Project Description/Comments:

The applicant proposes to extend the Avalon Fishing Pier which is located in the Atlantic Ocean, at the end of 31st Street, in the Borough, Cape May County. The entire proposed 200 linear feet of the structure would be constructed waterward of the mean high water. Work would be performed using equipment staged on the existing pier. Non-polluting materials would be used for the pier extension. Approximately 50 piles will be installed waterward of mean high water. Telephone, water and electrical utilities would be installed under the proposed dock. A fish cleaning station would be placed at the waterward end of the structure. No fill material would be placed waterward of the high tide line.

In accordance with the standard operating procedures of the Nationwide Permits, it is requested that you respond to this submittal within fifteen (15) days.

We are forwarding the attached PCN to the Fish and Wildlife Service and the National Marine Fisheries Service for review and comment concerning any likely effect to any threatened or endangered species, or their critical habitat, within those agencies' jurisdiction.
