Paths to QUALITY is Indiana's voluntary quality rating and improvement system for child care. This system is the first and only child care rating system in the state!

The system identifies four levels of quality. Child care programs start at Level 1- by meeting basic health and safety standards and then may progress to the highest level - Level 4, which includes achieving national accreditation. Every level also contains significant staff training and education requirements. Each level builds on the previous levels, resulting in significant improvements at every level. When choosing child care, search for programs that demonstrate high quality care and offer rich learning environments, such as those that voluntarily participate in Paths to QUALITY. Paths to QUALITY eligible programs include licensed child care centers, licensed family child care homes, and unlicensed registered ministries who have met voluntary certification standards.
