
## HOW STATES HANDLE WHEN FELONS CAN VOTE

In most states, felons can vote when they've paid their debt to society. Three states – Florida, Kentucky and Iowa – ban felons from voting unless they get permission from the governor.



Felons permanently banned from voting unless governor grants a pardon: Florida, lowa, Kentucky

Felons convicted of certain crimes permanently banned: Alabama, Arizona, Delaware, Mississippi, Missouri, Nevada, Tennessee, Wyoming

Felons' voting rights restored automatically upon completion of prison, probation and/or parole.

Felons allowed to vote in prison: Maine, Vermont
