



Calendar Change

- ★ Staff training Sept. 1-3.
- ★ First day for students Sept. 8th.
- ★ Students begin school after Labor Day



Mask Requirements

- ★ Face coverings required at all times
- ★ Three conditions must be met to remove masks?
 - 1. Students are all seated
 - 2. All are socially distanced
 - 3. Teacher directed after confirming distancing and seating.



Mask Requirements

- ★ Masks must be worn during:
 - -- transitions
 - -- bathroom use
 - -- water breaks
 - -- hand sanitizing/washing
 - -- any small group activities



Mask Requirements

- ★ How do you address students who don't follow mask protocols?
 - -- 2 verbal warnings
 - -- 3rd verbal warning and call home
 - -- 4th verbal warning inform parents continued non compliance may result in child having to go online.
 - -- Continued non compliance will result in admin intervention.

Close Contact

- ★ When six feet distance can't be maintained, you have to follow these guidelines:
 - Mask acceptable if contact is shorter than ten minutes
 - If close contact extends beyond 10 minutes, you have to have two forms of PPE
 - -- Masks
 - -- Plexiglass dividers
 - -- Face shields

Screening Protocol

- ★ Screening starts at home.
- ★ If your child is sick, please keep them home.
 - 24 hours fever free
 - Take to a doctor if symptoms do not subside.

- ★ We will adjust attendance policy.
 - No Truancy fears.
 - No attendance awards

Screening Protocol

- ★ Prior to student arrival, all staff will complete self assessment protocol
- ★ Homerooms extended to 8:30AM to allow student morning screening
- ★ Student screening becomes a part of daily routine

Screening Protocol

- ★ Main parts of screening
 - -- Touchless temperature checks
 - Discussion that allows teachers to check for symptoms
- ★ Students who clearly exhibit symptoms go to Nurse for further screening.



Arrival

- ★ Students enter through designated entrances, beginning at 8:05.
- ★ Teachers in homerooms or on duty by 8:05.
- ★ Students will not line up in hallway, cafeteria, or on blacktop.
- ★ Families will receive maps with entrance/ exit locations.

Arrival

- ★ Staff on duty to direct students
- ★ Teachers in homeroom to conduct screening

★ Enforce mask compliance (must cover nose and mouth).

Arrival

- ★ Homeroom and duty are extended until 8:30.
- ★ No students sent to the office as late prior to 8:30.
- ★ After 8:30, students dropped off at the main office.
- ★ PK3 and 4 arrive at 8:30 and enter through classroom doors.

Schedule

- ★ Very similar to current schedule.
- **★** Modifications include:
 - 30 minute periods
 - Homeroom teachers moved to accommodate class sizes by grade level.
 - Teachers move from classroom to classroom instead of students.

Hallway Traffic

- ★ All traffic must be one way and will be guided by signage and floor markers
- ★ Classes will have to wait until students pass before moving.
- ★ Hall monitors help with supervision, traffic direction and bathroom monitoring
- ★ BSI and SPED students will continue to be pulled for services.

Bathroom Use

- ★ One student in the bathroom at a time
- ★ Hallway monitors will direct students and spray sanitizer.
- ★ Teachers with bathrooms in classrooms will have to spray sanitizer between uses.

Bathroom Use

- ★ Classrooms without bathrooms will have to schedule bathroom breaks and coordinate with other teachers from non bathroom classes.
- ★ Students will have to use bathrooms before and after lunch.
- ★ Teachers will have to make this a routine.

Specials

★ Special area teachers will go directly to classes

- ★ Students will go to gym for gym class
 - Middle School will not change clothes
- ★ Teachers must escort classes to gym

Physical Education

- ★ Social distancing will take place
- ★ Students will go outside as much as possible
- ★ Mr. Abbott is modifying his curriculum to ensure social distancing

Recess/DPA

★ Students will have recess as scheduled

★ Must stay in designated areas

★ Follow social distancing rules.

Recess/DPA

- ★ Teachers must direct/organize activities and/or directly oversee free play
- ★ During inclement weather, teachers provide activities in classroom.
- Must continue to follow social distancing rules.

Lunch

- ★ Broken up into three periods.
- ★ Only 60 students allowed in the cafeteria at a time.
- ★ Students at certain grade levels will follow a rotation of cafeteria-classroom.

Lunch

- ★ 1st lunch (PK3-K): 11:00-11:30 All students
- ★ 2nd lunch (1-4): 11:45-12:15

 Two grade levels on any given day.
- ★ 3rd lunch (5-8): 12:30-1:00

 Two grade levels on any given day
- * Rotations will be weekly.

Dismissal

- ★ Students exit the building from designated doors they entered.
- ★ PK 3-4 will dismiss at 2:30. All others 3:02.
- ★ PK-5th grade pick up on NJ Avenue
- ★ Middle school to pick up from Pacific Ave.



Online Learning

- ★ Students can opt out of in-person learning at any point.
- ★ If a family chooses to be online, they have to wait until the next marking period to switch back to in person learning.
- ★ We remain committed to working with families and handle each situation on a case by case basis.

Online Learning

- ★ All teachers will be required to have a Google Classroom to start the year
- ★ Each student will have a Crest Gmail account
- ★ Assignments will be added to Google Classroom

Online Learning

- ★ Classroom teacher responsible for assigning all work through Google Classroom.
- ★ Online support teacher will be responsible for collecting, grading completed work and (if needed) providing additional support.
- ★ Online Support Teacher
 - At least 3 Zooms a week for Math and Reading
 - 1 Zoom for Science and Social Studies (Can be on Friday)

Contact Tracing

- ★ School personnel document all contacts
- ★ Health department does outside of school
- ★ All affected are informed of suspected case



Cleaning Protocols

- ★ Disinfecting and sanitizing conducted nightly.
- ★ Staff added for expanded cleaning of high frequency areas during day.
- ★ Deep cleaning happens any time there is a confirmed case in the area where infection happened.



Extracurricular Activities

- ★ Largely postponed until Spring
- ★ Will have to follow all social distancing protocols
- ★ External organizational use limited or postponed until Spring

Transportation

- ★ Guidelines shared with trolley company
- ★ We'll advise parents of compliance
- ★ No further recourse



Social emotional

- * Recognize transition will be tough
- ★ Planned periodic check ins
- ★ Training with staff during opening days
- ★ Community always responds and will continue to aid families in need.



Self Isolation/Quarantine based Testing Result

Quarantine vs. Self-Isolation

- Purpose of quarantine is to keep non symptomatic people away from others.
- Isolation is to keep SICK people away from those who are not infected.

 Self quarantine/isolation are voluntary practices to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

Self-Quarantine Vs. Self-Isolation

- Any person getting a COVID-19 diagnostic test (nasal or saliva) should Self-Quarantine after specimen collection
- Until a negative result is obtained, a person should remain in quarantine unless directed otherwise by a medical professional.
- These recommendations are not for individuals who got the antibody test.

How Infection Happens

According to Board of Health, in order to catch COVID-19:

No Mask Closer than 6 feet Longer than 10 minutes

Student or teacher tests positive?

- If the student was Symptomatic, sent to Urgent Care, and tested positive -- contact tracing within CMS will occur.
- Parents of will be notified if their child came into contact with the student.
- Student isolated from school and not admitted until a note from their doctor to return.
- Students and teachers permitted back in building as long as they have no symptoms and continue to follow social distancing protocols.

Mask, 6 feet apart, proper hygiene.

What if a family member of a student has tested positive?

- Student would have to self quarentine for 14 Days from last known exposure with the Covid-19 person.
- Student would then have to do virtual learning from home.
- Student will need to have zero symptoms in order to return to school after the 14 day self isolation.
