Egg Harbor Township government is made up of five elected committee members, which include a mayor and deputy mayor. The present government consists of Mayor James J. McCullough, Deputy Mayor Paul Hodson, and committee members Joe Cafero, Frank Finnerty and Laura Pfrommer.

The township is situated in the southeast portion of Atlantic County, contiguous with Atlantic City. With a land area of approximately 68 square miles, it is one of the largest municipalities in the state.

The township is bounded by Hamilton Township to the west; Galloway Township to the north; the cities of Absecon, Pleasantville, Northfield, Linwood, Atlantic City and Somers Point to the east; Longport and Ocean City to the southeast; and Estell Manor to the south. Egg Harbor Township once encompassed all of Atlantic County, including Atlantic City.

Our community is made up of

diverse areas of woodlands, waterfront and residential growth areas. Egg Harbor Township has more waterfront than any other town in New Jersey from West Atlantic City all the way behind Atlantic City,

Ventnor, Margate, Longport, Ocean City and Somers Point, up to Mays Landing

Farmington, Bargaintown, Cardiff, Scullville and West Atlantic City make up the majority of the township. Anchorage Poynte and Seaview Harbor provide many waterfront residences. We are part of the Pinelands, and as a result our population exploded in the last 20 years.

From 2000 to 2010, the population went from 30,058 to 43,323 — a 44 percent increase. School populations increased substantially in correlation. Our residents approved many school building projects to keep up with the demand in education. Meanwhile, the

mayor and Township Committee kept many other recreation activities are the local-purpose tax one of the lowest in Atlantic County for full-service communities. Members of the Board of Education will be elected in November along with Township Committee members.


Likewise, the township has kept up with the demand for additional municipal services and recreational opportunities. We have purchased many acres of open space for preservation and recreation. Our parks are centralized and serve many needs. Bargaintown Park was completed to provide soccer, tennis, pickleball and baseball opportunities in addition to those provided at Canale Park. Our 55,000-square-foot Community Center was completed in 2007 and provides a home for recreational services, art and crafts, basketball, fine arts programs and many other community activities.

We have miles of trails for use by our residents, and our arboretum provides an opportunity to enjoy peace and tranquility in a wooded setting. Veterans Park is home to football, cheerleading, baseball, BMX and street hockey, and provided by numerous groups. We have 6- to 18-hole golf courses and own our own golf course that many residents enjoy. We also have many marinas for fishing and boating.

Egg Harbor Township is the home of Atlantic City International Airport and is the home of Coast Guard Air Station Atlantic City, the 177th Fighter Wing of the New Jersey Air National Guard and the Stockton Aviation Research and Technology Park.

The Atlantic City Expressway and Garden State Parkway intersect our town, while major bus lines provide public transportation. It is easy to connect to anywhere in New Jersey and surrounding states from the township.

Residents and visitors can enjoy our expansive Great Egg Harbor River frontage, our many parks, and our cultural and recreational activities. Business growth continues in Egg Harbor Township, and excellent restaurants provide a wide variety of cuisine, but our wonderful residents are the real reason Egg Harbor Township is a great place to live.

10 public schools help students reach their full potential

There are 10 schools in the Egg Harbor Township school system: a high school, an alternative high school, two middle schools and six elementary schools, all overseen by Interim Superintendent Fred Nickles.

The district states that it is committed to providing up-to-date, energy-efficient schools, high-quality curriculum and instruction, multiple and diverse co-curricular activities, and dedicated and competent faculty, staff and administration so students can reach their fullest potential.

The district provides multiple learning opportunities to students and staff through differentiated instruction and professional development workshops.

H. Russell Swift Elementary School

The H. Russell Swift Elementary School, 5 Swift Drive, houses preschoolers through third-graders. The student body is approximately 470.

Principal Patricia Connor writes in the school's state report card profile that its mission is to provide a safe, positive learning environment where students have a variety of learning opportunities to help them develop into healthy, productive, and lifelong learners

Ellmore H. Slaybaugh School Complex

Principal Maryann Giardina is at the helm of the Slaybaugh Primary and Elementary schools at 13 and 11 Swift Drive, respectively. The primary school houses students in preschool through first grade, and the elementary school is for students in second and third grade. Enrollment is about 809.

C.J. Davenport Complex

C.J. Davenport Primary and Elementary schools, at 2499 and 2501 Spruce Ave., respectively, teach students in preschool through third grade. Kevin Fricke is the principal for approximately 885 students.

In addition to the four preschool, 10 kindergarten and 10 first-grade classrooms, Davenport has three self-contained classrooms for students with multiple disabilities. The primary building is also home to the district's director of autism, a behavior specialist, and offices for the district IT department and the director of special programs and grants.

The elementary school contains 21 regular education second- and third-grade classrooms and one self-contained classroom for students with multiple disabilities.

Dr. Joyanne D. Miller Elementary School

The Joyanne Miller School, 2 Alder Ave., opened in September 2003 to all of the district's fourth- and fifth-grade students. It is has a student body of about 1,140, just under its capacity of 1,175.

Principal Latifah Potter describes the school's vision as "lighting the way for children to achieve their greatest academic potential while learning to respect themselves, others and their community is the foundation for our three simple school rules. These include respect for yourself, respect for others and respect for your community."

Fernwood Avenue and Alder Avenue Middle schools

The Fernwood Avenue Middle School, 4034 Fernwood Ave., is structured into nine small learning

communities for a more personalized educational process. Principal James Battersby oversees about 930 students at the school.

Alder Avenue Middle School, at 25 Alder Ave., is its sister school. Principal Joseph Marinelli oversees its 930 or so students.

Both schools teach grades six through eight.

Egg Harbor Township High School

Egg Harbor Township High School, 24 High School Drive, serves about 2,360 students in ninth through 12th grade. Class sizes are slightly above the state average, according to state data.

Principal Terry Charlton oversees four assistant principals, 11 department supervisors and a staff of nearly 200.

The high school has a graduation rate of more than 93 percent.


The school is classified by the NJSIAA for most sports as South Jersey Group IV, based on enrollment.

Eagle Academy

The Eagle Academy alternative school at 3517 Bargaintown Road is where some high school students will find success. Led by Director Bud Smith, Eagle Academy has small class sizes to better address the needs of students who are at high risk of failing or dropping out of school.

Board of Education

Egg Harbor Township Nature Reserve

The Egg Harbor Township Nature Reserve is a fishing and kayaking. 220-acre public park in the Scullville section of the township with entrances on Zion Road Road and Schoolhouse Road. It consists of an arboretum, a 40-acre lake and a wooded area with extensive trail systems. Its management and development is overseen by the Nature Reserve Committee, a nonprofit organization.

The reserve is open from dusk till dawn year round and provides areas for passive recreation and activities such as walking, bike riding, birdwatching,

The committee hosts an annual Turkey Trot 5K race and 1-mile fun run/walk the first Saturday after Thanksgiving.

Recently the reserve was awarded a \$24,000 grant from the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to improve its trail system and is considering options to provide better access to the trails. The Arboretum has of an Environmental Learning Center that is developing a butterfly garden, and an interactive smart trail developed by the Catawba Club, a township student organization.

Plans are underway to create a trail map and add park benches, picnic areas and a boat ramp for launching nonmotorized boats. Organizers anticipate working with other nonprofit organizations to offer seminars on birdwatching, planting and exploring the park's wildlife and vegetation.

The Nature Reserve Committee meets the second Tuesday of each month at the Egg Harbor Township Municipal Building, usually at 7 p.m.

Indoor and outdoor fun in EHT

The Recreation Department is open 9 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. weekdays at the Community Center. Here is a sampling of the offerings:

Youth sports

Health and fitness

Programs include yoga, cardio step classes, indoor walking, tennis lessons, tai chi, cardio kickboxing, volleyball, cooking classes, sports camps and clinics, and spring, summer and winter sports leagues. Check ehtrec.com throughout the year for details and program developments.

Bus trips

For those in search of fun times outside of the township, the Recreation Department sponsors several one-day bus trips each year to destinations such as

New York City; Baltimore's Inner Harbor; Peddler's Village in New Hope, Pennsylvania, Washington, D.C.; and Lancaster, Pennsylvania. The bus trips generally depart in the early morning from the Municipal Building and return that evening. Costs vary. Contact the department for dates and fees.

Youth summer camps

The Recreation Department sponsors seven-, eight-, nine- and 10-week Summer Adventure Camp programs with hours to meet nearly any working parent's schedule. The cost ranges from \$200 to \$275 a week for fun trips, indoor and outdoor games, sports, roller skating, beach days, crafts and puppet shows. All camps take place at the Community Center and start in June.

Rhythm and Movies in the park

The annual Rhythm in the Park summer concert series features shows 7 to 9 p.m. Fridays in July and August at Tony Canale Park. Movie nights are held on Saturdays. Call 609-272-8120 for information.

Egg Harbor Township Fast Facts

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, Egg Harbor Township covers an area of 74.93 square miles consisting of 66.59 square miles of land and 8.336 square miles of water. It is the second-largest municipality in Atlantic County.

In 2010 the Census Bureau recorded a population of 43,323. The 2016 population was estimated at 45,000.

Unincorporated areas include Bargaintown, English Creek, Scullville, Steelmanville, McKee City, Cardiff, Farmington and West Atlantic City.

The township is bordered by Hamilton Township to the west; Galloway Township to the north; Absecon, Pleasantville, Northfield, Linwood and Somers Point to the east; Longport and Ocean City to the southeast; and Estell Manor to the south.

The township is in the 2nd Congressional District and is part of New Jersey's 2nd Legislative District.

It operates under the township form of government. Residents elect five Township Committee members to three-year terms. The mayor and deputy mayor are chosen by Township Committee at a reorganization meeting each January. The mayor presides over meetings, but does not have greater powers than other committee members.

Trash and Recycling

Trash is collected Monday through Friday by zone. See ehtgov.org or call 609-926-3838 for your pickup day.

Bulk trash items should be put at the curb by 6 a.m. Monday of the scheduled week; see ehtgov. org/publicworks for bulk pickup schedules and a list of accepted materials.

State law prohibits electronic items from being disposed of as trash. Electronics can be dropped off

at the EHT Convenience Center, 6120 Mill Road, or call for curbside collection. Recyclable pickup is provided by the Atlantic County Utilities Authority. Residential recyclables pickup is every other week the same day as your trash day. Call the ACUA at 609-272-6960 for information.

Yard Waste

Bagged grass and leaves will only be collected in biodegradable paper bags weighing less than 50 pounds. Place bagged grass and leaves at the curb on trash day and they will be collected as near to your trash day as possible. Loose leaves raked to the curb are collected by vacuum collector in the spring and fall; signs will be posted with the start date for each zone. Personal vehicles must be kept at least 50 feet from leaf piles to allow collection access.

Compost made from collected leaves and grass is available to township residents and can be loaded by hand into any size vehicle for no charge. Screened or unscreened compost loaded by township equipment is available for a fee 7:30 a.m.-3 p.m. Mondays and Fridays from the Public Works Department, 6120 Mill Road.

Snow Removal

Parking on any snow-covered street in the township is prohibited, and vehicles are subject to ticketing and towing. If snow is forecast, you must park off the street. Residents who shovel snow before the snow plow passes are advised to pile the snow to the right of the driveway (facing the street), as it will minimize the amount of snow pushed into the driveway by the plow. Residents are responsible for clearing their own driveway and mailbox.

Animal Services

Dogs kept within the township for more than 10 days are required to be licensed through the municipal clerk's office. Call 609-926-4085.

Dogs must have a current rabies vaccination certificate to be licensed. Atlantic County holds a free rabies clinic each month; call 609-485-2345 for details.

The annual license fee is \$9 for a neutered pet and \$15 for an unneutered pet. A late fee of \$3 applies to licenses provided from April 1 through Dec. 31. Seeing Eye dogs must be licensed, but are exempt from fees.



Community Partnership for Egg Harbor Township Schools

In 2005, Egg Harbor Township schools were busting at the seams with nearly 8,000 students. The influx of new residents who came to the area in 1979 to fill casino jobs and Egg Harbor Township's designation as a Regional Growth Area by the state Pinelands Commission in 1980 combined to create the perfect storm of overpopulation.

As a result, Egg Harbor Township experienced a 41 percent population increase between 2000 and 2010, growing from 30,726 to 43,323, and adding about 300 new students per year to the local public school district, with no additional state aid to serve the burgeoning student population.

The Community Partnership for Egg Harbor Township Schools was founded in December 2005 to help address the financial shortfalls that overpopulation and cuts in state aid to public schools created, and to provide private funds to enhance and expand educational programs and extracurricular activities for students, and capital projects and technology upgrades.

Community Partnership is addressing another challenge: the fallout from the recession hitting the Atlantic City economy. As Atlantic County continues to lead the nation with the highest foreclosure rate, the trickle-down effect is hitting Egg Harbor Township hard. Mounting unemployment, high foreclosure rates and rising poverty are all acutely felt by the schools serving this community.

As an independent organization, the Community Partnership tries to adapt to the ever-changing needs of the schools and the student body. To date, the organization has raised about \$400,000 for Egg Harbor Township schools. The Board of Trustees is made up of concerned local business and community members who share a common goal of raising supplemental funding for instructional technology, academic enhancement, extracurricular activities and capital projects for the largest district in Atlantic County.

Funds raised directly support the schools and students in a continuing

Projects funded in 2016 include a Elementary School and computer lab at E.H. Slaybaugh Elementary School. Other projects funded over the past decade include iPads for students with autism at Dr. Jovanne D. Miller Elementary School; commercial kitchen equipment for the high school field house/concession stand, an LED marquee sign at High School Drive and English Creek Avenue, a Steinway grand piano for the district's performing arts students, new computer labs at Alder Avenue Middle School and Miller Elementary. and three high-definition digital cameras and upgrades for the high school media and EHT-TV program.

The nonprofit also has covered the costs of Advanced Placement tests for low-income students; start-up boys' and girls' lacrosse team equipment and uniforms; a Chris Herren anti-drug presentation for high school and middle school students; EHTHS

alumni website hosting; Renaissance Program funding, annual end-of-theyear eighth-grade student academic awards at Alder and Fernwood new playground at H. Russell Swift Avenue Middle Schools; a Leg-Up therapeutic horseback riding program for special-needs students; districtwide, life-saving automatic external defibrillators; Teacher of the Year county luncheon for the district's awardees, and the installation of two additional elementary school playgrounds at Davenport and Slaybaugh.

Tech Center is vital axis in Atlantic County's economic development

With the decline of employment in the casino industry due to competition from other states and the resulting downward economic conditions, officials in Atlantic County hired Angelou Economics, a consulting firm based in Austin, Texas, to prepare a comprehensive economic development study in 2015.

Among its recommendations was to create more positions in technical industries and to expand the opportu-

nities that exist. One entity was singled out in the final report as serving a continuing vital role in the county's future economic vitality: the Federal Aviation Administration William J. Hughes Technical Center.

Situated 10 miles northwest of Atlantic City on more than 5,000 acres that also contain the Atlantic City International Airport and a noncommercial aircraft hangar, the center employs more than 1,500 people. A similar number of contractor employees and about a

The center has served as the core facility for modernizing the air traffic control system and for advancing programs to enhance aviation safety in all stages of flight since 1958.

Previously known as the National Aviation Facilities Experimental Center, or NAFEC, it was renamed the Federal Aviation Administration Technical Center in 1980; the name of longtime 2nd District Congressman and U.S. Ambassador William J. Hughes was added in 1996.

The Tech Center serves as the national scientific test base for research and development, testing and evaluation, and verification and validation in air traffic control, communications, navigation, airports, aircraft safety and security. Its laboratories and engineering place the Technical Center at the forefront of the FAA's challenge to modernize the U.S. air transportation system.

Each day, more than 50,000 commercial airliners and general aviation airplanes take off and land in the United States. There were 8,727,691 commercial flights in the country last year, with no fatal accidents. The importance of having highly trained air traffic employees is evident in the numbers: There are 7,000 commercial aircraft flying over 5 million square miles of airspace in the country at any given time. The FAA's 14,000 air traffic controllers service 2,456,445 passengers each day.

The center is the primary aviation facility responsible for conducting research and engineering and developing the National Airspace System integration activities required to support and advance the NextGen systems and our legacy airspace.

The Tech Center is also a key focal point for national security. The grounds are home to the Department of Homeland Security, the Transportation Security Lab, the New Jersey Air National Guard 177th Fighter Wing, and U.S. Coast Guard Group Air Station Atlantic City.

Much of the work is performed through contracts with private industry and research by academic institutions through aviation research grants.

Center scientists focus on air traffic management, communications, and navigation, airport and aircraft safety. The center provides operational support to FAA field facilities around the country 24/7. Its specialists diagnose and correct problems so that critical systems remain operational.

Tech Center laboratories include air traffic control and simulation facilities, a human factors laboratory, a fleet of specially instrumented in-flight testing aircraft, the world's largest full-scale aviation fire test facility, a chemistry lab for analyzing the toxicity of materials involved in a fire, radar test laboratories, a structural panel test facility, and the National Airport Pavement Test Facility.

The William J. Hughes Technical Center is a cornerstone for aviation innovation worldwide.




