He raced circle track and was still drag racing at 80 years old.

Larry was born December 29, 1940 to Charles and Thelma Loehr of Lake Orion, Michigan. He was preceded in death by his parents and siblings, Francis, Lynwood and Carolyn. Larry passed peacefully with his family by his side.
