Girl Scouts of NYPENN Pathways win Bronze Stevie Award

CICERO — The Girl Scouts of NYPENN Pathways (GSNYPENN) Council was recently named winner of a Bronze Stevie® Award in the Best Annual Report, Non-Profit Organizations category in the 18th Annual International Business Awards®. The International Business Awards (IBA) are the world's premier business awards program. All individuals and organizations worldwide — public and private, for-profit and non-profit, large and small — are eligible to submit nominations.

The 2021 IBAs received more than 3,800 entries from organizations of all sizes, in virtually every industry, spanning 65 nations. As the ongoing COVID-19 crisis prevented winners from receiving awards onstage during a traditional gala banquet, winners were celebrated during a virtual ceremony on Dec. 8.

This year's competi-

tion featured a number of categories to recognize organizational and individual responses to the pandemic. Award winners were determined by the average scores of more than 260 executives worldwide who participated in the judging process from June through early August.

GSNYPENN's 2020 Annual Impact Report was conceptualized and created as a full-size "special edition" newspaper (printed on actual newsprint) using annual membership, program, and giving data interwoven with graphics, images, and narrative telling the story of the council's unique 2019-2020 membership year. The piece was mailed to council members, board, staff, donors, and key stakeholders. To read the full report, visit gsnypenn.org/impactreport.

"Our 2020 Annual Impact Report was designed to commemorate the extraordinary efforts of our

girl and adult members, staff, and community partners during a once-in-a-lifetime event: the COVID-19 pandemic. Our goal was to communicate the gravity of the situation and the duality of our membership year (beginning normally on Oct. 1, 2019 and taking a sharp turn in mid-March 2020) while highlighting the joyous spirit of our members who continued to earn their highest awards, kept each other comforted during the crisis, and quickly pivoted when in-person activities were no longer safe," said Wendy Cobrda, GSNYPENN chief marketing and strategy officer.

Sadly, the council lost some long-time volunteers and members to the virus and other events in 2019/2020 and could not mourn together in person due to the pandemic. An editorial decision was made to also include a special obituary section in the report, in memory

of those Girl Scout sisters lost.

"The theme of our 2020 Annual Impact Report was intended to remind all that no matter the challenge, even a pandemic, Girl Scouts always lead and leave a lasting impact on their communities," Cobrda added.

The creative team behind the publication included Wendy Cobrda, Chief Marketing & Strategy Officer (concept, contributing writer), Jaime Alvarez, Senior Director of Marketing and Communications (project manager, editor, contributing writer), Colleen Winschel, Marketing Designer (graphic designer, contributing photographer, mailing distribution) and Angela Smith, Executive Administrator (project contributor, mailing distribution). The publication was printed by Gatehouse Media (Observer-Dispatch/Times Telegram) located in Utica, N.Y.
