### Summary



In September 2019, with a broad base of support, the Ecology Action Center (EAC) repeated the successful public-private strategy of 2012, 2015, and 2017 and held a locally funded Household Hazardous Waste Collection for McLean County residents. The event brought 1,050 cars to the event held at the Rivian Automotive plant and representing an estimated 1,680 McLean County households. This was the first HHW event that the EAC required residents to register in advance of the event via a webbased registration system. This led to a significant reduction in wait time for attendees with 1,236 appointments made and only 14 non-appointment attendees showing up to the event.

The effort successfully collected 16,242 gallons of hazardous waste materials for safe disposal in addition to 17,501 pounds of electronic waste collected for recycling. While this shows a reduction in both volume of materials collected and households participating from recent events, this can at least partially be attributed to some hesitation on the part of local residents to transition to the new appointment-based system. The great success of this system demonstrated by negligible wait-times for event participants throughout the day should help return participation rates to normal within the next couple of HHW events. Additionally, the lower turnout was a positive factor in managing this transition.

The City of Bloomington, Town of Normal, and McLean County together act as the major public funders of the collection, providing \$140,000 to cover the costs of the service. The EAC raised another \$34,009 from private sources, including sponsorships from local businesses, donations from families and individuals, and in-kind contributions of services. These private funds supplement local government funding and ensure that adequate resources are available to cover the full costs of the HHW collection. The resources provided through private fundraising successfully exceeded the final costs of the event, leaving nearly \$19,000 of additional HHW Fund reserves for future needs.

79 volunteers worked over 300 hours to help the EAC staff set-up, work the event, and tear everything back down at the end of the day.

The Ecology Action Center is the solid waste agency for the City of Bloomington, Town of Normal, and McLean County. In this role, the EAC coordinates community-wide solid waste planning, performs education and outreach to increase recycling, offers comprehensive recycling and waste information for area residents and businesses, provides a free smart phone or browser app for 24-hour access to recycling information, and coordinates HHW services for the McLean County area.











E-waste recycled by volume




E-waste materials recycled by cost




Event attendees by municipality
