Favorite pastime: Linguistics

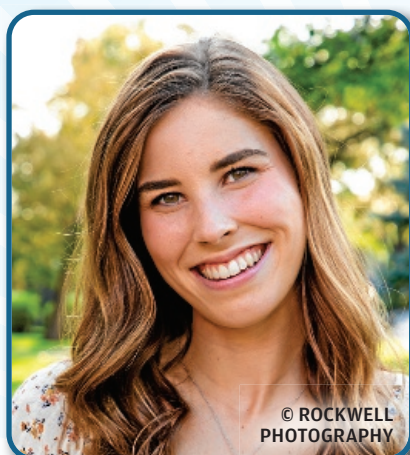
