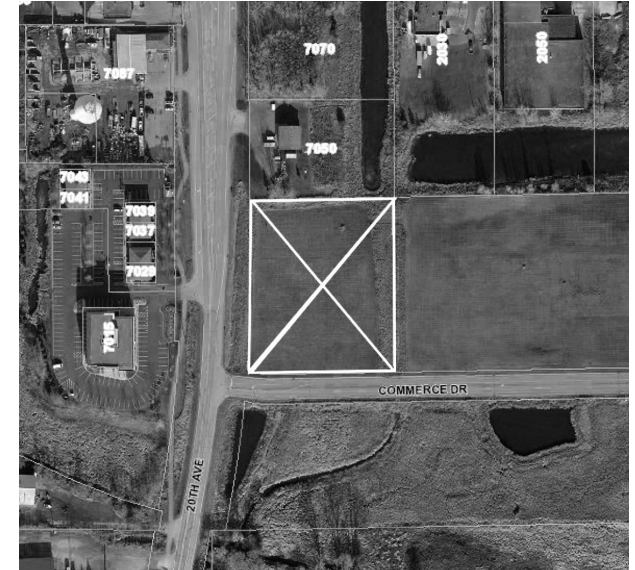
**CITY OF CENTERVILLE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the Planning & Zoning Commission of the City of Centerville will consider a request from Mr. Pat McKasy of Midwest Best Water to obtain a Conditional Use Permit for operating a business that assembles equipment for dispensing water associated with providing services for his business within the I-1 Zoning District. Midwest Best Water intends on constructing a 25,000 square foot building located at 2021 Commerce Drive. Midwest Best Water intends on operating out of 15,000 square feet of the total building square footage with the anticipation of leasing two additional units to unassociated tenants.
