

HOW 'STACKING' OF BACK BAYS INCREASES FLOODING

Any onshore wind will push waters from the Atlantic Ocean onto the shores and back bays.

This can happen in any land form, but the back bays and towns on the mainland are the most susceptible to 'stacking'

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
