BOND PROPOSAL QUESTION

The Board of Education of the City of Somers Point in the County of Atlantic, New Jersey (The “Board”) is authorized to: (a) undertake various improvements, renovations, alterations and upgrades to Jordan Road Elementary School, including acquisition and installation of fixtures, furniture, equipment, and any site work; (b) undertake various improvements, renovations, alterations and upgrades to Dawes Avenue Elementary School, including acquisition and installation of fixtures, furniture, equipment, and any site work; (c) recoat the roof at the New York Avenue Building, including any site work; (d) appropriate \$5,575,000 for such improvements; and (e) issue bonds in an amount to exceed \$5,575,000.

The final eligible costs for the projects approved by the New Jersey Commissioner of Education are \$5,499,235 (consisting of \$ 4,301,976 for Jordan Road Elementary School, \$1,197,259 for Dawes Avenue School and \$0 for New York Avenue Building. The projects include \$75,765 for the New York Avenue Building for school facility construction elements in addition to the facilities efficiency standards developed by the Commissioner of Education or not otherwise eligible for the State of New Jersey (the “State”) support pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7G-5(g). The State debt service aid percentage will equal 40% of the annual debt service due with respect to the final eligible costs of the projects. The State debt service aid is contingent upon the passing of this Bond Proposal Question. The Board is authorized to transfer funds among the projects approved at this election.

VOTING ACCESSIBILITY FOR THE ELDERLY AND HANDICAPPED ACT

“Pursuant to provisions of the voting Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act of 1984 (Public Law 98-435) a telecommunication device for the deaf (TDD) is maintained at the Election Division, Department of State, Trenton, New Jersey.

All polling places in Atlantic County will be equipped with audio voting for the blind. Voters who have difficulty voting due to blindness, disability or an inability to read or write may bring a person to assist them at the polls or may ask for assistance from the poll workers. Sample ballots are mailed to every registered voter the week prior to the election listing offices, candidates and public questions to be voted upon along with the voter's election voting district number and polling location.

Under New Jersey law you have the right to vote in privacy, to have a reasonable amount of time to vote, to receive a replacement ballot if you spoil the first one, and to bring written material into the polling place for your personal use.

A “Voter’s Bill of Rights” will be prominently displayed at your polling place listing procedures for:

- ✓ Voting by voting machine, provisional ballot and Vote by Mail Ballot.
- ✓ The requirements for first time registrants by mail.
- ✓ The Challenge process in the polling place and Do’s & Don’ts for challengers.
- ✓ Exit polling.
- ✓ Election Offenses: electioneering, fraudulent voting and conspiracy.
- ✓ Availability of Voter Complaint Forms at the polling place.

If you believe that your right to vote has been violated in any way, you should immediately notify your County Board of Elections or County Superintendent of Elections

USE OF PROVISIONAL BALLOTS ON ELECTION DAY

If you are a registered voter who has moved within the County and you did not notify the County Commissioner of Registration of your new address, you will be permitted to vote in the election as follows:

- (1) Go to the polling place for the election district of your current address.
- (2) Tell poll workers you are a registered voter but have moved within the County.
- (3) You will be permitted to vote by provisional ballot.
