WHAT DO I SMELL?

When propane is taken from the ground, it is tasteless, colorless, and odorless. To make propane easier to detect, a harmless, but strong-smelling rotten egg-like odor is added. If you smell this odor, there may be a gas leak present. Following a few simple guidelines can help ensure your safety and enjoyment of the benefits of propane.

IF YOU SMELL GAS:

- Do not smoke. Do not use lighters or matches.
- Do not turn on/off any switches or appliances, including a flashlight.
- Do not use the phone in your house.
- Leave immediately; leaving the door open for ventilation.
- Call your gas company from outside your home. Call 928-474-2294

IF THE ODOR IS VERY STRONG, CALL 911

Be mindful of odor loss. Due to air, water, and rust in a propane tank, cylinder, or passage of soil leaking can cause unintended reduction in the odor concentration of propane. You should respond immediately to even the faintest odor of gas.

GAS PIPING SHOULD BE:

- Periodically inspect for leaks and corrosion
- Repaired if an unsafe condition is found

WHERE CAN I DIG:

Anyone excavating in the state of Arizona is required by law to have underground facilities located. Always call 811 two days before starting any digging project. A ground utility service will locate and identify all underground utilities at no cost.
