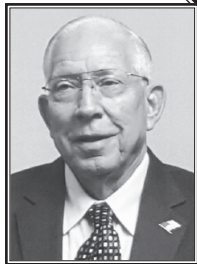


Richard “Dick” Ervin Myers



Richard “Dick” Ervin Myers passed away April 1, 2021. Born in Phoenix, AZ in 1940 and raised in Eloy.

Graduated SCVUHS 1958. In 1967 was employed by El Paso Natural Gas Co. as clerk in Casa Grande office and then Pipeline Welder’s assistant. From there his career took him to Topock, AZ as Superintendent of the North West AZ pipeline region of EPNG. Retiring in 1996 and coming back to Eloy area, Dick involved himself in many different projects and loved being close to his family. With help from the Antique Archaeology group out of Mesa, the City of Eloy and donations from many supportive friends and businesses, restored the original Toltec School into a museum promoting the history of Eloy and the surrounding farming communities. He was always learning and sharing his love of the area by conducting tours around the Picacho Mt. Range, belonging to the Eloy Chamber of Commerce and many other organizations over the years. Meeting people from all over the world was always a plus with him.
