BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Idaho, discourages removal of names, images, or symbols of Native Americans or other indigenous people by schools or other places, unless after a careful and effective public process, the appropriate government entity determines that there is a consensus amongst the affected individual Native American or other indigenous people that a name, image, or symbol should be removed.
