Named after the Greek goddess who rode rainbows, the elegant and hardy iris has been favored by royal houses throughout history. Despite its noble background, this perennial is rugged and easy to grow and care for.

There are about 300 species of iris. Most irises flower in early summer. Some — mostly bearded hybrids — are **remontant**, flowering again later in the summer. Irises have distinctive six-petaled flowers, with three outer hanging petals (called "falls") and three inner upright petals (called "standards").

These flowers are usually blue, but are sometimes lilac or white.

Irises may be bearded, with soft hairs along the center of the fall petals; beardless, with no hairs; or crested, with hairs forming a comb or ridge.

Bearded irises can grow taller than 28 inches.

Irises attract butterflies and hummingbirds, and they make lovely cut flowers. They are also deer-resistant and

drought-tolerant.

full sun but can survive in partial sun.

It's easy to make the mistake of planting irises too deep. The rhizomes of these plants should be partially exposed to the elements, or thinly covered with soil in hot climates.

Do not mulch around the rhizome as this may cause rot.

Water thoroughly. Irises tend to like wet feet but dry knees.
