound needs of the City of Ocean Springs as a whole, for rehabilitation or redevelopment of the Urban Renewal Area by the City or private enterprise.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF OCEAN SPRINGS AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1**. That all of the findings of fact made and set forth in the preambles to this Resolution shall be and the same are hereby found, declared, and adjudicated to be true and correct.

**SECTION 3**. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen have determined that all necessary findings under Miss. Code Ann. § 43-35-13 have been met for the implementation of the City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Plan.

**SECTION 4**. That the City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Plan, copy attached and marked as Exhibit "A", conforms to the City of Ocean Springs' Comprehensive Plan as a whole as evidenced by the letter from the Ocean Springs Planning Commission, a copy attached and marked as Exhibit "B".

<u>SECTION 5</u>. That the City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Plan will afford maximum opportunity, consistent with the sound needs of the City as a whole, for rehabilitation or redevelopment of the Urban Renewal Area by the City or private enterprise.

SECTION 6. That the City of Ocean Springs is now fully authorized and empowered under the provisions of Section 43-35-1 et seq. of the Mississippi Code annotated (1972), to approve and implement the City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Plan, and do hereby approve such Urban Renewal Plan.

### URBAN RENEWAL PLAN—CITY OF OCEAN SPRINGS—URBAN RENEWAL PROJECT 2024

### ARTICLE I

- A. INTRODUCTION: The City of Ocean Springs and the Ocean Springs Redevelopment Authority will undertake an urban renewal and redevelopment project as defined in the "Urban Renewal Law" of Section 43-35-1 et seq of the Mississippi Code of 1972 (as amended). The Urban Renewal Plan for the City of Ocean Springs Redevelopment Project Area represents a plan for the overall redevelopment of a part of the City of Ocean Springs.
- B. URBAN RENEWAL PLAN DEFINED: Section 43-35-3, paragraph (1) of the Mississippi Code of 1972 (as amended) defines an Urban Renewal Plan to be a "plan, as it exists from time to time, for an urban renewal project, which plan (1) shall conform to the general plan for the municipality as a whole except as provided in subsection (g) of Section 43-35-13; and (2) shall be sufficiently complete to indicate such land acquisition, demolition and removal of structures, redevelopment, improvements, and rehabilitation as may be proposed to be carried out in the urban renewal area, zoning and planning changes, if any, land uses, maximum densities, building requirements, and the plan's relationship to definite local objectives, respecting appropriate land use, improved traffic, public transportation, public utilities, recreational and community facilities, and other public improvements".

The City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Plan is a plan for the development and redevelopment of the City of Ocean Springs and will serve as the plan for the project area.

C. URBAN RENEWAL PROJECT DEFINED: An "urban renewal project" as defined in Section 43-35-3, paragraph (i) of the Mississippi Code of 1972 (as amended) provides "undertakings and activities of a municipality in an urban renewal area for the elimination and for the prevention of the development or spread of slums and blight, may involve slum clearance and redevelopment in an urban renewal area, or any combination or part thereof in accordance with an urban renewal plan.

Such undertakings and activities may include:

- 1. Acquisition of a slum area or blighted area or portion thereof;
- 2. Demolition and removal of buildings and improvements;
- 3. Installation, construction, or reconstruction of streets, utilities, parks, playgrounds, and other improvements necessary for carrying out in the urban renewal area the urban renewal objectives of this article in accordance with the urban renewal plan;
- 4. Disposition of any property acquired in the urban renewal area (including sale, initial leasing, or retention by the municipality itself) at its fair value for uses in accordance with the urban renewal plan;
- 5. Carrying out plans for a program of voluntary or compulsory repair and rehabilitation of buildings or other improvements in accordance with the urban renewal plan; and
- 6. Acquisition of any other real property in the urban renewal area where necessary to eliminate unhealthful, unsanitary, or unsafe conditions, lessen density, eliminate obsolete or other uses detrimental to the public welfare, or otherwise to remove or prevent the spread of blight or deterioration, or to provide land needed for public facilities".

Activities to be undertaken in the area may include: the acquisition of property (if necessary) for redevelopment by the City, non-profit organizations, and by private enterprise; rehabilitation or replacement of sub-standard structures to acceptable code standards; removal of structures such as the City's Public Works facilities and the Ryan Youth Center if necessary; installation of public improvements including street improvements, landscaping and streetscape improvements; improvement and expansion of recreation facilities; and disposition of property acquired in the urban renewal area.

### ARTICLE II: DESCRIPTION OF URBAN RENEWAL AREA

A. URBAN RENEWAL AREA BOUNDARIES: The Urban Renewal Area as defined in Section 43-35-3, paragraph (k) of the Mississippi Code of 1972 (as amended) provides "slum area or blighted area or a combination thereof which the local governing body designates as appropriate for an urban renewal project." On January 02, 2024, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen adopted a Resolution making a finding that the area designated on the Urban Renewal Boundary Map is a slum or blighted area in the City of Ocean Springs. The basis for the declaration of the City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Area is set forth in the Resolution and letters from Planning Professionals and others attached hereto as Exhibit A.

ARTICLE III: URBAN RENEWAL PLAN CONFORMITY WITH CITY'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN CITY OF OCEAN SPRINGS COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND URBAN RENEWAL PLAN OBJECTIVES

The Urban Renewal Plan has been developed in conformity with the goals and objectives of the City of Ocean Springs Comprehensive Plan, which is the "Official Plan" for the City. The Urban Renewal Plan incorporates by reference the goals and objectives of the City of Ocean Springs Comprehensive Plan and the various elements of the Plan such as residential, commercial, and industrial development; transportation; land use; and community facilities. The Urban Renewal Plan, like zoning, subdivision regulations, and building codes, will serve as an implementation tool for the Comprehensive Plan. According to the City of Ocean Springs Comprehensive Plan, these goals and objectives describe positive elements that the Plan seeks to achieve over the planning period while also addressing the City's pressing land use problems.

### ARTICLE IV: EXISTING CONDITIONS/OCEAN SPRINGS URBAN RENEWAL PROJECT

The Urban Renewal Area depicted in Exhibit C, and as established by the Resolution of the Mayor and Board of Alderman referenced herein above, contains an area that qualifies as a "slum" or "blighted" area as defined in Section 43-35-3 (h) and (i) of the Mississippi Code of 1972 (as amended). The area includes deteriorated or deteriorating structures; defective or inadequate street layout; faulty lot layout in relation to size, adequacy, or usefulness; deteriorated site and/or site improvements; vacant land in a state of economic disuse and land which suffers from adverse environmental conditions. These conditions present impediments to the "sound growth of Ocean Springs and constitute an economic and social liability to the proposed renewal area and the City as a whole". The slum or blighted area designation is supported by, among other things letters from two City Planning Professionals, the City of Ocean Springs Public Works Director, and the Building Official of the City of Ocean Springs, said letters are attached as Exhibit A of this Urban Renewal Plan.

In order to foster the development and redevelopment of the area depicted in Exhibit C, supra, it has been designated as an Urban Renewal Project for the City of Ocean Springs. The Plan calls for the renewal, revitalization, and redevelopment of the Urban Renewal Area to encourage and induce economic and tourism development activity expected to increase jobs, real and personal property taxes to the benefit of the City, County, and Public Schools, to increase retail sales taxes to the City, to increase tourism taxes and to enhance the City's stature as a destination for tourists and visitors.

Additionally, the Project (Plan) calls for the demolition and removal of the outdated existing Ocean Springs Public Works facility; improvement of the Ryan Youth Center or its demolition and replacement in the Urban Renewal Area, improvement and addition of recreational facilities, site improvements, infrastructure upgrades, reconstruction and realignment of streets, among other things, to accommodate development and redevelopment by public and private entities.

As a last resort, the Project (Plan) may require the acquisition of property within the Urban Renewal Area.

The Project (Plan) contemplates funding for construction of the various elements of the Project (Plan) to be public funds from local, state, and federal sources and from private investment.

### ARTICLE V: PROPOSED RENEWAL TREATMENT

The Urban Renewal Plan calls for the renewal treatment of the Area to be accomplished through a combination of activities that may include acquisition of commercial property, if needed; clearance of buildings; and rehabilitation and redevelopment of existing structures. Redevelopment activities will include the provision of public improvements including the construction of new streets, or improvement of existing streets, and installation of utilities and bulkheads necessary to service the proposed land uses as well as existing land uses in the Urban Renewal Area. Additionally, areas may be developed to improve and expand recreational facilities and buildings to serve the community as whole. These activities may be accomplished through public or private funding, or any combination of funding from public and private sources.

# EXHIBIT E: PROPOSED TREATMENTS FOR VARIOUS PARCELS WITHIN THE URBAN RENEWAL AREAS

### ARTICLE VI: ACTIVITIES TO MEET URBAN RENEWAL OBJECTIVES

The Urban Renewal Project will include a number of activities designed to meet the objectives of this Urban Renewal Plan. Such activities include upgrading vacant and undeveloped land; rehabilitation and renovation; acquisition of real property, as may be necessary; construction of improvements; redevelopment and disposition of property; and, new development and redevelopment by the City of Ocean Springs, non-profit organizations, and by private enterprise.

The following is a description of each activity to be undertaken.

- 1. Rehabilitation and Renovation —This Urban Renewal Plan provides for the rehabilitation and renovation of structures in the Urban Renewal Area, which are: sub-standard structures for which rehabilitation or renovation is practical; sub-standard structures for which rehabilitation or renovation will result in a higher and better use for the property on which the structure is located; and, sub-standard structures which are historically or architecturally significant. Rehabilitation or renovation of sub-standard structures shall be accomplished in accordance with ARTICLE VII of this Plan.
- 2. Acquisition of Real Property The City of Ocean Springs proposes to acquire certain real property in the Urban Renewal Area if required for the purposes of eliminating unhealthy, unsanitary or unsafe conditions; eliminating conditions that are detrimental to public welfare; providing rights-of-way for streets and sidewalks; providing redevelopment sites for public and private redevelopment; enhancing tourism and economic development; historic preservation; rehabilitation and disposition for redevelopment; and, other purposes as the need may arise in furtherance of this Plan.
- 3. Demolition and Removal of Structures The outdated Public Works facilities will be demolished and removed from site. If necessary and appropriate, the Ryan Youth Center will be demolished and replaced in the Urban Renewal Area.
- 4. Redevelopment Land in the Urban Renewal Area which may be acquired by the City as a last resort will be improved by the City or disposed of to public entities, non-profit organizations, or private parties for new development or redevelopment pursuant to Section 43-35-19 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 (as amended). Funding for development or redevelopment will come from public funds, private funds, or any combination of public/private funding. The redevelopment will foster new development which will prevent or help prevent the recurrence of slum and blight in the Area.
- 5. Construction of Improvements Public improvements to be constructed in the Urban Renewal Area include, but may not be limited to, historic preservation, development of tourist attractions, improvement and expansion of recreational facilities, new and existing street improvements, drainage improvements, water and sanitary sewer system improvements, new and existing

sidewalk improvements, traffic signage and signalization, street lighting, bulkhead repair, and landscaping.

6. Rehabilitation, Renovation, New Development, and Redevelopment by Private Enterprise — This Plan provides that the City shall, to the greatest extent feasible, afford maximum opportunity for the new development and redevelopment of the Area by the City and private enterprise. The City will require, to the maximum extent allowable by law, that private property owners comply with all codes and ordinances. Environmental barriers to development will be removed and/or mitigated in accordance with the requirements of the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality.

Where private property owners fail to comply with the codes and ordinances, the City may acquire property in the Urban Renewal Area in accordance with State law and bring the property into compliance with the codes and ordinances, or dispose of the property in accordance with the Disposition Policy of the City of Ocean Springs adopted to govern the disposition of property acquired by the City in connection with this Urban Renewal Plan. A deed restriction will require the grantee to comply with all codes and ordinances.

# ARTICLE VII: LAND USES, MAXIMUM DENSITIES, LAND DEVELOPMENT, AND BUILDING REQUIREMENTS

Among other things, this Article governs development and redevelopment within the Urban Renewal Area and to aid in the prevention and recurrence of conditions that contribute to the existence of slums and blight.

- A. Land Uses/Zoning Ordinances: This Urban Renewal Plan is developed in accordance with the "City of Ocean Springs Comprehensive Plan" and, therefore, provides for adherence to the Land Use Plan of the City. Land use in the Urban Renewal Area is governed by the official Unified Development Code of the City. The Official Zoning Map, delineating zoning districts (land use) is on file in the Office of the City Clerk. The use of any property in the Area must comply in all respects with the Unified Development Code of the City and the requirements of this Urban Renewal Plan.
- B. Maximum Densities/Zoning Ordinance: The Official Unified Development Code of the City of Ocean Springs shall regulate the maximum development of densities in the Urban Renewal Area.
- C. Land Development/Subdivision Regulations: This Plan requires that any development in the Urban Renewal Area shall be conducted in conformity with regulations and standards of the City governing the subdivision of land, namely the Unified Development Code and all ordinances involving the subdivision or land of the City.
- D. Building Requirements/Building and Related Codes: In keeping with the Comprehensive Plan of the City, this Urban Renewal Plan requires that any new construction and any rehabilitation

or remodeling of structures in the Urban Renewal Area shall meet the requirements of all applicable and current City building codes.

### ARTICLE VIII: REAL PROPERTY ACQUISITION, RELOCATION AND DISPOSITION OF PROPERTY

- A. Acquisition and Relocation Procedures: This Urban Renewal Plan requires that all property acquisition within the Urban Renewal Area, if any, by the City shall be in compliance with the requirements of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended. No relocation of residents or businesses is authorized by this Project (Plan).
- B. Disposition Procedures: This Urban Renewal Plan provides for the sale or disposition (if deemed appropriate by the City) of any property owned by the City or acquired as part of the Urban Renewal Project. Property disposition shall be accomplished in accordance with the Urban Renewal Law at Section 43-35-19 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, and the adopted Disposition Policy governing the disposition of property acquired by the City in connection with this Urban Renewal Project.

EXHIBIT F: DISPOSITION POLICY AND RESOLUTION ADOPTING SAME

### ARTICLE IX: TRAFFIC CONTROL AND MAJOR CIRCULATION ROUTES

This Urban Renewal Plan conforms with the "City of Ocean Springs Comprehensive Plan". The City shall, from time to time, establish major traffic circulation routes for the Urban Renewal Area and the City as a whole will maintain traffic controls. The Transportation Plan, Subdivision Regulations, Unified Development Code, street design, and construction standards of the City govern street widths, ingress and egress patterns, turn lanes, turn restrictions, and vehicle limitations established by weight.

These regulations, along with realignment, widening, and overlaying of existing streets will achieve improved traffic circulation and flow for the City and pass-through traffic. Traffic control and circulation in the Urban Renewal Area will utilize electronic signalization and will provide optimum access to existing and proposed off-street parking. This Plan will be implemented so as to efficiently integrate traffic circulation and flow into the zoning scheme of the City and the general circulation pattern of the community.

# ARTICLE X: OFF-STREET PARKING, LOADING AND UNLOADING SPACE

This Urban Renewal Plan conforms to the City's Unified Development Code and other codes and ordinances wherein off-street parking, loading, and unloading space requirements are regulated and controlled.

# ARTICLE XI: PROVISIONS OF REGULATIONS DECLARED TO BE MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS.

For the purposes of this Urban renewal Plan, the regulations referred to shall be interpreted and applied as minimum requirements. Whenever the requirements of these regulations are at variance with the requirements of any other lawfully adopted rules, regulations, ordinances, deed restrictions or covenants, the most restrictive, or that imposing the higher standards, shall govern.

ARTICLE XII: RELATIONSHIP TO POLICIES REGARDING APPROPRIATE LAND USES, IMPROVED TRAFFIC CONTROL, PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION, PUBLIC UTILITIES, RECREATIONAL AND COMMUNITY FACILITIES, AND OTHER PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS

The goals and objectives of the Urban Renewal Plan are interrelated with the planning goals and objectives of the City as set out in the "City of Ocean Springs Comprehensive Plan".

The Urban Renewal Plan seeks to encourage public and private capital investment, which will increase economic development, increase the tax base, increase the retail sales tax rebates, and increase job opportunities. The Plan seeks to encourage revitalization of the Urban Renewal Area by inducing new development and redevelopment. Public facilities and services will be improved and properly maintained as a result of the implementation of this Plan and the City's Comprehensive Plan whose policies are interchangeable. The Goals and Objectives of the "City of Ocean Springs Comprehensive Plan" are incorporated herein by reference as if fully copied in words and figures. See EXHIBIT D supra.

### ARTICLE XIII: PROVISIONS FOR AMENDING THE PLAN

This Urban Renewal Plan may be modified by the City in accordance with the provisions of the Urban Renewal Law of the State of Mississippi and after holding a public hearing before the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Ocean Springs.

### ARTICLE XIV: THE URBAN RENEWAL PLAN DEFINED

This writing and all exhibits referenced herein constitute the entire Urban Renewal Plan for the City of Ocean Springs, Mississippi. Where reference is made to statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations, and official policies of the City of Ocean Springs, the same are to be deemed a part of this Plan and to govern those provisions wherein such reference is being made.

# A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING URBAN RENEWAL AREA

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen has reviewed certain evidence concerning various properties located in the City of Ocean Springs, which properties are contained within the highlighted areas depicted on the map attached hereto as Exhibit "A", and hereafter referred to as the "Urban Renewal Area" for the City of Ocean Springs; and

WHEREAS, the evidence reviewed by the Board concerning the Urban Renewal Area indicates that there are properties that are in need of rehabilitation, conservation and redevelopment, or a combination thereof, and that such efforts are necessary and desirable in the interest of public health, safety, morals, and welfare of the citizens of Ocean Springs; and

WHEREAS, Section 43-35-11 of the Mississippi Code, requires a finding by this Board that one or more areas exist within the City that are slum or blighted areas within the meaning of Section 43-35-3(h) and Section 43-35-3(i) of the Code, as an antecedent step to invoking the provisions of the Urban Renewal Law of the State of Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City of Ocean Springs, Mississippi to exercise its Urban Renewal powers as provided by the Urban Renewal Law, Miss. Code Ann. § 43-35-1 et seq., in the areas depicted on the Map attached as Exhibit "A", and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Aldermen find that the proposed Urban Renewal Area conforms to the general plan of the municipality as a whole; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of an Urban Renewal Area will afford maximum opportunity, consistent with the sound needs of the municipality as a whole, for the rehabilitation or redevelopment of the Urban Renewal area by private enterprises; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen have determined that the designation of the area that is nonresidential as slum and blighted is necessary and appropriate to facilitate the proper growth

and development of the community in accordance with the sound planning standards and local community objectives and determine and find that certain areas are slum and blighted as defined under the Mississippi Code.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Ocean Springs, Mississippi, as follows:

**SECTION 1**. The statements set forth in the foregoing preambles are found to be factual and are incorporated herein in their entirety.

**SECTION 2**. The area depicted on the map attached hereto as Exhibit "A" is hereby designated as the Urban Renewal Area of the City of Ocean Springs inasmuch as there is substantial evidence of the existence of slum and blight within the area that merits rehabilitation, conservation and redevelopment, or a combination thereof, which is necessary and in the interests of the public safety, morals and welfare of the residents of our City.

**SECTION 3**. The Urban Renewal Area conforms to the general plan of the municipality as a whole.

SECTION 4. The designation of this Urban Renewal Area will facilitate a maximum opportunity, consistent with the sound needs of the City of Ocean Springs as a whole for the rehabilitation and/or redevelopment of the Urban Renewal Area by private enterprise and that the residential use of the designated areas are necessary and appropriate to facilitate the proper growth and development of the community in accordance with the sound planning standards and local community objectives.

**SECTION 5**. This Resolution shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after passage.

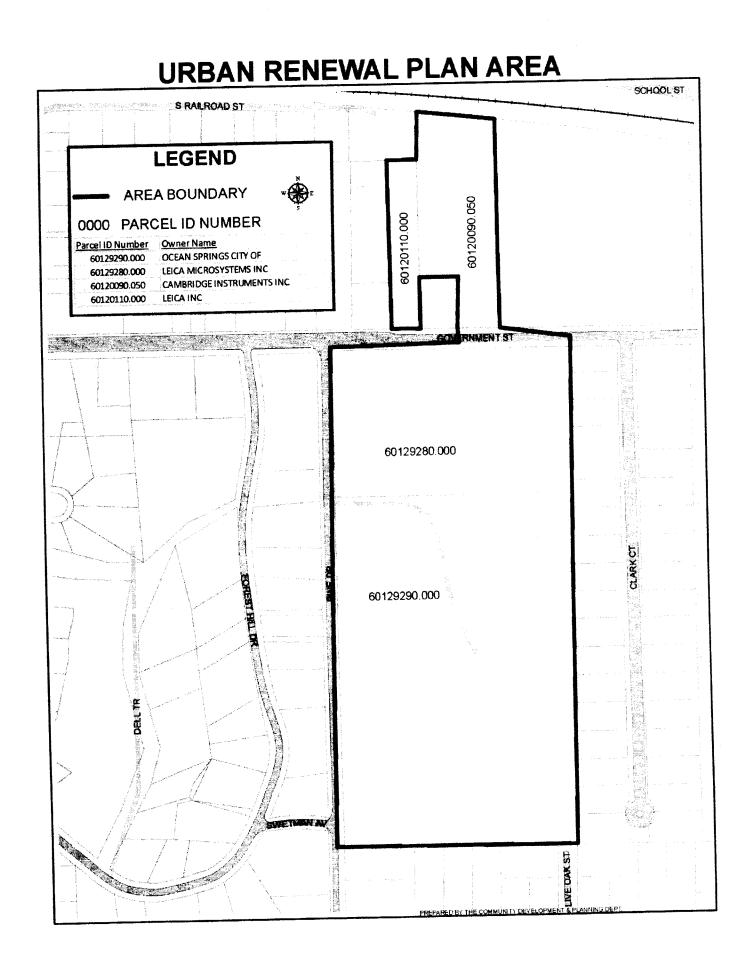

#### Exhibit 1: Development Tiers

#### Conservation Tier

Includes public of private lands which are not suitable for urban development and use due to their location and environmental characteristics, such as wildlife habitat oraginultural use. Land in the conservation land use classification may include designated wetlands, floodways, or floodplains, or may contain solls which will not support urban development. Development's limited to temporary improvements, or buildings or structures that support passive recreation, conservation or agricultural uses.

#### Residential Low Intensity Tier

Characterized by low density suburban residential development; including single family detached residences on acreage sites or platted lots. Typicelly, the residential land use classification is fully subdivided, fully improved with urban infrastructure and has frontage on a public road. However, some land in this classification may not be served by the full range of municipal or cortified utilities such as water, sanitary sewers, natural gas or stormwater drainaga infrastructure. There is a limited opportunity for some small scale mixed-use development typically serving the neighborhood scale.

#### Residential High Intensity Tier

Characterized by moderate and higher density suburban residential uses; such as higher density single family detached residential subdivision development, medium density town home complexes, and multi-family residential complexes. Typically; the residential land-use classification is fully subdivided, fully improved with urban intrastructure and has frontage on a public road; included in the area are compatible and complementary mixed uses that are intended to provide services to the neighborhood:

#### Commercial Center Low Intensity Tier

Intended to accommodate smaller mixed use activity centers that are generally connected and integrated into the surrounding neighborhoods. These centers have a community or neighborhood emphasis, and include a range of retail and service uses.

#### Commercial Center High Intensity Tier

Includes the City's largest mixed use activity centers that have a community-wide or regional emphasis. This land use classification is designated to include the full range of office, retail and service establishments. This Tier applies at all major intersections along Bienville Boulevard (Hwy 90).

#### Civic Space

Includes governmental and other institutional facilities including all existing Federal, State, and local government buildings and facilities, all schools and other educational and related facilities, illuraries, museums, and exhibit spaces for visual parts; community centers, public assembly buildings and facilities for the performing arts; sports are mass, colliseums and stadiums, cemeterics and mausoleums and publicly accessible historic sites.

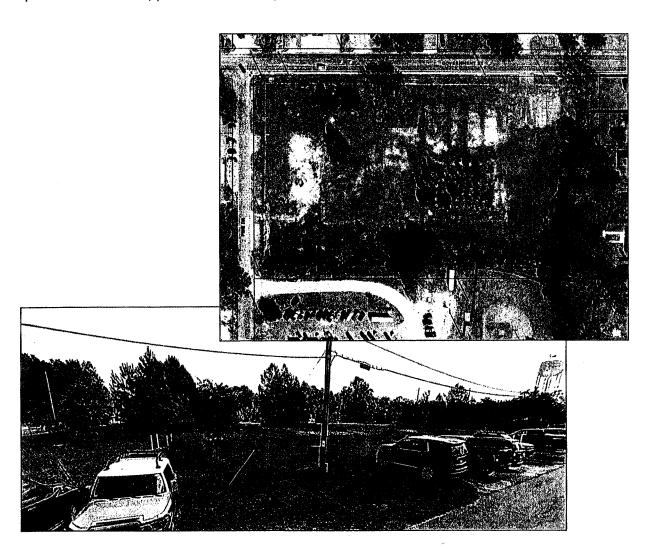

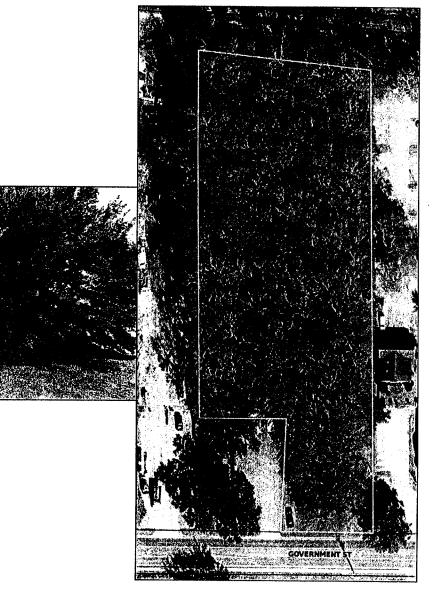

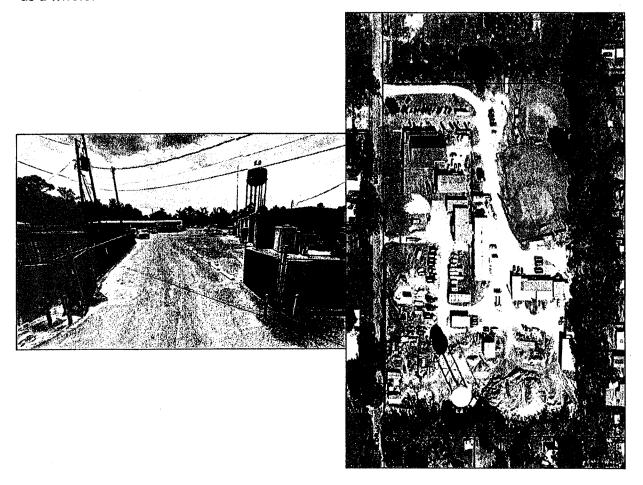

<u>Public Works Facilities</u>: Demolition of existing Public Works buildings and related facilities, improvement of property to facilitate new development that fosters economic development. It is anticipated that the new development will be undertaken with public funding, private investment, or a combination thereof.

<u>Recreational Facilities</u>: Improvement, expansion, reconfiguration, and upgrading of existing buildings and facilities to broaden recreational opportunities for the community as a whole.

WHEREAS, the City of Ocean Springs has approved and will undertake the City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Project as provided for in Section 43-35-1 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended; and

**WHEREAS,** the City has prepared and approved an Urban Renewal Plan in accordance with section 43-35-13 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Urban Renewal Plan provided for the sale or disposition and redevelopment of certain real property owned by the City or acquired for purposes outlined in the Plan; and

**WHEREAS,** the City has prepared a Disposition Plan, which provides for a uniform procedure for disposing of real property owned or acquired by the City in the City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Ocean Springs as follows:

**SECTION 1.** The findings, conclusions and statements of fact contained in the preamble are adopted and ratified.

**SECTION 2.** The Disposition Plan attached hereto and marked as Exhibit "A" is adopted and ratified.

**SECTION 3.** The Disposition Plan will be in full force and effect from and after its adoption until the City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Project is completed and all litigation associated therewith has been finalized.

**AND SO, THE ABOVE FINDINGS ARE THEREFORE RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Ocean Springs, Mississippi on this the 5th day of March 2024.

#### **DISPOSITION PLAN**

### City of Ocean Springs Urban Renewal Project

Land acquired or owned in the Urban Renewal Area by the City and designated for development or redevelopment may be disposed of to public entities, non-profit organizations, and private parties for new development or redevelopment pursuant to Section 43-35-19 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

Property designated for development and/or redevelopment may be sold at not less than its fair market value for uses in accordance with the Urban Renewal Plan. In determining the fair market value, the City will take into account and give consideration to the uses provided in the Urban Renewal Plan, the restrictive covenants, conditions, and obligations assumed by the purchaser, and the objectives of the Plan for the prevention of the reoccurrence of slum and blighted areas. Additionally, consideration may be given to the amount of the investment proposed by the developer, the economic impact of the proposal to include among other things, the number of jobs to be created, property taxes, retail sales taxes, and tourism taxes, among other things.

#### A. Disposition

All property owned or acquired by the City of Ocean Springs in the Urban Renewal Area may be disposed of in accordance with the Urban Renewal Plan subject to any covenant, condition, or restriction the City deems necessary to carry out the Urban Renewal Plan. Such sale or disposition of property may be made only after the Board of Aldermen approves the Urban Renewal Plan. It is intended that the City of Ocean Springs be the beneficiary of the covenants or conditions. It is further intended that the City through the contract for sale will retain such rights and remedies it shall find necessary to protect its interests, including the rights and power to retake or recapture by reversion of title. Any property will be sold subject to the following:

- 1) The purchasers, their successors, and assigns shall be obligated to devote the property only to the uses specified in the Urban Renewal Plan and may be obligated to comply with such other requirements as the City may determine to be the public interest.
- 2) The purchasers, their successors, and assigns shall be obligated to begin and complete within a reasonable time, as determined by the City, any improvements on the property required by the Urban Renewal Plan. If the purchaser fails to begin and complete any improvements as required by the contract, the City will invoke its right to retake the property by the reversion of title.

3) The purchaser may not sell, lease, or otherwise transfer the property without the prior written consent and approval of the City of Ocean Springs until all construction of any improvements and the purchaser has obligated himself/herself to construct have been made and all other obligations of the terms of the sale are met.

The City of Ocean Springs will include the above three conditions in the contracts for sale and instruments of conveyance. In addition, all contracts and deeds or other instruments of conveyance will include such other terms and conditions as will be necessary to ensure the redevelopment of the area in accordance with the Urban Renewal Plan.

### **B.** Disposition Process

The City of Ocean Springs will dispose of any urban renewal property sold to private enterprises by competitive bidding procedures. The bidding procedures will include the following:

- 1) The City will publish in a newspaper having general circulation a "request for proposals" for the development of property to be sold. The request for proposals must be published at least thirty (30) days prior to the date proposals are to be opened. The notice will identify the property to be sold and state that proposals will be accepted within thirty (30) days after the date of the request for proposals is published. The request for proposals shall state the deadline for submission of proposals and the date proposals will be opened. It will also state the address and place where additional information may be obtained.
- 2) Proposals will be submitted on forms prescribed by the City and as a minimum, will include the following:
  - a. Detailed description of the proposed development including cost estimates
  - b. Schematic drawing of improvements
  - c. Site plan
  - d. Documentation indicating financial and legal ability to undertake the development

- e. Bid price- must be at a minimum fair market value and/or other considerations the City may use in determining fair market value
- f. Any other relevant information which the bidder believes should be considered
- g. Intended use
- 3) The City will open all eligible proposals on the date and time specified in the request for proposals. The City will consider all proposals submitted. Criteria for evaluating proposals include but are not limited to the following:
  - a. Financial and legal ability of the bidder to undertake the development in a timely manner
  - b. Price and other considerations to determine the fair market value
  - c. Type of development
  - d. Small business with less than 100 employees
  - e. Other criteria established by the City and set forth in the Request for Proposal

Proposals will be evaluated by a three-person committee of City employees appointed by the Board of Aldermen. The City may negotiate with any person submitting a proposal. After reviewing and evaluating all proposals and any subsequent negotiations, the committee will recommend to the Board of Aldermen the proposal it deems to be in the best public interest and in furtherance of the objectives of the Urban Renewal Plan.

- 4) Before the City executes documents officially accepting a proposal, the Board of Aldermen must state their intention to accept the proposal in an Official Meeting, the notice being spread upon their minutes, at least (30) days prior to executing the documents.
  - 5) After the expiration of the thirty (30) day period outlined in paragraph B(4) above, the city may execute the contract and deliver deeds and other instruments and take steps necessary to effectuate such contract.

Re: Temporary Committees for UDC and Ordinance Review

At the August 5, 2025 Regular Meeting, the Board unanimously approved a motion to submit review committee talking points to the City Clerk and City Attorney for their review and to bring them back to the next Board meeting. This action followed the proposal to create two temporary citizen review committees:

- 1. A committee to review and recommend updates to the Unified Development Code (UDC).
- 2. A committee to review and recommend updates to the City's ordinances.

#### Committee Structure:

- Each committee will consist of seven residents: one nominated by each Alderman from their ward and one by the at-large member.
- The Planning Department will oversee and serve as liaison to both committees.
- Findings will be submitted either to the Planning Commission (for UDC-related matters) or to the department responsible for the related ordinance.

### Purpose:

The purpose of these committees is to engage residents in a structured review of the City's governing documents, ensuring that both the UDC and ordinances remain clear, current, and responsive to community needs. Their work will also support the broader goal of updating the City's 2010 Comprehensive Blueprint Plan and ensuring alignment with the 2024 annexation.

Proposed Next Steps (subject to Clerk/Attorney review):

- Finalize and adopt committee talking points, including scope of work and responsibilities.
- Establish a date-driven timeline and task list from inception to completion.
- Open a call for applicants to serve as resident members. One applicant to be nominated by each Alderman from their ward and one by the at-large member.
- Identify Planning Department liaisons for each committee.
- Begin committee orientation and hold first meetings by Fall 2025.

#### Conclusion:

This structured approach will provide the framework needed to modernize the City's planning, zoning, and policy infrastructure while ensuring transparency and broad resident engagement throughout the process. The next step is to receive the City Clerk and City Attorney's feedback on the talking points before the Board formally adopts the committee framework.

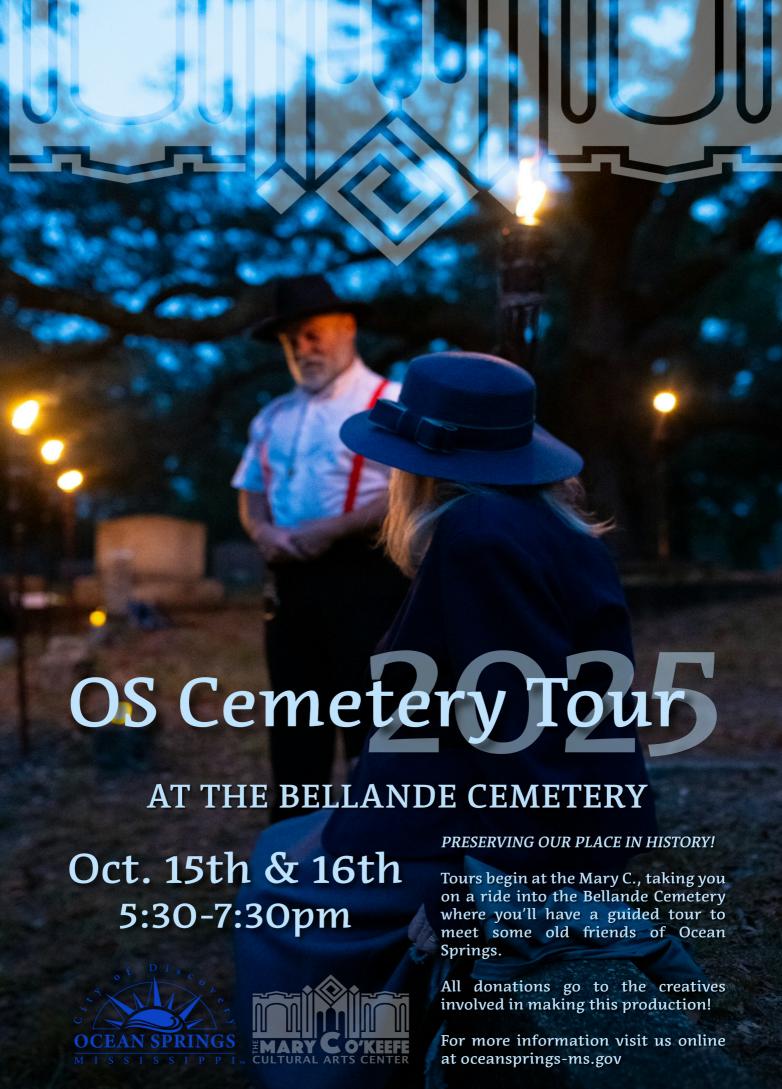

The Mayor called the meeting to order.

#### INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. James Lewis gave the invocation and Alderman Messenger led the Pledge of Allegiance.

A motion was made by Alderman Pfeiffer, seconded by Alderman Tillis, and unanimously carried to amend the agenda to move items 11-b and 11-c from Mayor & Aldermen's Forum to New Business 7-c and 7-d.

A motion was made by Alderman Pfeiffer, seconded by Alderman Stennis, and unanimously carried to accept the amended agenda.

#### **PROCLAMATION**

a. Honoring Jeanne Carter Luckey

The Mayor proclaimed August 19, 2025, as Jeanne Carter Luckey Day, and members of the Luckey family were present to accept the proclamation.

#### **PRESENTATION**

a. Alexander, Van Loon, Sloan, Levens, Favre, PLLC (AVL) - FY 23-24 Audit Presentation

Kim Marmalich of Alexander, Van Loon, Sloan, Levens, Favre, PLLC (AVL) presented the FY 2023–2024 Audit Report results. She reported that the City received an unmodified opinion on its financial statements, which is the highest level of assurance auditors can provide, indicating that the statements are materially correct as presented

under Government Auditing Standards. She noted the audit is historical in nature, covering the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024. Ms. Marmalich stated there were no difficulties in completing the audit, no disagreements with management, and no significant deficiencies or material instances of noncompliance with state laws and regulations. The Board had no questions. The motion to accept the FY 2023–2024 Audit was inadvertently omitted and will be placed on the next Consent Agenda.

#### AGENDA PUBLIC COMMENT

Agenda Item 9-c: James Lewis asked about the Covington Civil & Environmental proposal to provide the Environmental Risk Analysis of the Leica site. The Mayor clarified that the analysis will be conducted on City property surrounding the Leica site, not directly on the Leica site itself.

Agenda Item 6-b: Cameron Rea spoke against the proposed moratorium on Short-Term Rentals (STRs).

Agenda Item 7-b: Eamon Mohiuddin thanked the City for allowing a public meeting at the Civic Center for Great River Utility and Gulf Park Estates residents.

She requested that the lease agreement be approved subject to legal review and incorporation of necessary amendments.

A motion was made by Alderman Hinton, seconded by Alderman Wade, and unanimously carried to approve the Docket of Claims, finding that all expenditures are appropriate and authorized by law, and to spread the summary on the minutes.

 b. City Clerk: Authorize the adjustment of water/sewer accounts due to a finding that the customers did not receive the benefit of the utility and the excess usage was due to unforeseen circumstances

A motion was made by Alderman Wade, seconded by Alderman Pfeiffer, and unanimously carried to adjust the water/sewer accounts listed, with the finding that the customers did not receive the benefit of the utility and excess usage was due to unforeseen circumstances.

c. Mayor: Discuss Covington Civil & Environmental proposal to provide an Independent Evaluation of Environmental Risk Analysis of the Leica site

The Mayor clarified that the proposal under discussion pertained not to the Leica property itself, but to the public area surrounding the Leica site. Alderman Pfeiffer distributed a memo providing clarification and proposed edits to the document.

No action was taken.

 d. Building: Discuss authorization to set a public hearing for the demolition of 126 and 128 Earle Taylor Lane

The Building Official explained that the property, a duplex, was damaged by fire on March 17, 2024, and has since remained without power, water, or sewer service. He stated that one of the property owners has been contacted, while the other has not been reached. He requested that the City Attorney conduct a title search and verify there is no pending litigation involving the properties and recommended initiating the demolition process and scheduling a public hearing for October 7, 2025.

A motion was made by Alderman Wade, seconded by Alderman Pfeiffer, and unanimously carried to authorize the City Attorney to conduct a title search and verify there is no pending litigation involving the properties, to initiate the demolition process, and to set a public hearing on October 7, 2025, for the demolition of 126 and 128 Earle Taylor Lane.

e. Fire: Purchase of SCBA Air-Paks utilizing 2% Tax Funds

The Fire Chief explained that the department's air packs are at the end of their service life and no longer meet NFPA standards, creating a safety issue for the department. He reported that the total cost of the purchase is \$242,383.92, which includes all harnesses, air bottles, and face masks, and requested that the 2% tax fund be used to cover the full amount for public safety.

A motion was made by Alderman Stennis, seconded by Alderman Hinton, and unanimously carried to authorize the purchase of Scott X3 Pro 4.5 SCBA units for the Ocean Springs Fire Department in the amount of \$242,383.92, utilizing funds from the 2% tax fund for public safety.

f. City Clerk: Celebrate K20 - Reflection, Resiliency, Rebuilding

The Grants Administrator announced that Jackson County, in partnership with local municipalities, will host an event commemorating the 20th anniversary of Hurricane Katrina. The event will take place on Thursday, August 28th, from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. at The Sound Amphitheater in Gautier. It will be a free community event featuring food, music, and speakers.

#### **GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT**

Coast Transit Authority Executive Director Ninette Barrios and Assistant Executive Director Chris Foret spoke during the Public Comment section. It was noted that they should have requested a presentation slot, as previous directors have done in the past. They distributed the CTA FY2026 Ocean Springs Annual Operating Subsidy Request, which included information about CTA services and ridership in Ocean Springs, and requested a \$77,100 subsidy from the City for FY2026.

Bill Moore, James Lewis, Dan Burton, Taylor Pontius, Leslie Oliver, Becky Desporte, and Ron McDonald addressed the Mayor and the Board.

#### MAYOR AND ALDERMEN'S FORUM

Alderman Tillis thanked City Hall employees for their assistance in his new role as alderman. He addressed the recent gunfire incident downtown over the weekend and stated that he and Alderman Stennis plan to meet with the Police Chief and downtown business owners to discuss measures to help prevent future violence. He also asked the City Attorney about the possibility of relaying information to the public regarding pending litigation with the City's former attorney. The City Attorney replied that certain information is a matter of public record, but details regarding strategy or upcoming steps are confidential and cannot be disclosed by the Aldermen.

Alderman Stennis asked whether the former attorney was an employee or an independent contractor. The HR Director confirmed that the attorney was not an employee. The City Attorney clarified that, although the attorney was not an employee, discussion of the City's contract with legal counsel and whether to continue representation involves legal strategy and consequences and therefore differs from consideration of other independent contractor agreements. Alderman Stennis expressed concern regarding the legality of the executive session held on August 5th concerning the former attorney and the potential liability of the Aldermen. The City Attorney reiterated that the executive session discussion pertained to the legal strategy of six pending cases and the City's relationship with Wilkinson, not the contract with Wilkinson's firm.

A motion was made by Alderman Wade, seconded by Alderman Stennis, and unanimously carried to authorize out-of-state travel for Employee #1686 to Atlanta,

GA, to testify in court from August 26–27, 2025.

Alderman Pfeiffer asked for an update on the GC Research Lab Boat Launch. The Mayor replied that an MOU is being prepared and should be ready in the next few weeks. Alderman Pfeiffer also reported that she received an email from Jason Camp with MSU Extension Services offering a 2–3 hour course covering the duties and responsibilities of the Mayor and Board, the Open Meetings Act, public records, and a Q&A session. She noted that there would be no training fee, but an estimated \$300 in travel expenses. The training must be approved by unanimous vote and conducted in an open meeting. Alderman Pfeiffer said she would present it at the next meeting.

Alderman Messenger thanked Julia Weaver and Melanie Allan for their efforts in spearheading the Tree Canopy Renewal Project.

Alderman Hinton thanked City staff for their hard work during the transition period and expressed the Board of Aldermen's support.

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No action was taken.

Be it remembered that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Ocean Springs met in a Special Call Meeting at City Hall at 5:30 p.m. on August 26, 2025. A public notice stating the place, date, time, and subject matter of the meeting was posted within one hour of the meeting being called, both on the City's website and at City Hall, where it was available for examination and inspection by the public. Mayor Cox presided, and Aldermen Stennis, Wade, Hinton, Pfeiffer, Blackman, and Messenger were present. Alderman Tillis was absent. City Attorney David Harris Jr., City Clerk/Finance Director Christine Millard, Deputy City Clerk Vicky Hupe, Police Captain Matthew Morvant, Public Works Director Allan Ladnier, and Executive Administrator & Public Affairs Officer Laurri Garcia were also present.

The Mayor called the meeting to order.

A motion was made by Alderman Wade, seconded by Alderman Hinton, and unanimously carried to accept the agenda.

1. Plan of Action to Ensure Public Safety through the Labor Day Weekend

The Mayor stated that the meeting was called to address matters of public safety related to the Labor Day weekend following two recent incidents of gun violence downtown, in which no injuries were reported. He said the meeting was called in part to ensure that actions were taken to prevent additional incidents from occurring during the upcoming holiday weekend in the interest of public safety.

The Mayor read aloud a Proclamation and Order pursuant to Mississippi Code Section 33-15-17 declaring that recent acts of violence constituted a man-made emergency. The Order established that alcoholic beverage sales shall end at 1:30 a.m. on Saturday, Sunday, and Monday, and that retailers of alcoholic beverages shall close at 2:00 a.m. on those dates. These measures shall remain in effect through Labor Day weekend and will be reevaluated at the next Regular Meeting on Tuesday, September 2, 2025.

Alderman Pfeiffer questioned how the "man-made emergency" designation applies in this situation and raised concerns regarding the enforcement mechanism for closing times. Police Chief Steven Dye emphasized that public safety remains the City's top priority. He reported that six shots were fired on Washington Avenue after patrons left a downtown bar the previous weekend and that two shell casings had been recovered from a separate incident on Bowen Avenue the weekend before. Chief Dye stated that

the Police Department has increased its presence downtown and will continue heightened patrols throughout the holiday weekend. Based on a review of recent data, he noted that criminal and violent activity tends to increase after 2:00 a.m. Following his remarks, Alderman Hinton reiterated that the measures adopted were temporary in nature, intended only to address immediate concerns over the holiday weekend, and not a long-term solution.

A motion was made by Alderman Stennis and seconded by Alderman Messenger to adopt the Proclamation and Order restricting alcoholic beverage sales and requiring earlier closing times for retailers of alcoholic beverages. The motion carried with a roll call vote as follows:

## EXHIBIT A GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

- 1. **Relationship between Consultant and Client**. Neel-Schaffer, Inc. ("Consultant") shall serve as the Client's professional consultant in those phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies. The relationship is that of a buyer and seller of professional services and it is understood that the parties have not entered into any joint venture or partnership with the other. - 2. **Responsibility of Consultant**. No other representation, warranty or guarantee, express or implied, is included or intended in this Agreement or in any report, opinion, document, or otherwise.
- 3. Responsibility of the Client. Client shall provide all information and criteria as to its requirements for the Project, including budgetary limitations. Consultant shall be entitled to rely upon the accuracy and completeness of any and all information provided by Client. If applicable to the scope of work, Client shall arrange for Consultant to enter upon public and private property and obtain all necessary approvals required from all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project. Client shall provide reasonable notice to Consultant whenever Client becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or timing of Consultant's services.

Client shall notify the Consultant of any deficiency in the Consultant's services of which the Client becomes aware, so that Consultant may take measures to minimize the consequences of such deficiency. Client's failure to notify the Consultant shall relieve the Consultant of any liability for costs to remedy the deficiency above the sum such remedy would have cost had prompt notification been given when such defects were first discovered.

- 4. Construction Phase Services. If Consultant's scope of services includes the observation and monitoring of work performed by Client's other contractors, Consultant shall provide personnel to observe and monitor the work in accordance with the Standard of Care in order to ascertain that it is being performed in general conformance with the plans and specifications. Consultant shall not supervise, direct, or have control over any construction contractor's work. Consultant shall not have authority over or responsibility for construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures or for safety precautions and programs in connection with the work of the construction contractor. Consultant does not guarantee the performance of the construction contractor and does not assume responsibility for the contractor's failure to furnish and perform its work in accordance with the plans and specifications.
- 5. Ownership of Documents. All reports, drawings, specifications, data, calculations, notes, and other documents, including those in electronic form prepared by Consultant are instruments of Consultant's service that shall remain the property of Consultant. Client agrees not to use the deliverables for projects other than the Project for which the documents were prepared by Consultant, or for future modifications to the Project, without Consultant's express written consent. Any reuse or distribution to third parties without such express written permission or project-specific adaptation by Consultant will be at the Client's sole risk and without liability to Consultant or its employees, subsidiaries, and subconsultants.
- 6. **Opinion of Costs**. When required as a part of its scope of services, Consultant will furnish opinions or estimates of construction cost on the basis of Consultant's experience and qualifications, but Consultant does not guarantee the accuracy of such estimates. The parties recognize that Consultant has no control over the cost of labor, material, equipment, or services furnished by others or over market conditions or contractors' methods of determining prices.
- 7. **Suspension of Services**. Client may, at any time, by written notice, suspend the services of Consultant. Upon receipt of such notice, Consultant shall take all reasonable steps to mitigate costs allocable to the suspended services. Client, however, shall pay all reasonable and necessary costs associated with such suspension including the cost of assembling documents, personnel and equipment, rescheduling or reassignment costs necessary to maintain continuity and the staff required to resume the services upon expiration of the suspension.
- 8. **Termination**. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon 30 days' written to the other party. Upon such termination, Client shall pay Consultant for all services performed up to the date of termination. If Client is the terminating party, Client shall pay Consultant all reasonable cost and expenses incurred by Consultant in effecting the termination, including but not limited to non-cancellable commitments and demobilization costs, if any.

9. Indemnification. Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless Client from and against those damages and costs (including reasonable attorneys' fees) that Client incurs as a result of third party claims for personal injury or property damage to the extent caused by the negligent acts, errors or omissions of Consultant.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, Client shall indemnify and hold harmless Consultant from and against those damages and costs (including reasonable attorneys' fees) that Consultant incurs as a result of third party claims for personal injury or property damage to the extent caused by the negligent acts, errors or omissions of Client.

- 10. Legal Proceedings. In the event Consultant or its employees are required by Client to provide testimony, answer interrogatories, produce documents or otherwise provide information in relation to any litigation, arbitration, proceeding or other inquiry arising out of Consultant's services, where Consultant is not a party to such proceeding, Client will compensate Consultant for its services and reimburse Consultant for all related direct costs incurred in connection with providing such testimony or information.
- 11. **Successors and Assigns**. The terms of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assigns; provided however, that neither party shall assign this Agreement in whole or in part without the prior written consent of the other party.
- 12. **Insurance**. Consultant agrees to maintain the following insurance coverage with the following limits of insurance during the performance of Consultant's work hereunder:
  - (a) Commercial General Liability insurance with standard ISO coverage and available limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 general aggregate;
  - (b) Automobile Liability insurance with standard ISO coverage and available combined single limits of \$1,000,000 per accident;
  - (c) Worker's Compensation insurance with limits as required by statute and Employer's Liability insurance with limits of \$1,000,000 per employee for bodily injury by accident/\$1,000,000 per employee for bodily injury by disease/\$1,000,000 policy limit for disease; and
  - (d) Professional Liability insurance covering the Consultant's negligent acts, errors, or omissions in the performance of professional services with available limits of \$1,000,000 per claim and annual aggregate.

Consultant shall provide a certificate of insurance evidencing such insurance coverage to Client prior to the start of Consultant's work and annually upon renewal of coverage. Consultant shall cause Client to be named as an additional insured on Consultant's commercial general liability and auto liability policies, which shall be primary and noncontributory.

- 13. **Consequential Damages**. Neither Client nor Consultant shall be liable to the other or shall make any claim for any special, incidental, indirect or consequential damages arising out of, or connected in any way to the Project or this Agreement. This mutual waiver includes, but is not limited to, damages related to loss of use, loss of profits, loss of income, loss of reputation, loss of business or diminution of property value and shall apply regardless of legal theory such damages are alleged including negligence, strict liability, breach of contract and breach of warranty.
- 14. **Payment.** Unless agreed to otherwise, Consultant shall submit monthly invoices to the Client. Payment in full shall be due upon receipt of the invoice. Payment of any invoices by the Client shall be taken to mean that the Client is satisfied with the Consultant's services to the date of the payment and is not aware of any deficiencies in those services. If payments are delinquent after 30 days from invoice date, the Client agrees to pay interest on the unpaid balance at the rate of one percent (1%) per month. If the Client fails to make payments when due; then Consultant, after giving seven (7) days written notice to the Client, may suspend services until the Client has paid in full all amounts due for services, expenses, and other related charges without recourse to the Client for loss or damage caused by such suspension. Payment for Consultant's services is not contingent on any factor, except the Consultant's ability to provide services in a manner consistent with the Standard of Care. If the Client contests an invoice, the Client may withhold only that portion so contested and shall pay the undisputed portion.
- 15. **Force Majeure**. Neither Client nor Consultant shall be liable for the failure to perform (except Client's obligation to make payment when due) caused by any contingency beyond their reasonable control, including but not limited to, acts of God, wars, strikes, walkouts, fires, natural calamities, or demands or requirements of governmental agencies.

#### 1) Application for 415 Ruskin Ave.

Request: Trim Live Oak limbs that overhang house per insurance request.

Building Official: Recommend approving no more than 20% trim and removal of deadwood and limbs needed for rood clearance to prevent loss of insurance.

#### 2) Application for 610 Rayburn Ave.

Request: Remove one Live Oak that is rotting in front yard, west of two Magnolias. Request to trim dead limbs on one large Live Oak on NW side of property.

Building Official: Recommend approving removal of one rotting Live Oak in front yard to prevent damage to property. Recommend approving removal of deadwood and dying limbs on Live Oak at NW side of property. Trimming may exceed 20%, but it is necessary to prevent damage to neighboring property due to the amount of dead and dying limbs.

#### 3) Application for 3120 Eagle Point Rd
