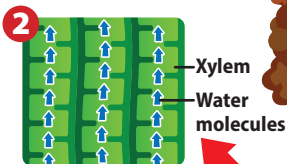
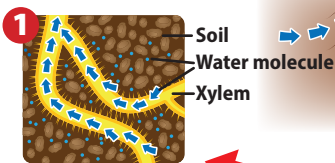


Salt-soaked air strips away the waxy outer layer. Salt gets into the soil as well. Without adequate rain from the storm, the water pressure in the tree is reduced, stopping water from traveling to the leaves. Without water, the leaves turn brown and drop off.



Pressure existing in the tree draws water up the trunk towards the leaves.



Roots take up water from the soil.
