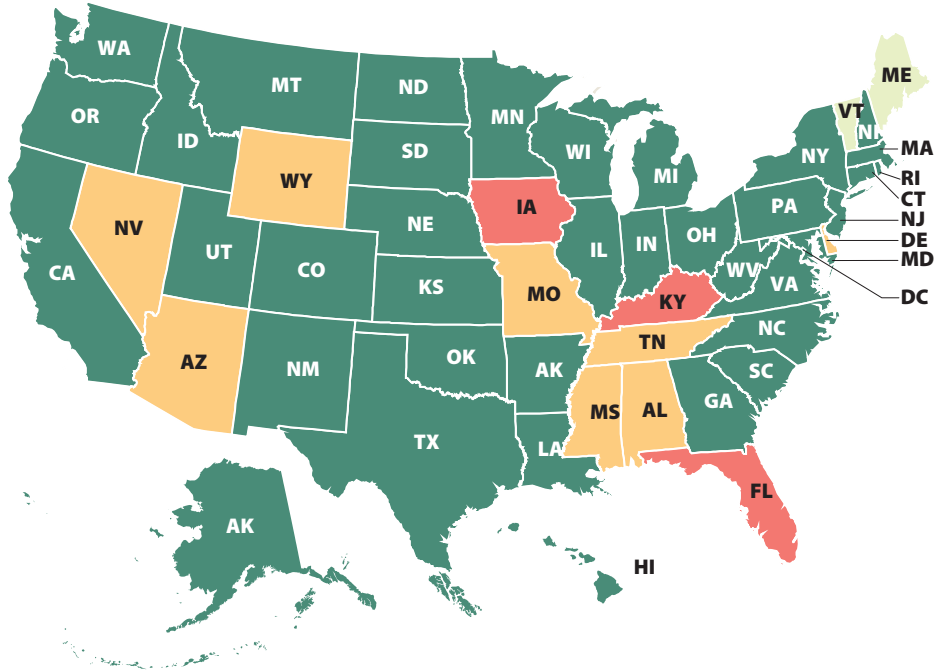


## HOW STATES HANDLE WHEN FELONS CAN VOTE

In most states, felons can vote when they've paid their debt to society. Three states – Florida, Kentucky and Iowa – ban felons from voting unless they get permission from the governor.



**Felons permanently banned from voting unless governor grants a pardon:** Florida, Iowa, Kentucky

**Felons convicted of certain crimes permanently banned:** Alabama, Arizona, Delaware, Mississippi, Missouri, Nevada, Tennessee, Wyoming

**Felons' voting rights restored automatically upon completion of prison, probation and/or parole.**

**Felons allowed to vote in prison:** Maine, Vermont
