are working together to help adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities find meaningful work within the community, including City Hall.

The Benevilla Group Support-ed Employment (GSE) program is an extension of the Benevilla "Helping Partners Life Enrichment Program" with a vision to assist members in obtaining meaningful employment.

Benevilla job coaches help workers achieve individualized employment goals by strengthening employment skills, providing job training in differ-ent industries and exposing workers to employment opportunities within the community.

For many, this is the first time in their lives they earned a paycheck of their own. On average, 15 mem-bers are employed in the GSE program each month. Collectively, the workers clock over 600 hours per month. This

Benevilla and the City of Surprise is a wonderful employee pool for Benevilla and for outside employers as well including local city governments and private businesses.

The City of Surprise offered underutilized space in City Hall to house the program. GSE workers now have space to hold training session and work on resumes and fill out online applications. The city is providing opportunities for GSE workers at City Hall as Administrative Assistants in the Water Works Department and as Janitors in the Facilities Department.

Started by the community and for the community in 1981, Benevilla is a not-for-profit human services agency dedicated to enhancing the lives of West Valley residents by providing care services for older adults, intellectually disabled adults, children, and families. 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WSHS Helps Homeless Mom Find Success

Having a baby is life changing. For a homeless, single mother of infant twins, Shannon's obstacles were overwhelming.

Early Head Start

Determined to give her daughters the best life possible, Shannon enrolled her children into the Westside Head Start/ Early Head Start home visitation program after visitation program after making temporary living arrangements. Early Head Start teaches parents of infants and toddlers parenting skills and child development for ages 0-3. A Growing Family When the twin's father

came back to Shannon's life, the family's dynamic changed. Soon, Shannon became pregnant again and enrolled as a preg-nant mother in the Home Based program. During her pregnancy, Shannon enrolled in online courses to become a medical assistant. When the twins turned one year old, they were transferred to an Early Head Start classroom. Shannon continued to receive home visitation services when the new baby was born. Westside Head Start is committed to helping the whole fami-ly and works to engage and equip mothers and fathers

to be great parents. After a while, the father started participating in classes to improve his parenting and help his children.

A Bright Future Once Shannon's baby turned one year old, she was transferred to an Early Head Start classroom. This allowed Shannon to continue her education, and attend college classes on campus. A lot has changed for Shannon and her family over the years. This year, the baby transitioned to a 3-year-old Head Start classroom. The twins attended Head Start for two years, are now enrolled in Kindergarten, and are expected to thrive.

The family has also found new security, both adults are working and they have become first time home owners.

Changes for Westside Head Start

Catholic Charities Westside Head Start helps families in transition or expe-

families in their homes and dozens of classrooms in western Maricopa County. On July 1, 2016 Westside Head Start became a grantee pro-gram and began making improvements. Some classrooms now offer full day opportunities that will make it easier for working parents to take advantage of the program. In half day sessions there will now be two teachers in each classroom with each teacher facilitating one session. This change will allow for more planning, pro-fessional development and training, and greater opportunities for teachers to develop positive and productive relationships with children and families. may have a significant other who relies on their support. Life insurance can help provide for them.

- Stay-at-home spouses. Life insurance isn't just for breadwinners. It can help cover the cost of replacing the services of stay-at-home parents.
- Single parents. These individuals are typically the sole source of support for their children. Life insurance can help provide for children financially should their parent die.

How the teacher shortage in education impacts all of us

At this time of the year in Arizona when all teaching positions should be filled, there are still approximately 800 openings and over 250 job aban-donments. That leaves classrooms with substitutes and districts scrambling to cover classes. In a June 19 arti-cle in the Washington Post, "According to new Census Bureau statistics, Arizona is near the bottom of a state list of spending per student at \$7,208. The average per pupil spending around the country is \$10,700, and the state is near or at the bottom for classroom spending per student." It is hard to convince college students to join the ranks when our state is not investing as it should in education or teachers.

So what can we do about this teach-er shortage? The Educator Recruit-ment & Retention Task Force from the Arizona Department of Education in their report of January 2015 listed strategies that schools and districts, the Arizona Department of Educa-tion and policymakers can implement and reinforce. They include sharing best practices from school districts on retention, increasing debt forgiveness for teachers who make teaching a long-term career, provide cost-effective high quality profession-al development, reward exceptional performance, recognize teachers for the incredible job they do to edu-cate students every day, and let legis-lators know how vital a fair wage is for teachers.
